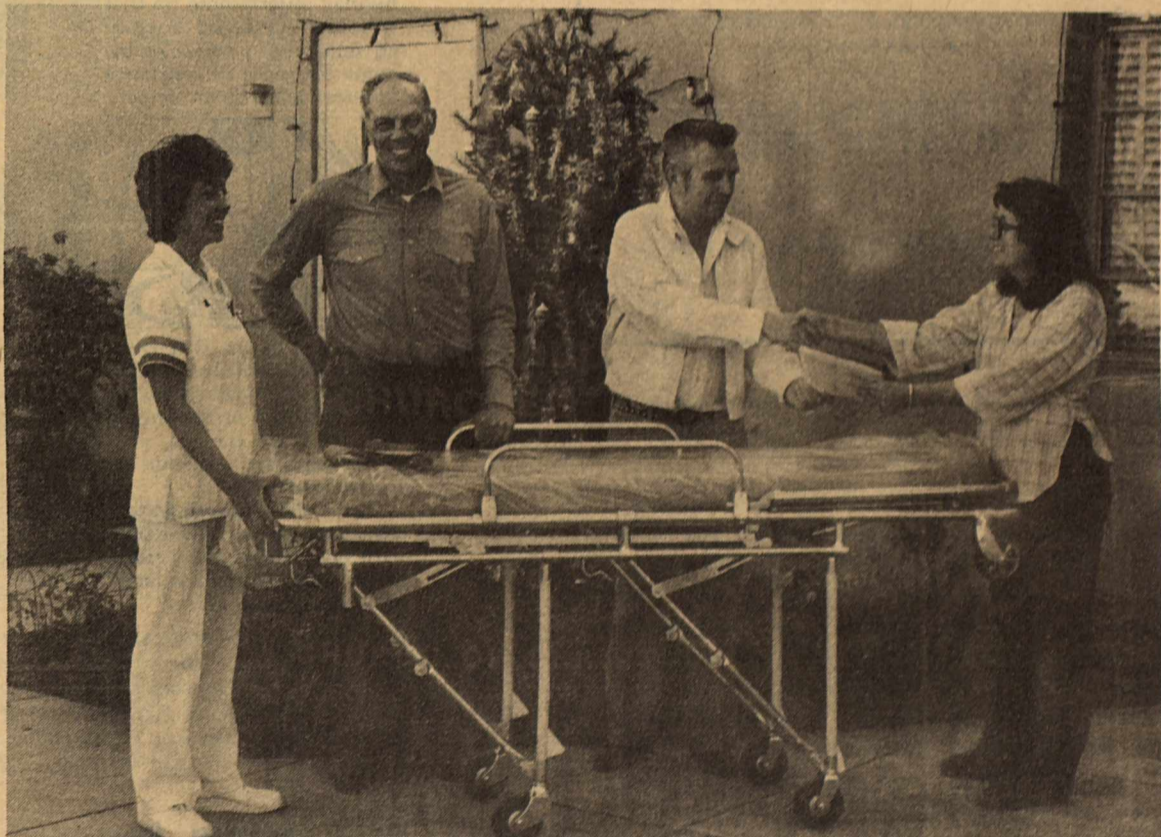

NATURAL FIBERS FASHION REVIEW PLANNED FOR SOUTHWEST FARM AND RANCH EXPO

The 12th annual Natural Fibers Fashion Review is being planned for the 1983 Southwest Farm and Ranch Exposition. The fashion contest and show will be held on March 5 in Fort Worth.

The contest is open to any homemaker from the Southwest Farm and Ranch states of Texas, Oklahoma, and New Mexico, who is involved in agricultural production, an agriculture-related business, or is a member of an agriculture-related organization.

The Fashion Review is designed to promote the use of Southwest natural fibers and to emphasize excellence in garment construction and fashion in home sewing.

Garments entered in the show must be made of minimum blends of 50% cotton or 50% wool and/or mohair.

The competition will have four divisions: day wear, evening wear, mother and child, and former grand award winners. The contest provides

a showcase for exhibiting designs made from natural fibers.

Prizes will be awarded to first second and third place winners in each division. Special awards will be presented to the best cotton, mohair, and wool garments. The Grand Award winner will be selected from the winners of the mother and child, day wear, and evening wear division.

Speonsors of the event include the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Southwest Hardware & Implement Association and Progessive Farmer.

