The pre-entrance test lasts 3 hours and consists of four parts, including verbal (word meaning), reading, arith metic, and basic science concepts.

The vocational nursing program consists of 1700 hours inculding 600 hours of class-room study and 1100 hours of practical clinical experience, spread over a full year.

Clinical experiences are scheduled at Memorial Hospital in Uvalde, the base hospital for the program, as well as other hospitals in the Southwest Texas area, schools, nursing homes, the public health

department, the burn center in San Antonio, and other health facilities.

Besides certification as a vocational nurse, graduates will receive C.P.R. certification from the American Heart Association and First Aid Certification from the American Red Cross.



Heating That Cold Room—Safely

No matter the age or type of construction, most homes have a cold spot or two that the central heating system just seems to ignore.

The resistance type heater usually has a shielded element. Small hands or misplaced flammables, such as drapes, can come into contact with a hot spot typical of these heaters. Nasty burns and fires can result.

Electric hot water heaters have elements enclosed in a hermetically sealed tube containing a water/antifreeze solution. This provides protection to small hands and flammables because surface lower temperatures remain low. Many hot water systems offer convection heat which warms air as it circulates throughout a room.

The first regular air mail service for civilian We have been busy this past mail in the United States started in 1918. week. The Kendall County Sheriff's Department apprehended a man wanted in this county on charges of D.W.I. He had posted bond when arrested and failed to appear for his trial. We entered his name in the Texas

name in the Texas Crime Information Center computer in Austin and a routine check by Kendall County officer showed him to be a wanted person. We were notified that he had been picked up and would be transferred to Kerr County. I went there and transported him back here and he was tried and sentenced in County Court by County Judge Albert Postell. He remains in jail in lieu of a \$269.00 fine.

Burglars and Vandals were busy in Fort Clark lately. Buster Malone, who maintains a residence in Fort Clark, reported that burglars entered his home sometime between September 18 and November 23 and took several fancy, engraved rifles, shotguns, and other firearms valued at several thousands dollars. They also took a T.V. and stereo equipment valued at several hundred dollars.

Vandals damaged the parking lot at a new clubhouse and also damaged several of the greens and fairways on the new golf course in Fort Clark. The damage estimate of this incident was approximately \$3,500.00. If any of you have any information concerning these incidents, plaese report it to me. Your name will be kept confidential. Mr.Malone has indicated that he will pay a substantial reward for any information that leads to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the burglary of his home.

We also recovered a stolen pickup Wednesday. This vehicle had been reported stolen out of Uvalde. Mr. Joseph Olvera noticed a pickup parked near his place of business and reported the license number to the Sheriff's department and a routine check on that number incicated it was a stolen vehicle. The owner was notified and picked up. We are working on information that two Uvlade juveniles may have been responsible for the and acts of vandalism have traditionally increased this time of year. The criminal element of our community knows that with hunting season here and Christmas coming that there will be an increase of valuable hunting equipment and other property kept in many homes. If you are going to be away from your home for an extended period of time, secure your property as best you can and notify the Sheriffs Department and/or the Police Department what vehicles and/ or persons are authorized to be on or around your premises. This information will assist the officers on patrol in your area and could save you thousands of dollars in valuable property and /or vandalism.

Should your suspicions be aroused by strange vehicles and/or persons, jot down a physical description and all the information about the activity, such as location, time and license plate numbers. Do not hesitate to call this officer any time day or night. Sometimes these things check out O.K. and sometimes a criminal is caught or stolen property recovered. We have to work together for a better, safer community.
