He was arraigned before County Judge Albert Postell and later freed on a \$10,000.00 bond.

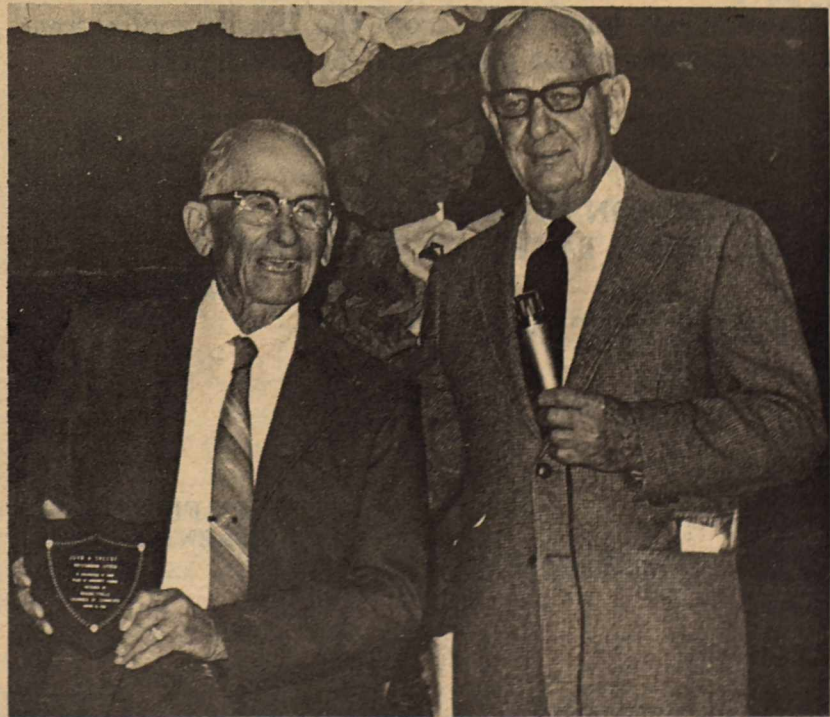
Results of the 1982 Kinney County Frontier Fair & The Third Annual Tortilla Tossing Tournament

CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT PULLS ANOTHER SNEAKY-POO!

This week we heard a rumor that CP&L plans to close their office here. A phone call to the local office said that it is not a rumor but didn't know when it would be closed.

A phone call to the Del Rio office and conversation with the office manager, Mr. Tino Guzman, confirmed that the office will be closed approximately April 1.

We ask if Brackettville City Council was notified of this move and he stated "that we would have to speak to Mr. Brynes about this matter and that Mr Brynes would be out of town a few days."

When CP&L signed their agreement with the City of Brackettville they stated that service would not be degraded. The Community has gone through a fight several years ago to retain the office here with a serviceman. Since then the local serviceman has been removed from Brackettville and it is now necessary on weekends to attempt to contact their emergency number in Del Rio for service.

A few weeks ago the emergency number in Del Rio did not answer the local sheriff's Department calls for assistance for our fire department during a fire. It was necessary for me to call Del Rio via Amateur Radio to finally make contact with CP&L during this emergency.

It is bad enough to have our serviceman located 30 miles plus from our community but it is even worse when they fail to answer the emergency number in Del Rio. This is not equal of better service!

The removal of this office again shows the indifference toward the people of Brackettville, Fort Clark and Spofford by CP&L management. A number of our elderly and under-privileged citizens do not have checking accounts so in addition to the 20¢ postage it will cost them an additional 75¢ to \$1.55 to pay their electric bill... which means these people will

Posies**

SCINDAPSUS....Pothos Ivy.....

Pothos ivy, also known as
Devil's Ivy, is a tall climbing
plant. It is very easy to grow,
and a good houseplant even for
those without "green thumbs!"
It is a hardy plant, with dif-
ferent coloring from green to
cream to white.

Your pothos is happy in average
house temperatures, and just about
any light location except extremes
of darkness or hot direct sun.
Varieties with colorful markings
need brighter light to retain
color, or they will revert back
to the natural green color.

Water your pothos when the soil
surface is dry. Feed from spring
to fall at regular intervals.

Pothos makes a beautiful hanging
basket, or will cascade over your
plant stand making a very nice
show. They can be trained on moss
covered poles and stakes for an
upright plant. When your plant
becomes leggy, pinch off the
longer stems to encourage branch-
ing and fuller growth.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

On January 29, 1982, Governor Clements
proclaimed the period February 1, 1982,
through April 1, 1982, as the official
period for a statewide "Voter Regis-
tration Drive." Based on the fact
that only two of every three eligible
voters in Texas are registered to vote,
eligible voters not currently regis-
tered to vote must be encouraged to
do so by April 1, 1982--the date by
which Texans must be registered to
vote in the State's May 1st primary
election.

