CITY OBJECTS TO CP&L RATE HIKES

The following letter was sent to the Executive Vice-PResident of Central Power & Light in Corpus Christi.

Mr. Range,

The City of Brackettville is of the conviction that the regulatory responsibilities provided by law for our City is of extreme importance and must be completely fullfilled. It is apparent that sufficient time is not available prior to April 30, 1982 to complete fully the necessary analysis of the revised rate schedule.

On April 12,1982, the City Council passed an ordinance suspending the revised rate schedule in accordance with Section 43(d) of the Public Utility REgulartory Act for a period of one hundred and twenty (120) days until August 28,1982.

In addition the Council has authorized the City of Brackettville to participate in a cooperative effort of various municipalities to employ legal council to make determinations in order toestablish a more proper and legal rate. The consulting firm Touche-Ross and Company and Don Butler, Attorney, have been selected to represent the co-operating municipalities and the City hereby authorizes said consultants and attorney as its selected agents to request and

necessaty in its investigation from Central Power & Light Company, and others, in order to better represent the City in all matters pertaining to the rate request, PUC, and the Courts.

No one bu the City Council of Brackettville has authority. to speak for the City in regard to a final determination of the pending rate application or any matter in which the City Charter/ Ordinances and/or State law governing the City of Brackettville places final responsibility with the City Council.







FISHING Facts & Fancies

Getting Tackle Ready For The Season

To avoid casting any gloom on your next fishing season, it's best to check your reel now. Does it squeak? Does it turn as quickly as it should? Does the bail flip over smoothly? All these are ways to tell whether your reel should be oiled.



The fishing experts at Du Pont, maker of "Stren" fishing line, America's top selling brand, suggest you check your rod's line guides for rough spots that can abrade your line. A simple test is to rub a cotton swab round the inside edges of the guide. If it frays or

snags, you should replace the guide.

A simple way to check your line is to wrap a length of it around your hand (only the lighter pound test lines), reel off some more and wrap it around your other hand. Then give a strong tug. If it breaks, move down the line a little more and repeat. If the line continues to break, it's time to respool.



The problem is especially acute among the state's younger drivers. "Traffic accidents are the number one killer of Texans between 15 and 24 years of age," he said.

The association is working closely with state legislators and the Governors' Task Force on Traffic Safety which are examining drunk driving measures in the state. "Swift and sure punichment of drunk drivers is an effective way to combat the problem," Ward said. "We support the efforts of those who want to increas both penalties and the certainty of punichment in DWI cases."

The Texas Safety Association actively promotes traffic safety in the state through its Defensive Driving program, an eight hour course of driver improvement developed by the National Safety Council. More than 235,000 persons took the course in Texas last year.

TheTexas Safety Association is also participating in a nationwide program to increase seat belt usage. Only one in every 10 motorist uses seat belts.

It's a Fact!

In the 1920s and 1930s, the increasing use of cow milk or evaporated milk as a substitute for human milk for infants meant that solid foods had to be introduced earlier to provide adequate amounts of essential nutrients that were missing in cow milk.

"HOT WHEELS" AND CROSSING CAUTION

Although railroad grade crossing caution is a year round safety consern, the warm weather months bring with themadditional factors that complicates safe crossing procedures.

In any weather conditions, motorists should STOP, LOOK, LISTEN and WAIT until the tracks are clear in both directions before proceeding. In spring and summer the situation is aggravated: Texas hot spells make most drivers roll up the windows tight, crank up the air conditioner and tune the radio to some crusin' music.

This can mean big trouble if the driver can't hear clearly when approaching railroad tracks, according to Jim Bearden, Vice President for Railroad Safety, Texas Safety Association. "Even if hearing is only partially blocked, attention may be distracted or fragmented by the auditory interference the driver has set up, " says Bearden.

Where a crossing is equipped with electronic gates, the situation is a bit less hazardous. But only a little bit, since drivers have been know to race around gates trying to beat the train-and often getting killed. When the crossing is not physically barred, it becomes even more important that the driver keep ears open and mind alert for the rumble of the train and the sound of the whistle.

So if the heat gets to you while you're behind the wheel, enjoy the modern conveniences, by all means. But at railroad grade crossings, stop, turn off the radio, turn dow the air conditioner (especially if your "dragon" really roars), cracks the windows and listen, reminds the Texas Safety Association. If you do hear that tell-tale rumble or whistle, wait 'till the train passes, check the tracks again in BOTH directions, and if the way is clear, let the good times roll.....
