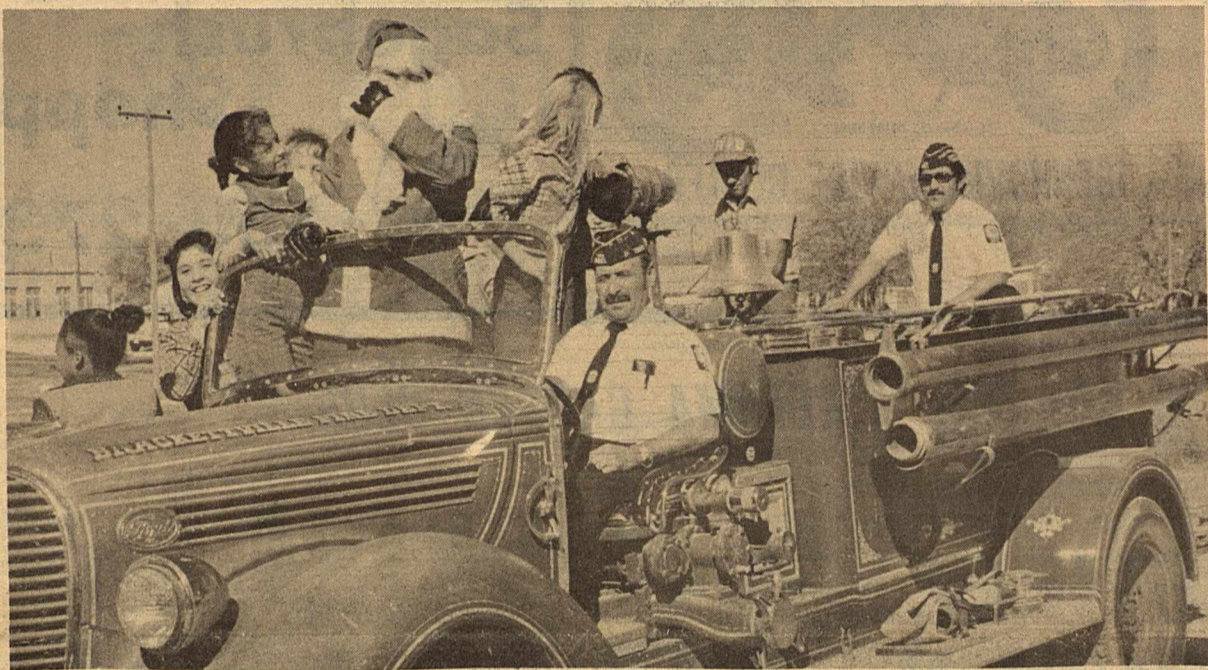

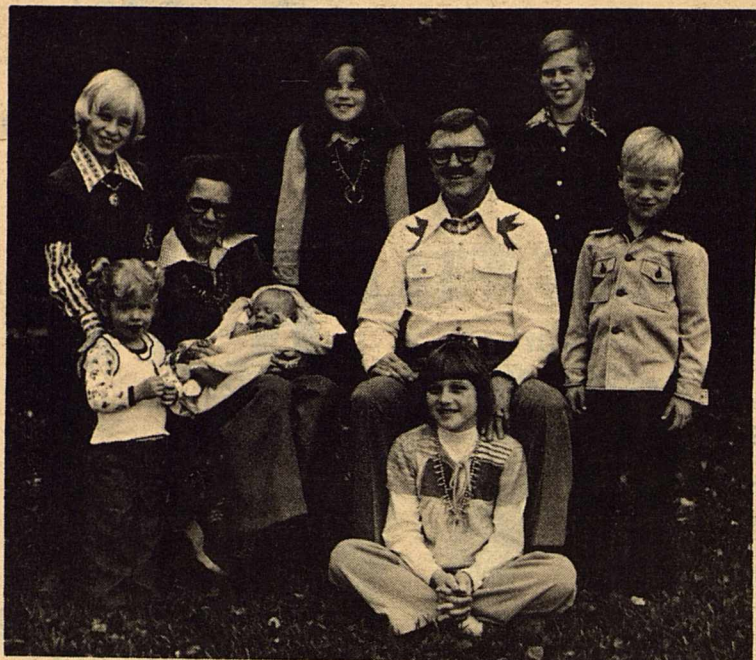

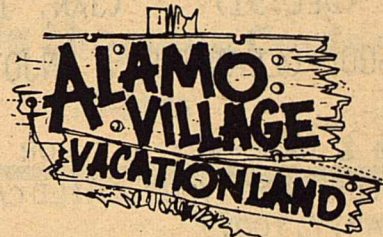

TIPS FOR GREEN THUMBS

If you anticipate planting fruit
trees now is the time. Fruit trees

planted now will often bear fruit the
first year if they are six to eight
foot trees. If is not uncommon for
peach trees to produce fruit the first
year if planted in December or early
January. Varieties that will produce
in this area should be chosen. The
Leona is the best followed closely
by the Luttichau, Sam Houston, and

Rio Grande. These may not produce every
year but if any peaches are made these

will make fruit. Plums and apricots re-
quire a little longer to produce. Pear
trees are not really practical in the
area and will not produce until they are
four year old trees. Apple trees make
good shade trees but don't plant them
expecting to eat or make apple butter
from fruit produced in this area---
there will be none. Balled and burlap-
ped trees are best but good results can
come from the bare root trees if they
are properly cared for agter digging.

