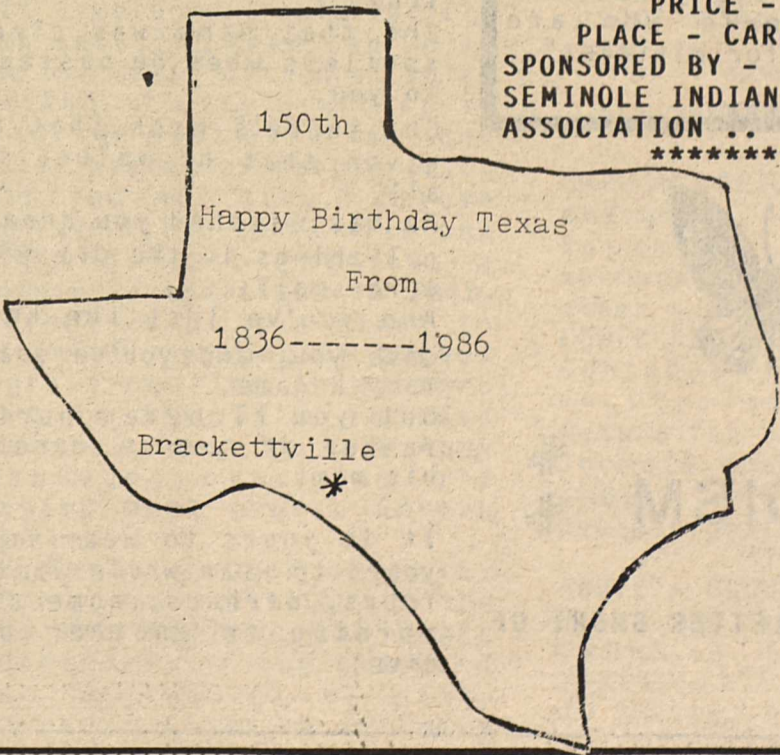

TEXAS AGRICULTURAL EXTENSION SERVICE

Spring is the time of year when fruit and nut trees should be grafted in the Winter-garden. According to Dr. Loy Shreve, horticulturist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, homeowners or orchard owners wishing to graft a more desirable variety to an existing tree can do so with the Texas method of inlay grafting. "Inlay grafting is one of the most efficient and popular system of propogating fruit and nut tree," Shreve said recently. It is also one of the oldest. Antoine, a gardener in Louisiana in 1845, is credited as the first to successfully propogate pecans by grafting. The inlay bark graft is simply a refined procedure proven to have many advantages over the old standard bark graft, Shreve explained.

The Texas method of inlay grafting was initiated in the 1950s and follows the basic fundamentals of the standard inlay procedure, he said. "However, it uses an entirely new system of covering the graft and stock," the

horticulturist explained.

The graftwood is literally inlaid into the existing tree. The only tools needed are a sharp saw, knife with a grafting blade, aluminum foil, polyethylene plstic film (such as a sandwich bag), budding strips or polyethylene tape, and shellac or glue to seal cuts and insure that insects will not damage the graft. Aluminum foil provides the base cover used to protect the graft reflecting sunlight and reducing temperatures around the inlay, he said, and polyethylene plastic film assures constant high relative humidity around the inlay, he said. By using the aluminum foil and bag, the burdensome wax melter of the past is no longer needed, he said. "Anyone can do inlay grafting by following instructions and practicing the skill," Shreve said.

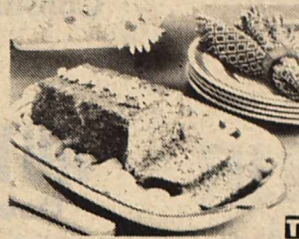

HOT OR COLD MEAT LOAF

- 2 pounds lean ground beef
- 1 medium onion, peeled and chopped
- 1/2 cup low-sodium tomato sauce
- 2 whole eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup fresh bread crumbs (from low-sodium bread)

