Gov. Bush Names Dana W. Cooley to Serve as D.A. for Borden & Scurry Counties

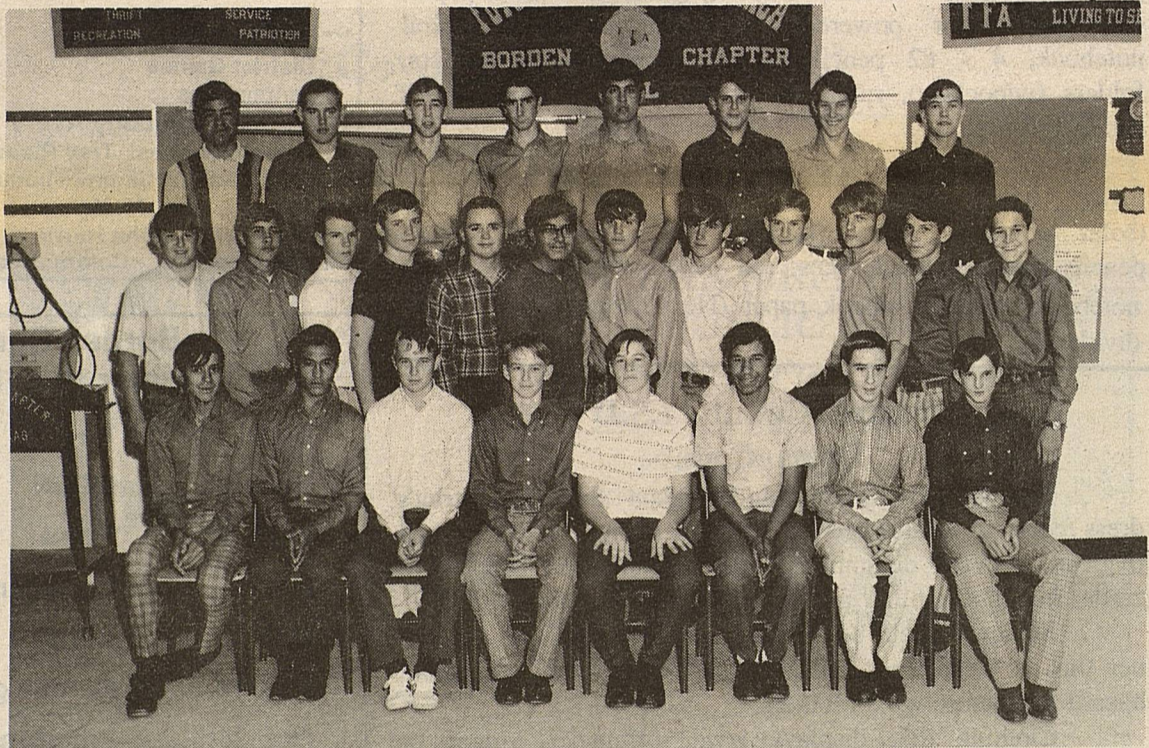
Governor George W. Bush named Dana W. Cooley to serve as District Attorney for the 132nd Judicial District for Borden and Scurry Counties. Ms. Cooley currently serves as Assistant District Attorney for the 132nd Judicial District. She will replace Ernie Armstrong who has assumed the position of judge of the 132nd District Court.

As Assistant District Attorney, Ms. Cooley assists law enforcement officers with the investigation of felony criminal cases, presents cases to grand juries, prepares and tries cases before the court, and represents the state in civil cases, juvenile and adult criminal cases, and appeals. She is a member of the State Bar of Texas

and the Texas District and County Attorney's Association. Before joining the D.A.'s office, Ms. Cooley was a partner in the law firm of Rosser, Armstrong, Cooley & Hartman, P.C. She also worked as a teacher in the Borden County I.S.D. and the Monahans-Wickett-Pyote I.S.D.

Active in her community, Ms. Cooley has served as president of the Snyder Kiwanis Club, and has performed volunteer work with the Goodfellows, Snyder Neighbors Sharing, and Noah Project programs. Dana is a graduate of Borden County High School, Abilene Christian University, and Texas Tech University School of Law. She is the daughter of Ross and Peggy Westbrook.

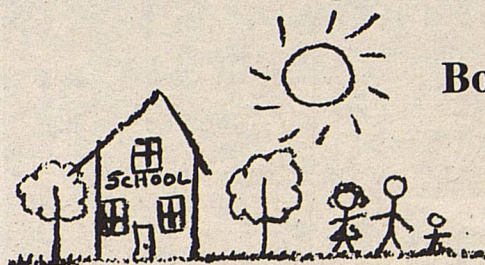

Borden County Elementary School Supply List

Kindergarten: Round edged scissors, crayons, supply box, Elmer's School Glue (not paste), 2 - #2 pencils, big eraser, gym shoes, towel for naps, and baby wipes.

