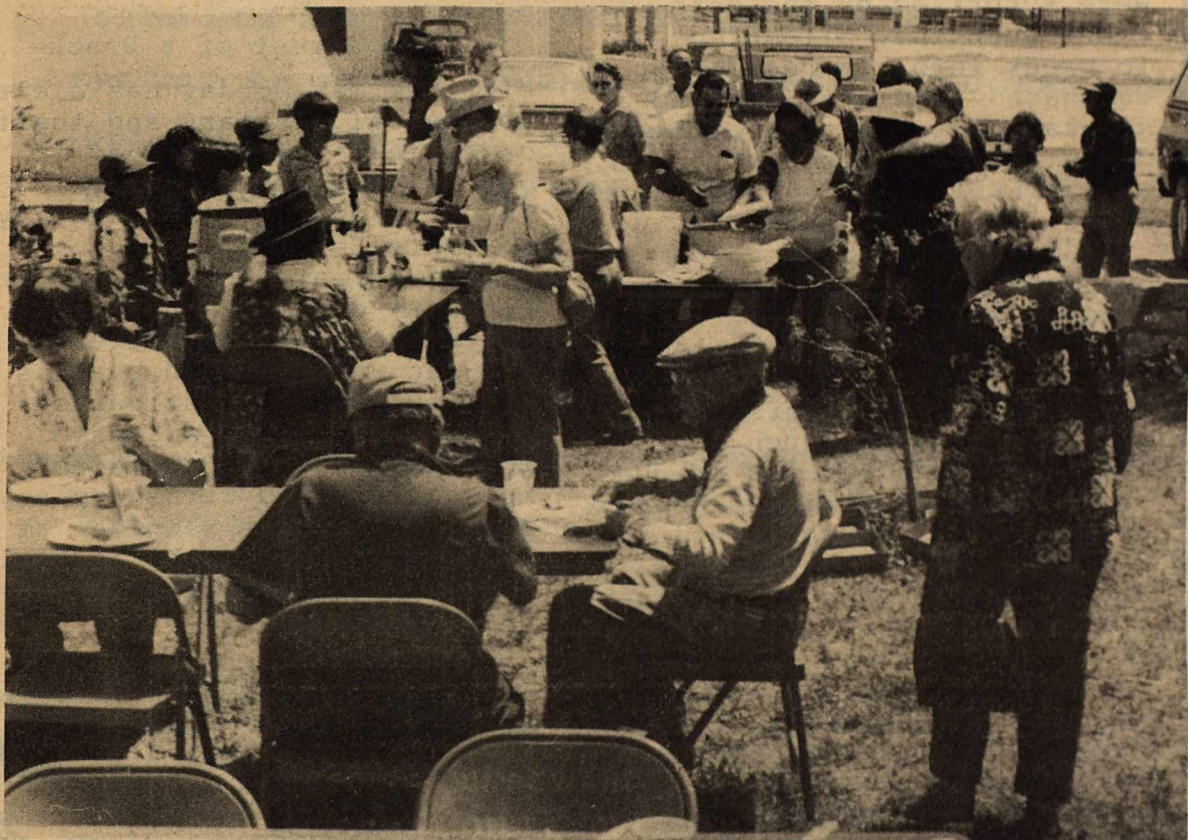

### HOW KINNEY COUNTY VOTED

#### TARTT AND DAVIS ELECTED TO COUNCIL

At the City Election held Saturday 2 April 1983 voters cast a majority of their votes to Mr. R. L. Tartt as their choice to represent the people for Place 1 on the Council. Dr. Davis was re-elected to represent the Place 3 position.

On Thursday evening at a called Special Meeting of the Council to canvass the ballots and officially declare the final tally

the official election results were as follows.

PLACE 1	
Mr. Don Woodson	42 votes
Mr. David Broderick	25 votes
Mr. Roy L. TARTT	76 votes

PLACE 3	
Dr. Zack Davis	126 votes

The Presiding Judge Mr. John Benacci, Alternate Judge Mrs. Agnes Vondy and Clerk Martha Martinez were thanked by the Council for the outstanding manner in which they performed their duties.

Upon seating of the new Council after being sworn to the oath of office by City Judge Starzel the Council elected Councilwoman Dee Jordan as the new Mayor Pro-Tem for a 1 year term.

The "new" Council will meet Tuesday 12 APRIL at 6:30 P.M. to consider either appointing a member as Mayor to fill the unexpired term of our late Mayor Jerry Tremblay or to call a Special election

County taxes will remain at the rate set by the Kinney County COMMISSIONERS COURT in September, 1982, voters here decided Saturday.

