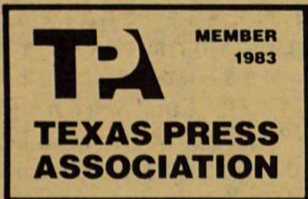

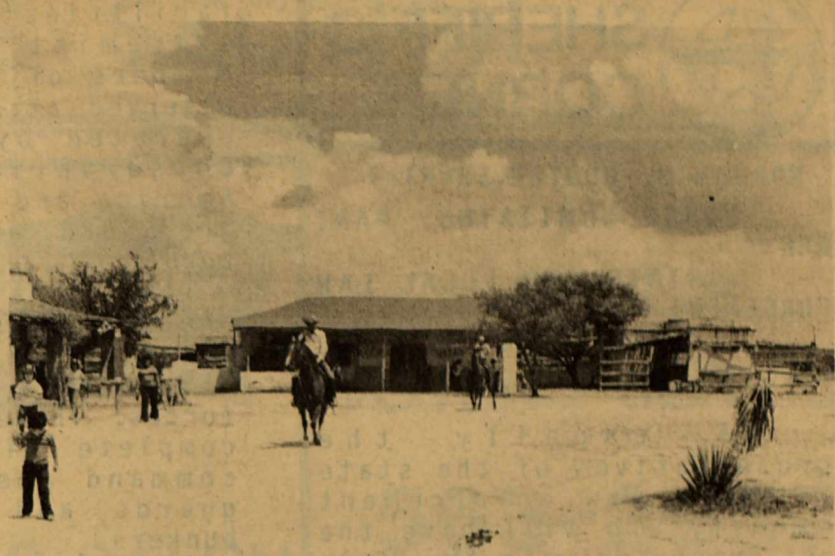

The "star" in the new animated spot is a television set, unhappy with the way a family watches its offerings. Its message is that parents should be selective about what their family watches and by watching the best in television, people can bring out the best in themselves. It is usually the representatives of the state and local law enforcement community who will have the first encounter with the PC in a particular area.

Some PC groups do not acknowledge the right of the federal or state governments to enact laws, the laws passed by these governmental bodies are held to be unconstitutional and are often ignored by these PC groups. Members of the PC have been alleged to be involved in violations of numerous state and local laws, among them murder, counterfeiting, assault, threats and intimidation. In addition, they have been arrested for violations of state income tax laws, and many others. Some PC groups have established their own townships in violation of state law and established court system appointing their own judges, clerks, and peace officers.

EQUIPMENT

Many PC members consider themselves to be a paramilitary organization, new members are required to submit to voice stress analyzer tests in order to determine their loyalty to the PC. They also advise members to train in the use of firearms and other weapons of defense. They further direct their members to hide food, gas, clothing, and firearms in areas easily accessible during times of trouble.

The PC recommends that members possess a readily available communications network consisting of CB radios, walkie-talkies and public telephones. They also advise their members to establish codes for use in communication from family type cars to four wheel drive, all terrain vehicles. A few chapters in Texas reportedly require the ownership of a four-wheel drive vehicle in order to be a member.

The PC also trains at facilities owned by other extremist organizations. Members of the PC have been observed at training programs operated by the Christian Conservation Churches of America and "The Covenant, The Sword, and the Arm of The Lord."

These training camps are operated by members who were former military personnel and instructors with the armed forces. These encampments are complete with rifle posts, command posts, patrolling guards and well equipped bunkers.

Some of the following training programs are offered by the various camps:

- 1) Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT)
- 2) emergency Tools and Weapons
- 3) Guns and Reloading
- 4) Knife fighting and how to Kill the enemy
- 5) Handgun Use and Personal Defense
- 6) Irregular (guerilla) Warfare and Hand to Hand Combat
- 7) Ultimate Home Defense

FIREARMS

Some PC leaders require their members to be very familiar in the use of firearms. They also provide extensive training programs in the use and care of firearms; the main emphasis being the consolidation of calibers and models of firearms for the greatest effect in times of use.

Some of the various types of firearms used by the PC are as follows:

1. Ruger model 10/22 semi-automatic carbine .22 caliber (used for training women and children in the use of firearms)
2. .223 caliber Hi-Power Semi-automatic Rifles (Colt AR-45--AR 180 -- Ruger Mini-14)
3. .12 gauge shotguns loaded with Double 00 buckshot
4. Ruger & Smith & Wesson Pistols (.357 magnum 158 grain hollow-point)

TRAINING CAMPS

According to newspaper accounts many members of the PC participate in regular training programs. These exercises are conducted in rural areas of the country on property owned by members of the PC or the "churches" that support the PC activities.
