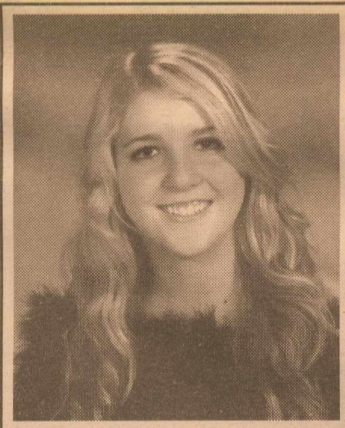

Froman is a member of the National Beta Club and is a Distinguished Achievement graduate.

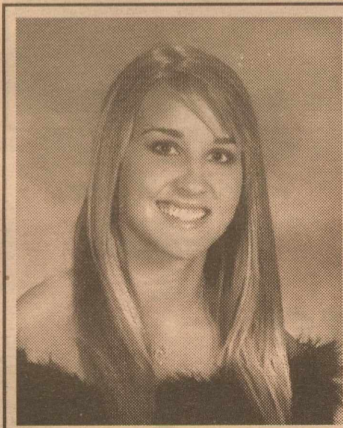

Roberts goes to Austin in Feature Writing, an event she won at the district contest and placed 3rd in at regional.

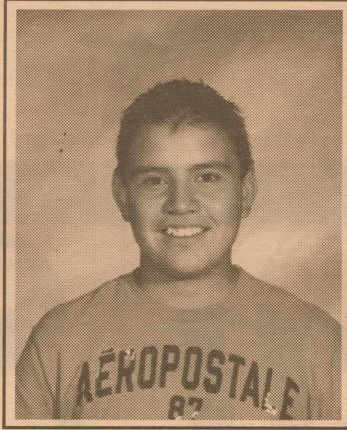
Rutherford, also a first-time state qualifier, will compete in Lincoln-Douglas Debate. She was 2nd at the regional meet.

Eating Well With Canned Goods

Canned food can be very convenient to have on hand for quick, low cost meals. Research has found that nutritionally speaking, canned food is comparable to its cooked fresh and frozen counterparts (Bruhn, C. 2007. *A Nutritional Comparison of Canned, Fresh and Frozen Fruits and Vegetables. Journal of the Science of Food and Agriculture*).

To get the most form your food budget, stock up on canned fruits vegetables and soups when they are on sale. Buy cans that are in good shape and free of dents. Budgeting cans are a sign of possible spoilage or contamination. Be sure to practice the rule, FIRST IN, FIRST OUT. This means you use the oldest products first. A good practice in the home is to place the newly purchased cans in back of the same products already on the shelf. The best temperature for storing canned foods is between 50° F and 70° F. Avoid storing canned foods in a warm place near hot pipes a range or furnace, or in direct sunlight. Keep canned goods dry to prevent cans or metal lids from rusting, which may cause cans to leak and food to spoil (Schutz, P.H. and E.H. Hoyle, 1999. *Safe Handling of Canned Goods*. Clemson University).

Healthier varieties of your favorite canned foods are being offered in many stores. Read labels carefully and choose fruits packed in natural juices or water, without added sugar. Good choices include pineapple in natural juice and unsweetened applesauce. Products with heavy or even light syrup have added sugar, which means more calories. Select 'not salt added' canned

foods in your store, consider rinsing and draining higher sodium foods, such as tuna, salmon, beans and vegetables to eliminate some salt.

Top Picks for Canned Goods

Salmon: Each 3-ounce serving provides almost 2 grams of omega-3 fatty acids. According to numerous studies, these fats reduce inflammation and help prevent risk factors associated with chronic diseases such as heart disease, Alzheimer's, cancer, and arthritis. A serving of salmon also contains about 35 percent of the Daily Value for protein, along with a good amount of calcium. Use canned salmon as you would tuna—as a sandwich filling or mixed into salads and casseroles. (nutritiondata.com and alaskaseafood.org)

Pumpkin: Canned pumpkin packs 20 times the beta-carotene (which is converted to vitamin A in the body) as fresh because of its lower water content (meatime.org). A half-cup serving of canned pumpkin supplies a staggering 300 percent of the Daily Value for vitamin A from beta-carotene. Carotenoids such as beta-carotene act as antioxidants that protect you from cancer, heart disease, and other age-related conditions. Use canned pumpkin in pies, muffins, quick breads, or puddings. For a quick and tasty dessert, you can top it with a drizzle of honey and sprinkle of cinnamon then heat in the microwave for a minute.

