





Alert, heads-up law enforcement work by DPS Trooper Buddy Burgess last Monday resulted in the capture of a

load of 9 illegal aliens and the recovery of a stolen vehicle. Trooper Burgess was on routine traffic patrol on Hwy. 90 East of Brackettville when he observed a Chevrolet Blazer driven by a young looking Mexican male. He decided to check the vehicle and was notified that it was stolen. Upon making the stop the illegal aliens lying in the back were taken into custody and the vehicle was transported back to Brackettville. The owner was notified and the vehicle was returned. No charges were filed as all the men arrested were illegal aliens and State prosecution on them is slow and tedious at best.

The trial of a local man in District Court here was completed last Friday. Raymon Falcon, 29, was tried on two counts of Aggravated Assault with a deadly weapon that occurred a year ago May 1. These charges stemmed from a fight that took place on the Rocksprings Road near the "Oak Tree", a favorite nighttime hangout for young people.

The jury found Mr. Falcon Not Guilty on one charge and Guilty on the other. The same jury also sentenced Mr. Falcon to three years in the Texas Department of Corrections in Huntsville. His decision to appeal his conviction is pending.

I would like to commend County Judge Albert Postell on his efforts to keep the County Court Docket current. Many County Court Dockets are filled with old cases and a large percentage of those cases end up being dismissed because witnesses can no longer be found, evidence is lost and memories fade. Judge Postell tries cases almost every week and generally clears the docket monthly.

This action by Judge Postell is appreciated by those of us in law enforcement. It



LIBRARY NEWS

Next Monday, beginning at 10;00a.m. and lasting through the day, the County Commissioners will meet at the Courthouse to go over the budget for the fiscal year 83 - 84. Included in this will be the library budget. The major difference in our request over last year's budget is an additional \$6,968.00 for a full-time library assistant to work a 40 hour week at \$3.35 per hour or minimum wage. Most of you are already aware of the work stacked up around my ears and my attempt to "tread water", so to speak, to keep up with the steady increase in circulation, services and paperwork. Several of you have been unhappy when I've had to close the library to run errands at the courthouse or in town, handle paperwork, attend library workshops, give school

or club presentations about library services, etc. In a nutshell, my health will no longer stand up to the pace I've set myself since becoming Library Director December 1981. I know you library patrons appreciate me, and for the most part, are the SILENT MAJORITY, But this year, I'm counting on you to speak to your commissioner in support of this request as I know you are as concerned about the quality service at the library as I

CATTLEMEN'S ASSN..

Hundreds of ranchers across the state will soon begin a unique round-up of calves and other livestock for a sale to benefit the Independent Cattlemen's Association of Texas.

This year's sixth annual event is scheduled for May 14 in Victoria. It will be hosted by the Victoria county ICA

chapter.

ICA President Roy Wheeler who began the benefit sale six years ago, invites all livestock producers and agribusiness owners to participate. Funds raised through the sale enable ICA to continue its work for legislation beneficial to the agriculture industry. Efforts to preserve the rural community, fight harmful immigration bills, and to encourage todays youth in agriculture through a new \$6,000 scholarship program were made possible by funds from the 1982 calf sale, Wheeler reports.

"We thank all of those who have helped with donations in the past and urge them to encourage their neighbor to donate with them this year,"

said Wheeler.

Finley Blackwell and Burrel E. Jones, owners of the Victoria Livestock Commission, Inc. have donated the use of their facilities for the fundraiser to begin at 10 a.m. Saturday.

The sale will be preceded by a cattle drive party Friday, May 13 from 7 to 12 p.m. at the VFW Hall in Victoria. Food, drings, and dancing, compliments of Citizens National Bank, First Vicoria National Bank, Interfirst Bank Vicotria, United Bank - Vicotria and Vicotria Bank and Trust will be offered to all calf donors and friends of ICA attending.

Auctioneer for the sale will be Clyde Holdcroft of Pleasanton. Serving as Transportation Director, Verlin Callahah of Bastrop will assist members in transporting their donations to Victoria. NEWS FROM BOB BULLOCK

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Tuesday said collection of the State's 10 percent mixed drink tax during the first quarter of 1983 was up 2.7 percent over the same period last year.

Bullock said the state received \$36.1 million in taxes on the sale of mixed drinks during the first three months of 1983.

Bullock's office is sending checks totaling \$10.5 million to 220 counties and 415 cities as their share of the gross receipts tax on mixed drinks for the first quarter.

The state's general revenue fund will recieve the balance--\$25.6 Million--of the tax money collected.

Texas cities and counties each receive a 15 percent rebate of the tax collected on mixed drinks sold within their boundaries under the law that legalized the sale of mixed drinks in the statel

The mixed drink tax is collected by the Alcoholic Beverage Commission and city-county rebates are sent out quarterly by the Comptroller's office.

Bullock said the mixed drink tax brought in a total of \$140.2 million during 1982.