In conjunction with the Governor's
Proclamation, the Secretary of State's
Office has initiated the most massive
voter registration drive ever conducted
in Texas. This effort has been endorsed
by the Texas Chapters of the League of
Women Voters, American G.I. Forum, the
NAACP, IMAGE, and LULAC.

Organizations across the State, such
as Chambers of Commerce, grocery store

chains, and labor organizations, are
participating in this effort. In addi-
tion, an unprecedented effort has been
made to contact eligible high school
students to urge them to register to
vote.

The final figures on the success
of the various voter registration drives
statewide cannot be ascertained until
after April 1, 1982. With two weeks of
the voter registration drive remain-
ing, you can be of great assistance
by encouraging your readers to regis-
ter to vote.

Your full cooperation and assistance
to greatly appreciated. I am sure you
will agree that Texans not bothering
to register to vote would not complain
about the outcome of the election.

Sheep and cattle do not eat soiled tortillas. As a sheep & cattle producer I cannot believe anyone could imagine that you would feed livestock soiled tortillas much less the livestock you plan to take to stock shows. First of all, show animals have to be on a special diet with special feed and care--not soiled tortillas.

Last year the tortilla toss was in May, this year in March. The 4-H & FFA members are already

through showing their animals by this time. So even if stock show animals would eat the tortillas there would be no reason to pick them up other than to help clean up. The 4-H members were working in a booth of their own selling sausage.

If you think animals eat tortillas why don't you get a committee of citizens to pick them up and feed them to all the dogs that run loose in town and see how well they like them.

If you are not familiar with stock show animals or any kind of livestock it would be best not to commit yourself in printing false and inaccurate information.

TO OBTAIN A VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION, CONTACT YOUR COUNTY VOTER REGISTRAR OR CALL THE SECRETARY OF STATE'S OFFICE TOLL FREE AT 1-800-252-9602 AND ONE WILL BE MAILED TO YOU.

Qualifications for Voting:

1. You must be a citizen of the United States
2. You must be at least 18 years of age on the day of the election.
3. You must be a resident of the county, or political subdivision conducting the election.
4. You must be registered to vote.

Persons not Entitled to Vote

1. Those convicted of a felony whose full rights of citizenship have not been restored.
2. Those persons found mentally incompetent by a court of law.

How to Register to Vote:

1. Complete a post card application for voter registration and mail it postage-free or present it in person to the voter registrar in your county.
2. You may register to vote at any time, but your application must be received by your county Voter Registrar by April 1, 1982 in order to vote in the May 1, 1982, primary election.
3. You may register to vote if you are at least 17 years and 10 months of age, but you may not vote until you are 18 years of age.

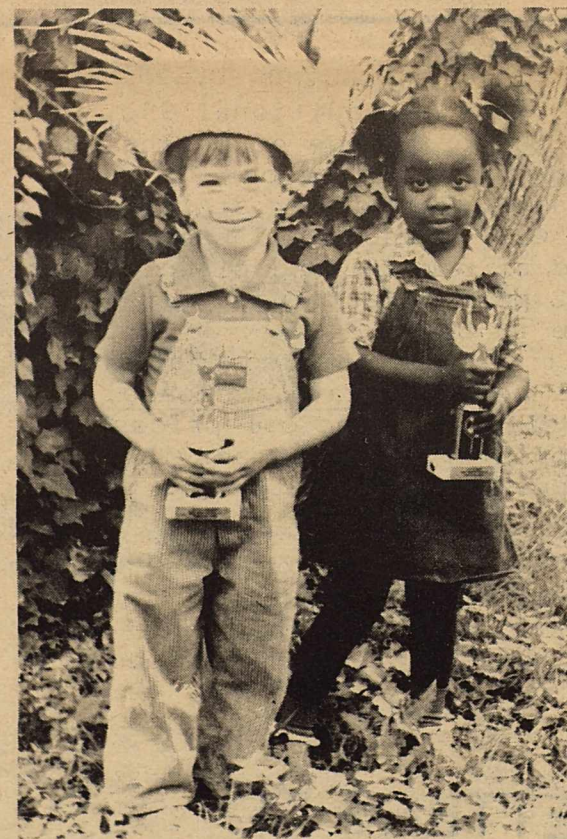
The Foundation is supported primarily by individual memberships with additional support from other non-profit foundations and affiliated organizations.
