



Nicephore Niepce, a Frenchman, in 1826 took the first photograph by coating an eight inch by six and a half inch pewter plate with bitumen of Judea, (a kind of asphalt) and put it in a wooden box that had an aperture fitted with a lens. He pointed the box out his attic window at the barnyard below, leaving it all day. At dark he took out the plate, washed it in lavender oil and petroleum, and the image remained.

Other inventors had been working on the same idea by making sun prints on paper or leather coated paper but the pictures quickly faded. Niepce's picture was permanent with the first true photograph.

A Parisian scene painter named Louis Mande Daguerre, became Niepce's partner. Niepce died in 1833 and Daguerre worked on trying to improve the process.

William Henry Fox Talbot, produced the first paper negative in England. In 1837, Daguerre produced on treated copper plate, his first daguerre-type. Two years later it was perfected and introduced to the world.

By 1841, nearly every major city in Europe and the United States had at least one portrait studio. The invention of the compound lens and faster plates reduced the exposure time to less than a minute, hereto for the subject had been forced to stare into the light or sunlight for ten to twenty minutes.

In the United States, many Daguerre typists learned their trade from Samuel F.B. Morse. One of his most celebrated pupils was Matthew Brady, the famous Civil War photographer.

Daguerre's process was not popular with everyone, duplicates could not be made, except by rephotographing, but during the next twenty years his process flourished.

Fox Talbot's paper negatives provided Daguerre's first competition and Talbots process produced some of the finest photographs ever made even though the exposure time was not as short as Daguerre's.

News pictures were made at the very beginning but newsmen could take better pictures with the new wet-plate, which was simply glass coated with chemicals in a wet

collodion solution which was developed in 1851. Later came the dry plate in 1864 and modern film in 1882. The newsman turned his picture over to a woodblock carver who copied it for an engraving to be printed in a paper or magazine.

About 1872, in France, Etienne Jules Marey, produced a camera capable of photographing birds in flight.

The revolution in subject matter occured slowly. In the 1880's, Jacob Rils, a police reporter of the New York Sun, began photographing the slums and used the pictures in his book, "How the Other Half Lives".

Also in the same years prints called "Carte de Visite" were made and so called because they were left with calling cards when one paid a visit, but was a fad which didn't last very long. In the late 1890's, Eugene Atget made complete photographic records of Paris life. But it was left to the American, Alfred Steiglitz to open the way to modern photography.


BLAND PROVIDES SERVICE

BOHMFALK LECTURES AT L.A.F.B.

Tuesday, December 16, Brackettville Police Chief David Bohmfalk presented a lecture on Texas Law to incoming personnel at Laughlin Air Force Base.

An audience of 30 enlisted personnel and officers listened responsively as Bohmfalk spoke on laws in Texas regarding Driving While Intoxicated, the manditory seat belt law, and the paying of citations. Bohmfalk also reminded his audience to take caution while driving due to the frequency of deer crossing the highways.

During his talk on the use of seat belts, Bohmfalk related a story of his own and showed photographs of an accident in which he was involved that almost cost his life.

He explained that he and a partner were in pursuit of a D.W.I. suspect when they were hit on the passenger side of their vehicle at an intersection. Bohmfalk, the passenger at the time of the accident, received a severe concussion a fractured pelvis, a brused spleen, a chipped front tooth, and had his right ear torn off. "If it were not for the fact I was wearing my seat belt," he emphasized, "I would not be here today."

Due to the overwhelming response to Bohmfalk's speech, David Radner, Chief of Ground Safety at Laughlin Air Force Base, requested that he return and speak to future classes of new personnel.



Dear Sue: How do I know that the carriage, crib, etc. that I buy for my baby is safe? Joan G.


Dear Joan: The Juvenile Products Manufacturers Association puts a label, "JPMA Certified" on playpens, strollers, cribs and similar products that meet with safety standards. Standards for baby walkers will be in effect by the end of this year and baby gates by the end of next year. Remember, though, no matter how safe a product is made, accidents can still happen. You have to watch your baby. Never leave babies unattended when they are in a high chair or walker.

Dear Sue: I was shocked by recent news stories about children turning their parents in to the police because of the parents' drug use. Everyone seems to think these children are heroes. Whatever happened to family loyalty? Talk about biting the hand that feeds you! I think these

children are a disgrace. Camille R.

Dear Camille: When parents are drunk or stoned, children are in danger. Children in those situations need help. Ideally, children should be able to get help from a relative, teacher or clergyman, but if they feel that they have no one to turn to, then they should go to the police. 
