### SWTJC

FEDERAL RESERVE SYSTEM WESTEX BANCORP, INC. Officials at Southwest Texas Junior Order Approving Formation of Bank Holding College are willing to go out of their Company way to meet the educational needs of the community.

Westex Bancorp, Inc., Del Rio Texas (Applicant), has applied for approval under section 3(a)(1) of the Bank Holding Company Act (12 U.S.C. § 1842(a)(1)) to become a bank holding company by acquiring The First State Bank, Brackettville, Texas ("Bank").

Notice of the application, affording opportunity for interested persons to submit comments and views, has been given in accordance with section 3(b) of the Act. The time for filing comments and views has expired, and the Reserve Bank has considered the application and all comments received in light of the factors set forth in section 3(c) of the Act (12 U.S.C. § 1842(c)).

Applicant is a nonoperating corporation organized for the purpose of becoming a bank holding company through the acquisition of Bank (8.5 million in deposits). In connection with the application, the Reserve Bank has taken into consideration the competitive effects of the proposed transaction, the financial and managerial resources and future prospects of the company and the bank, and the convenience and needs of the community to be served. Having considered the record of this application in light of the statutory factors contained in the Act, it is the Reserve Bank's judgement that consummation of the transaction will be in the public interest. On the basis of these considerations, the application is approved.

The transaction shall not be consummated before the thirtieth calendar day following the effective date of this Order or later than three months after the effective date of this Order, unless such period is extended for good cause by the Board of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas acting pursuant to delegated authority.

Plans for the second annual CAF Air Sho, co-sponsored by the Alamo Wing of the CAF and the Medina County Fair Association, were worked out in May and now that tickets are printed every thing is in readiness to get the show in the air.

Gates at the Hondo Airbase, just two miles from Hondo, Texas, will open at 7 a.m. on September 13 and flying activities will begin promptly at 2 p.m. "we will open earlier this year," says Col. 

**CATHARANTHUS.....**  
(Apocynaceae)

Only one species of the  
genus Catharanthus (sometimes confused  
with the genus Vinca) is grown indoors:  
Roseus (Madagascar or Rose peri wrinkle  
or old maid) which is a small, upright  
shrub prized for its shiny green leaves  
and delicate-looking flowers. The glossy  
oval leaves are 1 to 2 inches long,  
have a white center vein, and are borne  
in opposite pairs on slender stems. One  
or more flowers are produced at stem  
tips throughout a flowering period that  
generally lasts from mid-spring to mid-  
fall, each flower has an inch long  
tube flattened out into five lance-  
shaped petals at the mouth, which is up  
to 1½ inches wide. Flower color is usu-  
ally soft rose pink or mauve. There  
is a white flowered form, "Albus" and  
another "ocelatus" that has white flower  
with carmine-red center.

**Proper Care:** Light:  
Bright light, including three or four  
hours of direct sunlight daily, is  
essential for good flowering.  
Temperature: Normal room temperatures  
are suitable at all times. A catharan-  
thus cannot tolerate temperatures that  
fall below about 50 degrees.  
Watering: Water the potting mixture

plentifully, but do not allow the pot  
to stand in excess water.  
Feeding: Apply standard liquid ferti-  
lizer.

## SCHOOL MEALS INCOME PROVERTY GUIDELINES

The Brackettville Independent School serves nutritious meals every school day. Students may buy breakfast for 50¢.

Children from families whose income is at or below the level shown on the attached scale may be eligible for either free meals or meals at a reduced price of 30¢ for breakfast.

To apply at any time during the year for free or reduced price meals for your children, complete the attached application and return it to the school. Within ten (10) days of receiving your application, the school will let you know whether or not your children are eligible.

If, during the school year, there are changes in your family size or substantial changes in your income, you should report such changes to the school's officials in order that appropriate eligibility adjustments be made.

**PROOF OF CURRENT FAMILY INCOME**--If you have applied for free or reduced price benefits in other school years, you will note some changes to the application form. The application form. The application now requires the name and social security number of all adult family members. Adults without social security numbers must indicate that they do not have one. Schools may verify the source and amount of income as well as household composition.

