
NO CAVALRYMAN NEXT WEEK

TO THE EDITOR KINNEY CAVALRYMAN BRACKETTVILLE

Two of the finest attributes of Brackettville are the younger generation and City's History and Historical Buildings. The town of Brackettville commenced in 1852 along with the establishment of Fort Clark. The population fluctuated with the operations conducted at the Fort until Fort Clark was closed in 1946. Our population and opportunities slowly began decaying after the Fort closed as evidence by the drop in population from 2,300 in 1950 to 1,432 in 1970. When the Fort re-opened in 1971 as a retirement resort the City began an upward swing to 1,676 residents in 1980. Today our best estimate, based on figures available, we are approaching or just passed the 1800 figure.

We must have a progressive comprehensive plan to ensure orderly and timely expansion. We need to progress but what is progress? Webster defines it as growth or development-continuous improvement. These are all things that are good for the City. Why then do so many shun the word. The old cliche is we do not want

Progress is change that is beneficial to all. Progress is finding and creating job opportunities for our present residents. Progress is creating job opportunities for our High School and College educated students. Progress is retaining and attracting the talent of the younger generation so they have the opportunity to live in TIME, EVEN A BROKEN CLOCK IS Kettville and raise their RIGHT TWICE A DAY families.

Those that do not want Progress--are they really

saying they want our younger generation to continue to have to leave the area to find suitable employment? Why are so many afraid of progress? Is it because they cannot adapt to beneficial change? Are those opposed to progress afraid they cannot keep up or cannot compete? Are they used

to being given things without working or earning them? Have we created a caste system of haves and havenots? Have we created a Community commanded by landowners and welfare workers?

There is not a person in Brackettville or Kinney County that would not benefit from some progress. Can not we improve our Community by first participating in elections and insuring competent, interested and available representation? Cannot we as a Community working together foster better relations? with visitors to enhance our tourist trade? Cannot we as City residents welcome and foster the trade and expertise of the area ranchers? Cannot we as City residents develop, conjunction with Fort Clark Springs, a progressive Community that can offer an abundance of opportunities for all? Cannot we as a Community dollars the entire County develop this area as a haven for all honest law abiding Citizens with pride and dignity?

The City can help attract tourist to Alamo Village and Fort Clark Springs. The City can help attract small business, new industry, new opportunities that will benefit us all. The City can continue to help develop our blighted areas. The monies generated are being planned and set aside to expand,

improve and develop present and projected areas of development.

Mistakes can and will be made. Every penny of your tax dolllars is budgeted for and accountable for by your City Council. The budget and Council meetings are and have been open to all. The Council has and I am sure will continue to act on what they believe to be in the best interest of the City.

Next month your Mayor will be calling a City election in April for a Mayor and three (3) Council members. Use your voting rights to insure your elected official speak and act for you.



May the life, the love, and the presence of Jesus bless your home this Christmas season. Let the lion and the lamb lie together in peace and let us put aside our differences, large and small as we celebrate the season of the birth of our Lord and Savaior, Jesus Christ.

1983 CHRISTMAS SEAL CARRIES TRADITIONS OF HAPPINESS AND HEALTH

This holiday season, in addition to bestowing his usual largesse of presents on children of the world, Santa Claus will be giving the gift of lung health through Christmas Seals and from the American Lung Association.

The official 1983 Christmas Seals and their matching gift tags feature a classic Santa: rosy-faced, bearded, jolly and wise. The richly colored Seal was designed by artist Bob Larkin under the direction of Kent Salisbury of Salisbury & Salisbury, New York and, with its glowing, laughing Santa is a fitting emblem for the American Lung Association of Texas, an organization devoted to the promotion of clean air and lung health.

" We tried to create the most nostalgic, universal symbol could think of," said Mr. Salisbury. And, indeed, the design team arrived at an image of old Saint Nick reminiscent of the Santa generations Americans have enjoyed through the renderings of such artists as Thomas Nast, Norman Rockwell, and Haddon Sundblom.

In ancient times, St. Nicholas was much as a gift giver as our Santa is today, but, unlike the healthy old man we know, the 4th Century Saint Nicholas was a somber willowly fellow.

Then, in 1882, C. Clement Moore, a New York theology professor, wrote a poem for his children entitled " A Visit From St. Nicholas," describing St. Nick as " a right jolly old elf, lively and quick, dressed all in fur, a bundle of toys flung on his

envergenment and the fact that the complete interest in the constitution of the consti

back." Later, Nast, the Civil War cartoonist who also invented the Republican elephant and Democratic donkey, gave Santa his first red coat. And in the early 20th Century, Haddon Sundblom advanced Santa from an elfin cartoon figure to a hearty, flesh and blood man in paintings for Coca Cola. The 1983 Christmas Seal carrries with it all of these accumulated positive images of Santa.

In addition, the Seal carries with it a 76-year-old tradition of hope and success. Christmas Seals were first sold in 1907 to combat tuberculosis and were instrumental in the progress toward defeat of that disease. Today, the Seals enliven 60 million American homes each holiday season and support the year-round work of the American Lung Association of Texas, fighting for clean air and combatting a wide variety of lung diseases, such as emphysema, asthma, chronic bronchitis and lung cancer.

The American Lung Association of Texas, the Christmas Seal People, urge Americans to " Take care of your lungs. They're only human. And, fight lung disease with with contributions to Christmas Seals".