SHERIFF'S CORNER

Six prisoners escaped from the Kinney County Jail between the hours of 12:00 Midnight and 8:00 a.m. Tuesday morning. Four of these prisoners were felony suspects who had been indicted by a Federal Grand Jury on charges of Possession of a Controlled Substance with Intent to Distribute. In other words they were dope smugglers. The other two were charged with transporting aliens.

The prisoners were discovered missing at 8:00 a.m. by Beatrice Rocha County Jailer. She immediately con-

tacted me and a full investigation and search was undertaken. The U.S. Marshal's Service was contacted, as was the U.S. Border Patrol, DPS, and other law enforcement agencies. Road blocks were set up by the Border Patrol on all major highways leading to Mexico. (All six escapees were Mexican nationals).

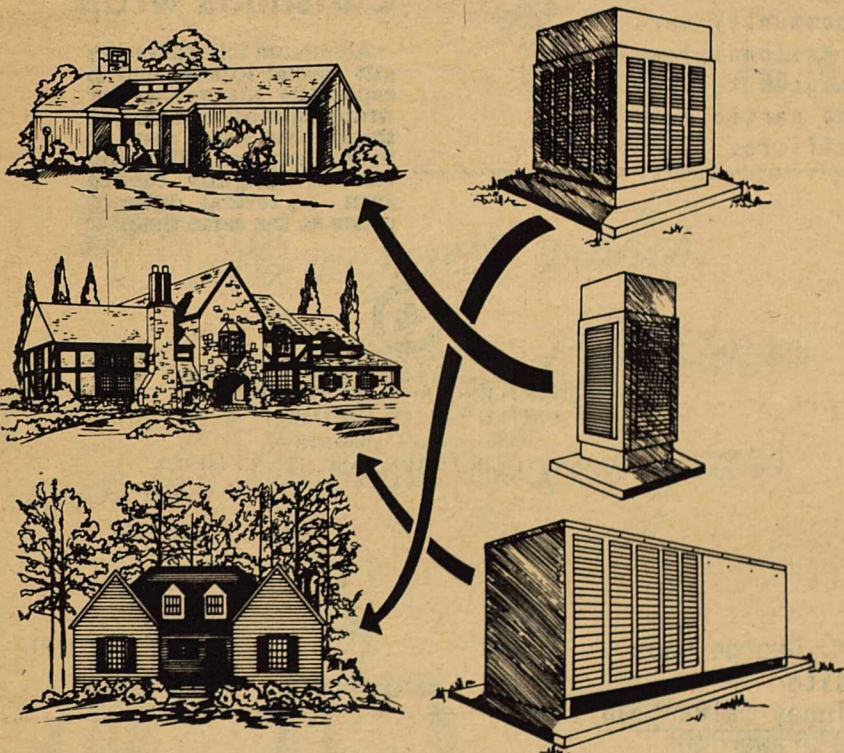
Investigation of the activities of the jailers, prior to the discovery of the escape, was made. The jailer on duty during the time of the escape admitted that he had falsified a Prisoners Hourly Cell Check report. This report is required by state law and is designed to help prevent illegal activities in the jail by prisoners and to keep the jailer on duty aware of the safety and well-being of those prisoners. This is not to say that the escape would not have occurred had the jailer performed his duty, but at least we would have known of their absence within the hour instead of 6 to 8 hours later. At the same time of this writing disciplinary action against the jailer who was on duty is pending.

The prisoners who escaped pried open a door to a plumbing closet and gained entry to crawl space under the jail by going through a 12" air duct. They then used a piece of metal rod to dig a tunnel under the foundation on the west side of the jail complex. The best we can determine from our investigation is that during the summer months a local plumber worked on the plumbing in that cell block. During the course of his work it was necessary to remove cross pieces of re-enforcement rods from the air duct. The rods were not replaced and therefore all the prisoners had to do was get the door to the closet open and drop down under the floor and dig out.

These combinations of mistakes and lack of communications all add up to the escape of the six prisoners from the jail. And as the old saying goes, "The Buck Stops Here." The final responsibility for the escape is mine. I am responsible for the safety and security of the jail and the actions of my employees.

I can assure you that a complete shakedown of the jail is in progress and preventative measures are being taken to tighten security. This includes closer supervision of the jailers employed at the jail. We sincerely hope that nothing of this sort ever happens in Kinney County again.