First Grade: 4 or 5 - #2 pencils, supply box, 2 small boxes of crayons, (primary colors), scissors, eraser (hard rubber), Elmer's School Glue, gym shoes and baby wipes.

Second Grade: 2 - #2 pencils, crayons, Elmer's School Glue, red grading pencil, notebook paper, scissors, eraser, gym shoes, ruler and baby wipes.

Third Grade: Loose-leaf notebook, notebook paper, spiral (NO College Ruled), 4 - #2 pencils, 2-red pens or 4-red pencils, 12 inch ruler (metric & standard), small bottle of glue, crayons, 2 folders, gym shoes and baby wipes.

Fourth Grade: Scissors, crayons, glue, notebook paper, calculator (solar powered), loose-leaf notebook, spiral notebook, 4 - #2 pencils, 2-red pens, set of dividers, folders (w/pockets), ruler (metric & standard), gym shoes and baby wipes.

Fifth Grade: Scissors, watercolor markers, calculator (solar powered), ruler (metric & standard), protractor, pencils, blue or black pens, red pencils or pen, loose-leaf notebook, white notebook paper (No College Ruled), and dividers.

Borden County I.S.D Dress Code

The Borden County Independent School District's dress code is established to teach personal grooming and hygiene, prevent disruptions, avoid health and safety hazards, instill discipline and teach respect for authority.

Students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean, neat, and will not be a safety or health hazard to themselves or others.

Clothing that displays lewd, offensive, vulgar or obscene language; advertises or promotes alcohol, tobacco or other drugs, refers to satanic cult or gang activity is prohibited.

GUIDELINES:

Dresses, skirts, split skirts and shorts should be no shorter than two inches above the knee.

No bicycle shorts or spandex shorts.

No flip-flops or bathroom type footwear.

No shirts with cut out sleeves, tank tops or muscle shirts.

A bare midriff is not acceptable.

No slashed, torn or cut off jeans.

Boys will not wear ear jewelry.

Hair shall be clean and well groomed.

The following extremes should be avoided:

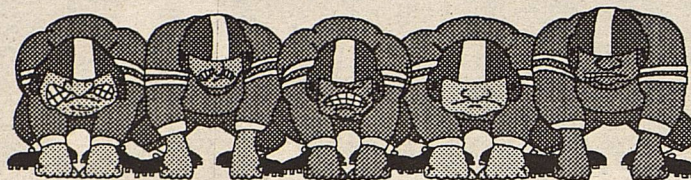
Color variations in the hair.

Sideburns must be trimmed and not extreme.

Mustaches are acceptable if neatly trimmed and not extreme.

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF NONDISCRIMINATION IN CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Borden County Independent School District offers career and technology education programs in Agricultural Science and Micro-Computer Applications. Admission to these programs is based on the needs of the students in the Borden County Independent School District.

It is the policy of The Borden County School District not to discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, or handicap in its vocational programs, services, or activities as required by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972; and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

The Borden County Independent School District will take steps to assure that lack of English language skills will not be a barrier to admission and participation in all educational and vocational programs.

Kids, parents views sought on educational television

Survey have shown that children under the age of 18 spend thousands of hours each year glued to their television sets. Children as young as 2 watch TV more than 23 hours a week, a figure that remains amazingly consistent until they turn 17.

Some experts now say many infants are propped in front of the TV to be dazzled by the sight and sound.

Federal Communications Commission, the government agency that regulates the television industry, is studying ways to ensure that an adequate supply of educational and informational television programming is available to children.]

The FCC also is asking that this programming be clearly identified for children, their parents and care givers. From now until September 14 the FCC will be receiving comments and suggestions and will consider adopting new rules to improve children's TV programming. The date to reply to comments was extended to October 16.

There will be many comments from the broad-

casters, from the people who produce the programs, from lawyers and from professional children's advocates. But the Commission would also like to get comments from kids, their parents and care givers.

Because it found that broadcasters were not providing enough educational programming for children, Congress in 1990 enacted the Children's Television Act to ensure such programming was available. The FCC was charged with overseeing this effort.

Based on the results an FCC's 1993 inquiry and a 1994 hearing on the effectiveness of its children's television programming regulations, the FCC proposed to make changes to assure that broadcast station license holders comply with the Children Television Act and to implement the Act more effectively.

In developing the proposed changes, the Commission has followed three principles: (1) judgments about the quality of programming, educational or otherwise, are best made by audiences, not the federal government; (2) the Commission's rules must be clear, simple and fair; and (3) broadcasters should be guided by market forces... in determining whether they meet their programming obligations.

Specific proposals suggest that stations identify programs as educational and informational at the time they are aired and provide identifying information to publishers of programming guides.

Stations would publicize the availability of their children's programming, perhaps by announcing their existence and air time.

So - kids and parents - sit down at your kitchen table, at your desk, on the floor, wherever you are comfortable, and let the FCC know what's right about the way educational programs come into your home, if there's enough available, what's wrong with it, and how it should be identified so you'll know when to tune in.




