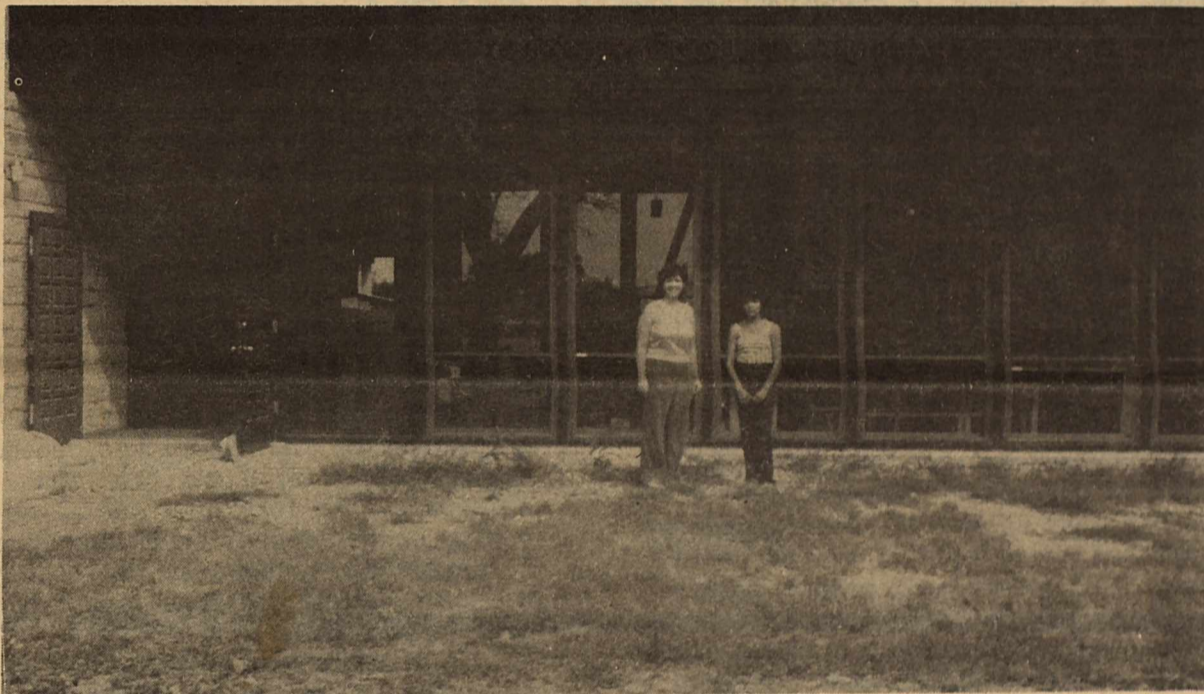

HONDO HOSTS DISTRICT 4-H VEGETABLE SHOW JUNE 14

The second District 13 4-H Vegetable show will be held here Monday, June 14 at Hondo City Park north of town on FM 462. District 13 encompasses 19 Southwest Texas counties.

Vegetables to be judged should be entered at 9:15 a.m. and judging commences at 10 a.m., according to Jerry Chavez, 4-H and youth specialists in Uvalde with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

A total of 25 separate vegetable classes will be judged during the contest by Dr. Jerry Parsons, Extension service vegetables specialists in San Antonio.

To qualify for the contest Chavez says vegetables must be grown in the 4-H's garden or the family

garden. Also, participants do not have to be present and one entry can be made by each 4-H member in any of the 25 classes. Chavez says entries will be accepted until 10 a.m. the day of judging.

4-H'ers exhibiting the "best" and second best" entries will receive trophies sponsored by Ortho Division, Chevron Chemical Company. Those exhibiting the first place entry in each class will receive a copy of an Ortho Gardening book. The county having the most exhibitors receives a collection of 10 Ortho books. Each entry receives a participation ribbon.

Chavez says 4-H'ers from Atascosa, Comal, Frio, Medina, and Uvalde counties accounted for over 100 entries in the first district-wide contest held last June.

