## How a Town Attracted a New Industry And Improved Isself as a Community

Here's a word of cheer from the people of Chenoa, Illinois, to their counterparts in other small towns who wistfully chant the fascinating refrain: "I wonder if we couldn't get some kind of small factory or new industry to establish here."

The good word answering that refrain in this case is "yes." The achievement is possible when cooperative planning and hard work are brought to
bear on the problem, and when a suitable business or industry happens to be looking for a place in your general area where it can lo-

It's a two-part formula, and there is no hedging on either ingredient. There must be a nucleus of energetic citizens to make the

 new industry idea boom, and the prospective industry must be a log. ical, realistic target for all the practical and hard-headed arguments you can marshall t persuade it to locate in your town.Chenoa, population 1,500, was able to combine the two elements of the formula to get its new industry-Seibert and Sons, Inc., manufacturers of a multiple spindle drill, who expect to open a plant there in the near future. Current planning calls for the employment of more than 100 men in the enterprise, most of whom will be recruited locally and trained on the spot.

The company had been searching for a small town tocation for some time, and in the course of its investigation had made inquiries in Chenoa. The immediate result was a profitable head-on collision with a Rotary club committee of local businessmen who, in the meantime, had been trying to unearth just such a deal.

One of Chenoa's persuasive arguments for attracting new industry was supposed to be a likely looking area just north of town, convenient to the railroad tracks. As it turned out, however, the company wanted no part of the tracks. Its operation was concerned mainly with precision tools, and was too delicate to stand vibrations that might be caused by passing trains.

By this time, though, local businessmen were sufficiently interested in the proposal to obtain another location at the eastern edge of Chenoa. A tract of five acres was purchased by a group of 61 businessmen and offered to the company. It was accepted, and Chenoa's show was on the road.

The five-acre parcel of land was part of a 33 -acre area which since has been annexed by the community. Water, severs, and lights have been carried out, and the city is now laying out streets. The addition was subdivided into building lots and a number of houses since have been brought under construction.

Thus, Chenoa obtained a new addition to its own community body, as well as a new industry. The factory building is just about completed and is expected to be in full production within two months.

The new factory and addition have stimulated enthusiasm for boosting the town in other ways. A committee for community prog. ress has been formed, taking as its first major project a concerted effort to expand and improve the town's present recreation facilities.

Although the committee has no further plans for the time being, one of the members has said that the group feels the best way to get
 started on a long-range program of community development is to take one major problem and start solving it.

With that attitude, Chenoa has passed a milestone in community progress. The attack upon and solution of one major problem inevitably will lead to more problems and thus to more solutions. It is the old challenge-and-response concept, which makes towns, as well as individuals, move ahead.

Chenoa started out trying to attract a new industry. Very probably the people of the town will wake up some morning in the future and discover that somewhere along the line they also have built themselves a better community.
