


- 1 head Iceberg lettuce 1 can (16 oz.) cling peach halves

2 cups shredded cooked chicken*

1/2 cup diagonally sliced green onions 1/2 cup toasted slivered almonds

Core, rinse and drain lettuce; chill. Drain peaches, reserving 1/2 cup liquid. Combine reserved liquid with vinegar, oil, sugar, soy sauce and ginger; mix well. Stir in sesame seeds; set aside. Remove outer leaves of lettuce and use to line serving plates. Shred remaining lettuce and combine with chicken, green onions and almonds; mix well. Toss with sesameginger dressing. Spoon onto lettuce leaves. Top with peach halves that have been cut into halves. Makes 6 servings.

RIO GRANDE CO-OP RECEIVES SIX MILLION DOLLAR PLUS LOAN

Senator Graham's Washington D.C. office informed the CAVA-LRYMAN Wednesday morning that the Rio Grande Electric Co-Op has received approval for a \$6,066,000 loan for 35 years at 5%. This will finance 70% of the project and the Co-op will pay the additional 30%.

The project will add 175 miles of distribution lines to the existing power facilities. This will add 680 new customers to the system.

Ft. Clark Days should be well under way by the time this paper is available to the public. The annual event brings in people to our community from many locations and all walks of life. The primary attraction to these people is the fact that Ft. Clark Days keeps alive the history and heritage of our community which was founded by the building of the fort in 1852.

Ft. Clark was one of many such forts erected along the stage routes from San Antonio, TX to San Diego, CA. Some of those most familar to us in our area are; Ft. Clark, Ft. Davis, & Ft. Stockton, which are thriving communities today. A couple of others are old Ft. Lancaster near Sheffield, TX right on the Pecos River in what is now Crockett County, and Ft. McKavett on the San Saba river in Menard

These forts were primarily constructed to supply a base for calvary soldiers to operate from for the protection of settlers and travelers in the Texas Frontier from attacks by roving bands of hostile Indians and Mexican bandits who raided the remote homesteads and struck at stagecoaches and freight wagons as they traveled the isolated roadways. The forts were garrisoned by a hardy breed of men to whom soldiering in the hot, semi desert country mounted on horseback was a way of life a softer breed would have found unbearable.

Had those old soldiers been told back then about the soft, easy life we live today, along with the things we take for granted in the way of T.V., radio, and other communications, and transportation etc., I am sure they would have called the bearer of tales of these miracles incurably insane.

At any rate I hope we have a good turnout for the annual event and we should take the time to offer a special "thank you" to those members of our community who work so hard to put on this annual event of history, heritage, and good fun.


Stay alert and stay clear—

AVOID POWER LINES

Putting up the antenna for your TV set or for the base station of your CB radio can be dangerous unless you take certain precautions.

Plan the project carefully if you install the antenna yourself. First, know where all the power lines are—then stay well away from them. Any contact between a power line and you or your antenna can be serious.

Make sure you locate your antenna (including the supporting mast and guy wires) at least one and a half times its total height from all power lines. For example, an antenna 30 feet high should be 45 feet away from power lines in all directions.



Don't use a ladder near power lines—during an antenna installation or while performing any other task. The danger from using a metal ladder is obvious. But a wooden ladder can conduct electricity, too, if it's damp or if it has dirt or paint on it.

Electricity brings a more comfortable life to all of us, but it must be treated cautiously. Stay alert—and stay clear of power lines!

Q. My neighbor has a lovely dining room set that she bought unfinished, then stained herself. I'd like to try it too. Any tips?

A. It's as easy as one, two, three. First, PREPARE the surface Sand lightly with

surface. Sand lightly with fine sandpaper or garnet paper, then clean the piece with denatured alcohol. Apply wood seal if

with soft woods like pine. (This keeps the stain from streaking.) Then, STAIN. Brush-on, pigmented stains are ideal for first-time projects. Brush the stain on darker than you want it, wait five minutes, then wipe off the excess until you have the desired shade. Now, FINISH by brushing on a varnish or polyurethane finish to protect your piece. And remember—read and follow all label directions for best results.

WHAT ARE HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS?

A homestead exemption reduces the taxable value of your residence homestead. Various types of homestead exemptions are available in Texas and, if you qualify, they can lower your total property tax bill. Read on for details.

What Exemptions Are Available?

School districts offer a residence homestead exemption to all homeowners and additional exemptions to people who are disabled or over 65.

Counties offer homestead exemptions on their farm-to-market or flood control tax rates and may offer exemptions to the disabled and elderly.

Cities and other taxing units may offer exemptions for the disabled and elderly.

All taxing units offer an exemption for certain disabled veterans on one designated property.

Some taxing units offer an additional local-option percentage homestead exemption to resident homeowners.

How Do I Apply?

If you received a residence homestead exemption on your present home in 1984, you will not need to apply again for 1985, unless the chief appraiser requires you to file. If you were 65 or disabled on January 1 and have not previously applied for the over-65 or disability homestead exemption, you will need to apply this year.

Or, if you have never had a homestead exemption on your present home, you should file your original application in 1985.

Apply for all exemptions to the county appraisal district at the address below. Forms are available from the appraisal office.

Is There a Deadline?

You should apply before May 1 for 1985 exemptions. While late applications for exemptions may be accepted in certain instances, you can fully protect your rights by applying before May 1.