MAIL THEFT PREVENTION

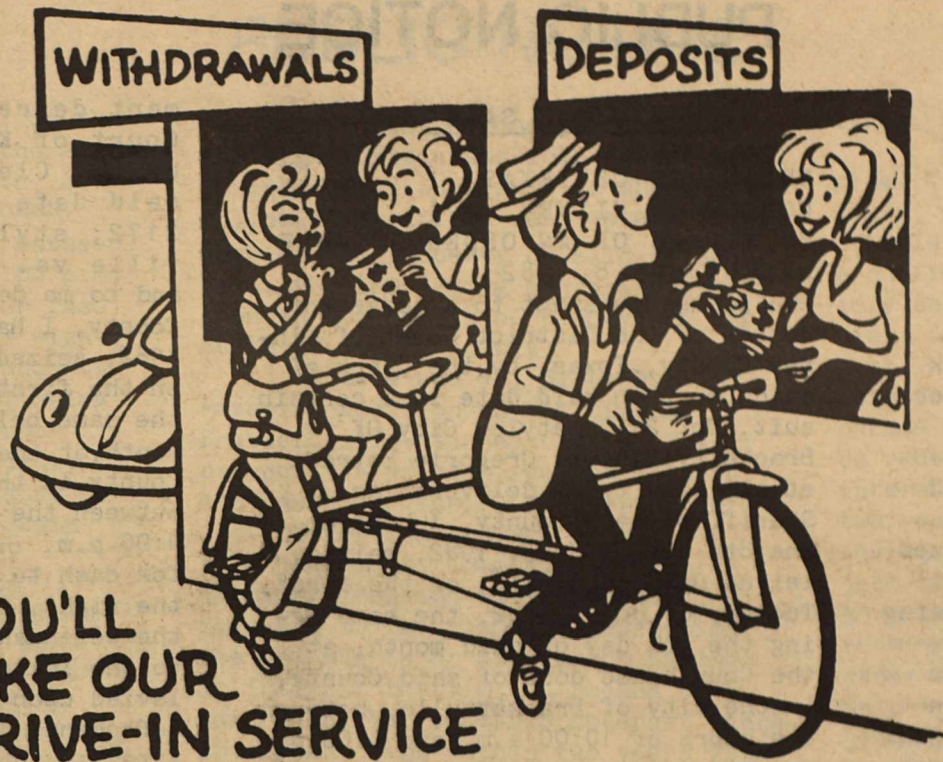
Theft of mail is a violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1708, which carries a maximum penalty of five years imprisonment and/or a \$2,000 fine. Unfortunately, criminals pay little attention to the consequences of their immediate actions.

The Postal Inspection Service is attempting to prevent theft of mail from all sources by informing and educating as many elements of society as possible. The United States Postal Service is a principle victim but the ultimate victim is a business or individual who depends on mail for their livelihood and existence. The loss of a social security or retirement check addressed to an elderly or retired person can have devastating emotional and financial significance.

Mail is most vulnerable at the point of delivery. An extra effort should be made by mail recipients to know their carrier's schedule and make every effort to be at home to personally accept delivery of valuable mail. Retirement and social security checks are delivered on a fixed schedule which is known by the addressee and criminals as well. Have a neighbor retrieve your mail if you cannot be available and do the same for your neighbor. Also, deposit your mail for collection at a post office or collection box. If this is inconvenient, place letters on your house letterbox for collection shortly before your carrier arrives. Your personal mail can be used most effectively to defraud your bank, consequently creating a very inconvenient situation. Make every effort to protect your incoming as well as outgoing mail by using these common sense suggestions.

Crime prevention can be a community effort. Everyone receives mail almost on a daily basis. This provides common grounds for neighbors to be come better acquainted and watch out