**FOSTER CHILDREN**-- In certain cases, foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If you have foster children living with you and you wish to apply for such meals for them, please notify us or indicate it on the application.

**NONDISCRIMINATION**--All children are treated the same regardless of ability to pay. In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, creed, color or national origin.

**FAIR HEARING**--If you do not agree with the school's decision on your application, you may wish to discuss it with the school. If you wish to review the decision further, you have a right to a fair hearing. This can be done by calling or writing: Sandra Herman, Brackettville I.S.D., Brackettville, Texas 78832, Phone: 563-2491.

We hope that the changes in the application do not create confusion. If we can be of any further assistance, please do not hesitate to contact us.

**HARDSHIP CONDITIONS**-- Income used for the following special hardship conditions which could not be reasonably anticipated or controlling be the household may be excluded:

- 1) Unusually high medical expenses
- 2) Shelter costs in excess of 30% of income;
- 3) Special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of a child
- 4) Disaster or casualty losses.

That portion of the families' income which is used for these hardship conditions should be subtracted from the families' reported income to determine the application income level for the family.

The information contained in the application is confidential and used only for determining eligibility.

**APPEAL PROCEDURE**--Appeal from a decision with respect to an application for free or reduced-priced meals for children is provided for by the following procedure established by the school district.

- 1) A simple, publicly announced method for parties concerned to make an oral or written request for a hearing.
- 2) An opportunity to be assisted or represented by an attorney or other person in presenting an appeal.
- 3) An opportunity to examine, prior to and during the hearing, the documents and records presented to support the decision under appeal.
- 4) That the hearing shall be held with reasonable promptness and convenience and that adequate notice shall be given as to the time and place of the hearing.
- 5) An opportunity to present oral or documentary evidence and arguments supporting a position without undue interference.
- 6) An opportunity to question or refute any testimony or other evidence and to confront and cross-examine any adverse witnesses.
- 7) That the hearing shall be conducted and the decision made by a hearing official who did not participate in making the decision under appeal.
- 8) That the decision of the hearing official shall be based on the oral and documentary evidence presented at the hearing and made a part of the hearing record.
- 9) That the parties concerned and any designated representative shall be notified in writing of the decision of the hearing official.
- 10) That a written record shall be prepared with respect to each hearing, which shall include the decision under appeal, any documentary evidence and summary of any oral testimony presented at the hearing, the decision of the hearing official including the reasons therefore, and a copy of the notification to the parties concerned of the decision of the hearing official.
- 11) That such written record of each hearing shall be preserved for a period of five years and shall be available for examination by the parties concerned or their representatives at any reasonable time and place during such period.

This permit will be obtained from City Hall at an annual fee of \$30.00. The permit will expire one year from date of issuance. 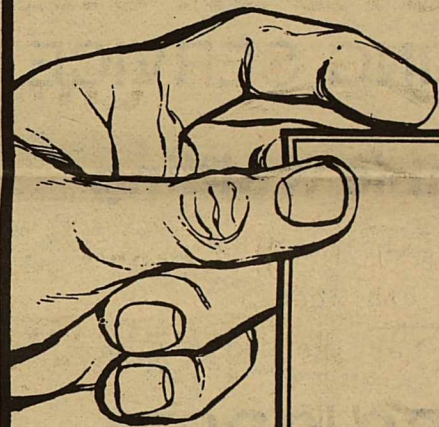

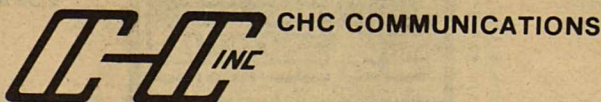

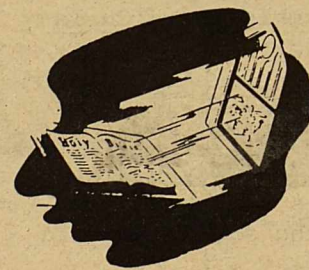