Take care when you're boating: Power lines could be there

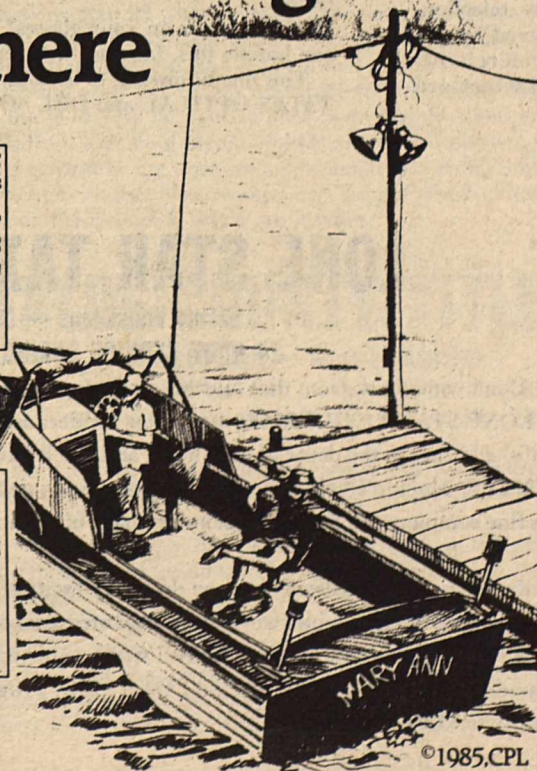
Anytime you're launching your boat or transporting it over land, check carefully to make sure you avoid all electrical facilities.

- Don't trim or fell trees near power lines. This is work best left to experts.
- Keep ladders and other tall devices away from overhead lines.
- Don't install an outside antenna unless you have the proper knowledge and equipment; have a qualified technician handle the job.

And remember that fallen power lines are extremely dangerous. If you see a downed line, call Central Power and Light Company, then stay away from the line and keep others away.

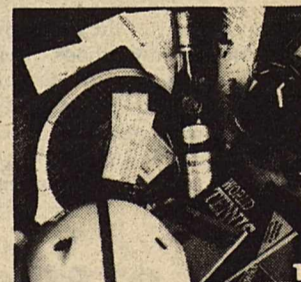

Lindeman decided that it would be best to give the three a ride out of town so he took them to the Pinto Creek roadside park west of town on Highway 90. Shortly thereafter it was learned that all three men had been run as white so another check was made through NCIC on the two black males and a "hit" was returned on one of the men. He was wanted by the state of Wisconsin on drug related charges and other felony warrants. Due to the fact that the return indicated that the man should be approached with caution I was contacted and we received backup from local Border Patrol officers. The three men were located and arrested on Highway 90 approx. 6 miles west of Brackett. The wanted man, Earl Williams, 42, of Eau Claire, Wisconsin was booked into the county jail after positive identification was made and the warrants on him confirmed. His two companions were released after a thorough check was made on them and no warrants were found. Williams will be held without bond until authorities from Eau Claire come to Brackettville and take custody of him.

The following, Tuesday, June 3rd, I left for Houston to transport Reynaldo Vasquez to the Harris County Jail. Vasquez was arrested here recently while driving a 1986 Chevrolet pickup that had been stolen from Houston. While there I made contact with two officers of the Harris County Sherriff's Department Motor Vehicle Theft Division and discussed the problems we had been having in the past concerning stolen vehicles out of Harris County. I also explained to them that we would no longer bear the expense of trying suspects for crimes committed in Harris County and that I did not feel that it would be the right thing to do by just turning them loose. After working out a few more problems and exchanging views on our respective departmental policies we came to an agreement concerning the handling of these type cases and the officers assured me that if I would contact them personally whenever the need arose that we would have no more problems. Communications, a wonderous thing sometimes!! The agreement certainly made the trip worthwhile as we have captured about 6 car thieves from Harris County over the past couple of years and Kinney County has ended up trying all but this last one.

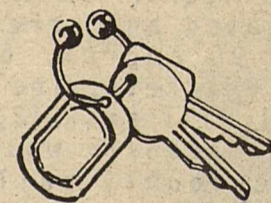