ROUTINE FARM WORK CONTINUES AMID DRIZZLE

UVALDE---Two days of drizzle offered a brief respite from routine chores for farmers and ranchers on Southwest Texas rural lands last week.

The only major farming activity occurring during the week was in the Wintergarden area where the cabbage harvest is in full swing. Zavala County Extension Agent Ray Caraveo reported that worms continue to cause damage to cabbage in Zavala County, but damage is reduced somewhat with the cooler weather. He also said damage from the cucumber beetle on spinach is increasing. The spinach harvest is continuing with fair markets.

Further to the south in Maverick County, Extension Agent Dennis Hengst said farmers in his area are setting out onion transplants. He reports planting of late fields of spinach and scattered harvests of broccoli, cauliflower spinach, and cabbage.

GAS PRICES GOING UP

Motorist driving in Texas during the Christmas and New Year's holiday period will pay more for gasoline than they did last Thanksgiving, and they'll find about two-thirds of the state's service stations closed on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

These facts were revealed by a survey of 252 Texas service stations conducted by the American Automobile Association. The survey showed an average price of 61.0 cents per gallon for full-service regular gas, compared to an average price of 60.7 cents per gallon on Thanksgiving. The average full-service price of unleaded gas has also increased from 63.9; and the average price of premium fuel dropped slightly, from 65.7 cents a gallon to 65.6.

The survey showed that motorists

farmers and ranchers are continuing to center their efforts around supplemental feeding of livestock and land preparation. Cattle remain in fair to good condition with range conditions deteriorating in some areas.

can save as much as a dollar a tankful by buying at self-service facilities. The average self-service prices are 55.7 cents a gallon for regular, 59.5 for unleaded and 61.2 for premium.

With both holidays falling on a Sunday, when many stations normally are closed anyway, an unusually large number of stations will be closed on both days. The survey indicated that 67 percent will close on Christmas Day and 65 percent will close on New Year's Day. But fewer than 5 percent will be closed either the day before or the day after the holidays.

AAA recommends that motorists who must drive long distances on Christmas Day or New Year's Day drive on the top half of their tanks to avoid possible supply problems.

WELFARE PROJECT ENDED

A welfare pilot being tested in South Texas will be terminated December 31, announced the Texas Department of Human Resources. The rural component of "Welfare Action" was canceled by action of the Board of Human Resources at their November meeting in Arlington.

"While this test project did benefit the few citizens who took advantage of it, this department could not justify the expense," said Richard Crum, assistant regional administrator for the state agency. "Cost-effectiveness is a prime concern for all programs financed through tax dollars and the results from the rural component of "Welfare Action" simply could not justify the cost."

The project consisted, in part, of a toll-free telephone number by which citizens could report suspected

welfare fraud, make complaints or ask questions regarding programs of the agency.

"Citizens are asked to report any cases of suspected welfare fraud to their nearest office of the Texas Department of Human Resources," said Crum. "In some cities the phone may still be listed under the Department's old name, the State Department of Public Welfare."

Crum continued, "If persons have complaints or problems, they are welcome to contact the nearest appropriate TDHR office. If a person has problems within the agency, they should contact their worker or his supervisor for remedy. If the problem can't be resolved at that level, they may request a fair hearing on their grievance. The fair hearing process allows an unbiased arbitrator to determine the legality of the department's decision."

At to the other major function of the terminated project, Crum said that persons with any questions as to services or programs of the state agency are invited to contact any TDHR office.

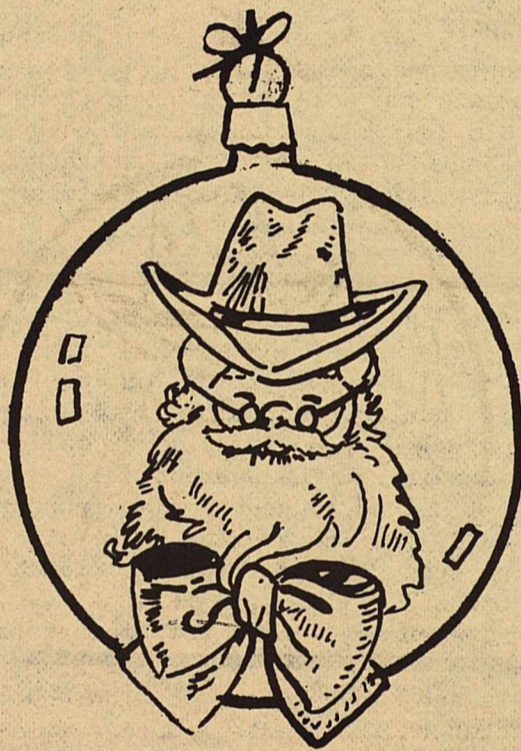
BETWEEN US