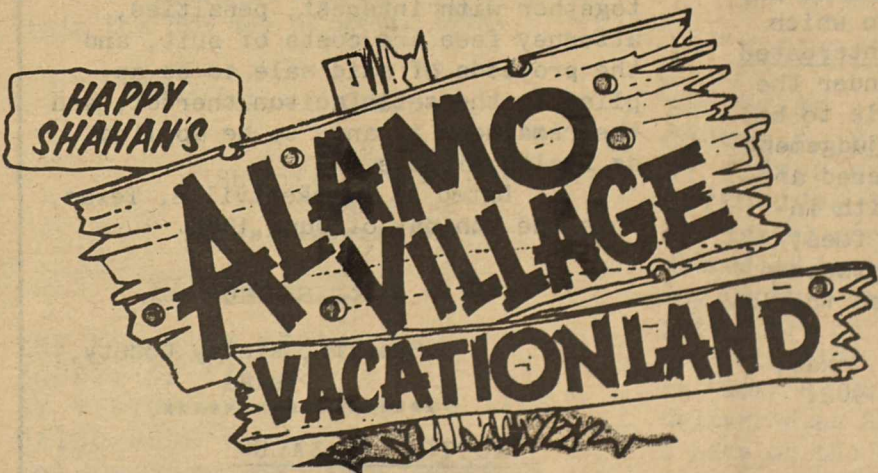

POLICY MAKERS, INDUSTRY LEADERS HIGHLIGHT IRR OPENING SESSION

DEL RIO--"Ranching Tomorrow". Today's Too Late" and "Managing the Ranch Business" are themes for the August 10 opening day general session of the International Ranchers Roundup (IRR) which runs through August 12 in this border city.

Several talks are scheduled to be presented that day by prominent ranchers and professional ranching consultants, plus chief international agricultural policy makers from the U.S. and Australia

The headline speaker is Raymond D. Lett, administrative assistant to Agricultural Secretary John Block. Lett will discuss "The U.S. Position in the World Ranching Community." He is one of the key policy makers in the USDA and has significant influence in directions taken by that department. While serving as the Illinois state executive director of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service Lett received the ASCS Administrator's Award and USDA's Superior Service Award for his managerial expertise.

"Ranch Management to Avoid Financial Crises" is to be presented by David G. Wilcox, Primary Range-land Management Officer for Western Australia. Wilcox is one of two Australian agricultural Officials to speak here. Terry D. Mitchell, an Australian Department of Agriculture Official, will speak at the sheep, Angora goats and meat goat concurrent sessions.

Is today's rancher really independent? Will tomorrow's be? Jeannee Edwards, the dynamic owner of Saval Ranching Company, Elko, Nevada will address these topics while outlining steps ranchers can take to maintain their independence.

Bob Bliss, manager of cattle feeding operations, Friona Industries, will discuss how today's rancher must operate to become "Tomorrow's Successful Rancher."

Another prominent Texas rancher, O.J. Barron, owner of the Spur Ranches, will close the morning program with "making a Profit from the Total Ranch Operation."

A subject important to all ranchers, "How to Cut Costs, Not Profits," will be represented by John L. "Chip" Merrill, coordinator of the Ranch Management Training Program at Texas Christian University.

Allan Savory, Savory Grazing method Range Consultant, New Mexico will then take the podium to address "Effective Ranch Business Management" a must for every producer.

Progressive Farmer magazine vice-president and editor C.G. Scruggs will keynote the August 11 evening steak banquet and State Representative Susan G. McBee will deliver a major address during the "Women in Ranching" special concurrent session.

General sessions will be held at the Del Rio Civic Center. concurrent educational sessions (August 11-12) in beef cattle, sheep and Angora goats, meat goats, brush management wildlife, and "Women in Ranching" will be staged at nearby Del Rio High School where numerous roomy, comfortable classroom facilities are available. Several concurrent sessions will be repeated daily and simultaneous translation will be provided in sessions important to Mexican ranchers.

Producers can obtain registration material by writing to IRR, P.O. Box 1849, Uvalde, Texas, 78801. Those wishing to participate in either

of two ranch tours in Southwest Texas (August 9) and Mexico (August 13) must return completed forms by the July 15 deadline. A maximum of 200 persons will be allowed on each tour. A \$50 registration fee discount is also available to those who register before the deadline.

Full registration, with the exception of tours, will be available at the Civic Center when the IRR opens August 10.

Over 100 ranching experts from 12 states and three countries will be on hand during the three days of general and concurrent sessions to provide practical information and updated technology making ranching decisions easier and more profitable. It is being coordinated by Texas Agricultural Extension Service specialists at the Texas A&M Agricultural Research and Extension Center in Uvalde.

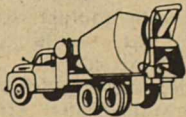