Kinney County Clerk Dolores Raney Saturday said 225 people voted against a petition to roll back county taxes to 60.48 cents. SHE reported that 193 voters were in favor of the petition Mrs. Raney said county commissioners last fall boosted the tax rate to 65 cents, a move that spurred local voters to circulate a petition calling for taxes to be rolled back to 56.4 cents plus a 3 percent increase.

Beth Ann Smith, Tony Frerich and Fern Dyer Saturday were elected to serve their first terms in three open at-large posts on the school board.

Eight candidates vied for the three school board seats. Ms. Smith and Frerich both received 186 votes, Ms. Dyer received 172, Chris Gomez received 166, Lois Forbes received 158, Gloria Benacci received 144, Paul O'Rourke received 110 and

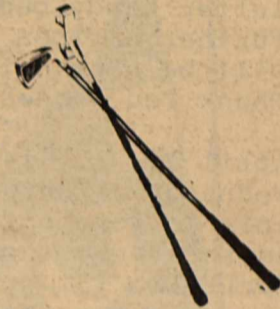

#### NEWS FROM BOB BULLOCK

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Tuesday said the State of Illinois' loss last week of its coveted Triple A bond rating "should be a clear warning to Texans of the dangers of deficit financing."

Last Thursday Standard and Poor's Corporation lowered its rating of Illinois bonds in what Governor James Thompson called a "warning for us to get our fiscal house in order"

"I've called deficit

state financing the fast land to nowhere," Bullock said. "I'm reporting the Illinois situation because it's the kind of danger that is right around the corner for Texas unless we stay on the pay-as-you-go-plan.

"The State of Illinois has a \$300 million deficit and might have to take out short term loans to cover it" Bullock pointed out. "in Texas, our Governor is saying the only way he can balance his budget is with \$700 million worth of bonds and \$800 million worth of tax increases. What is happening in Illinois right now ought to change his mind about bonds to cover a deficit."

Early this week Bullock issued a report from his office showing that Governor Mark White's proposal to finance \$700 million in highway construction with bonds would cost the state \$100 million a year in debt service and could jeopardize Texas' Triple -A rating which insures the lowest interest rates available on Texas veteran and water bonds.

"Trying to balance our state budget on these bonds is a fiscal shell game," Bullock said.

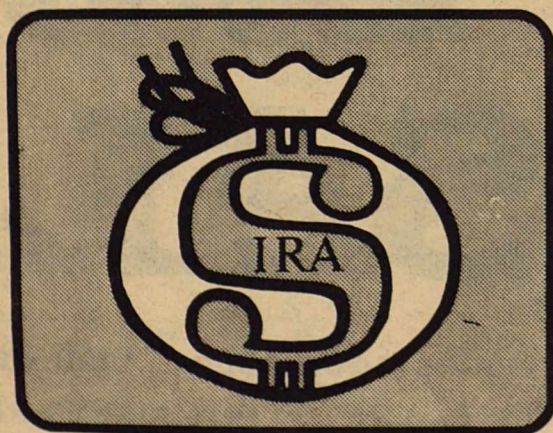
This bronze disk, dating from the fifth century BC, was found in 1829 near the ancient city of Tarquinia.

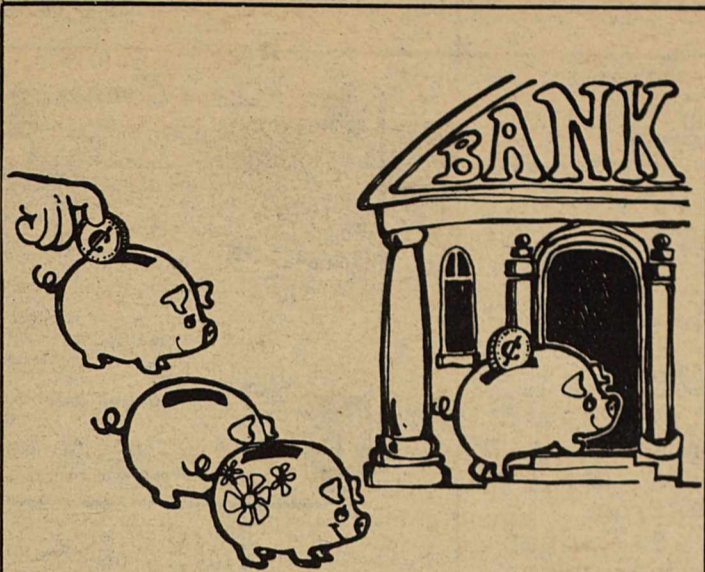

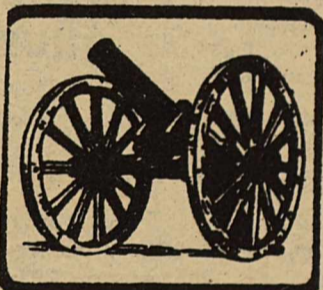