Refried beans: "Refried" simply means pinto beans (or black beans in some cases) are cooked, mashed, and then cooked again. While some fat may be added in the process, the overall fat content is usu-

ally low, and some companies are now offering low fat or fat free varieties as well. Each half-cup serving provides more than 25 percent of the Daily Value for fiber along with a good dose of protein and iron Spoon refried beans into burritos, or make Mexican lasagna by layering beans with whole-grain corn tortillas, diced chilies or peppers, and top it all off with low-fat cheese. (USDA Fact Sheet and nutritiondata.com).

Tip: Pay attention to product dating on canned and packaged items.

"Sell-by dates tell the store how long to display the product for sale. You should buy the product before the date expires to have sufficient time to use it at best quality.

"Best if used by" dates are recommended for best flavor or quality. It is not a purchase or safety date.

"Use-by" dates are the last date recommended for the use of the product while at peak quality.



Brush Busters Stem Spray Method

Works Best: For control of relatively young mesquite trees that have smooth bark and few basal stems, those slim trunks emerging from the ground. The method has been known for years as the low-volume, basal stem treatment technique. What's new is that research has shown excellent results using much less herbicide making it much more economical.

When to Apply: Any time during the year, although best results occur during the spring-summer growing season.

Prepare Equipment: Almost any type of pump-up hand sprayer can be used, but the most efficient way to apply the spray to many trees is with a backpack sprayer. Make sure the sprayer's nozzle has a small orifice. One such nozzle, called the Conejet® 5500-X1, is available from Spraying Systems Company. This nozzle can reduce the quantity of spray applied by 80 percent over standard nozzles — for a much more cost-effective use of chemicals.

Mix herbicide with diesel: A mixture of the herbicide Remedy™ and diesel fuel oil is very effective for this method. Diesel acts as a coating agent to ensure good coverage and absorption. The recommended concentration of Remedy™ will vary depending on the size and age of the mesquite.

Recommended concentration of Remedy™ to mix with diesel fuel oil.

| Mesquite Type | % Remedy™ | Amount/Gallon Mixed |
|----------------------------|-----------|---------------------|
| Smooth Bark | | |
| • 1.5 in. diameter or less | 15% | 19 oz. |
| • 1.5-4 in. diameter | 25% | 1 quart |
| Rough Bark | 25% | 1 quart |

Pour the required quantity of Remedy™ into mixing container, then bring to total volume desired with diesel fuel oil. Vigorously shake or stir to ensure thorough mixing. Rough-bark mesquites (usually older trees) are much more difficult to control than smooth-bark mesquites.

Spray the Mesquite: Stem applications are effective throughout the year but the best time to spray is during the growing season when temperatures are high. Be sure to adjust the sprayer nozzle to deliver a narrow, cone-shaped mist. Holding the nozzle within 1 to 2 inches of the mesquite stem, spray the mixture on the plant's stem or trunk from the ground line to a height of 12 inches. Apply the mixture to all sides of the trunk, wetting almost to the point of runoff.

Keep these points in mind:

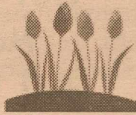
- Follow herbicide label directions.
- Cost of treatment escalates rapidly as density of brush increases or number of basal stems per plant increases.
- Multiple-stemmed plants or rough-barked plants are more difficult to control with this method.
- Do not spray when basal stems are wet.
- After mixing herbicide with diesel, shake or agitate the solution vigorously.
- Dense grass around basal stems reduces efficiency of this method.

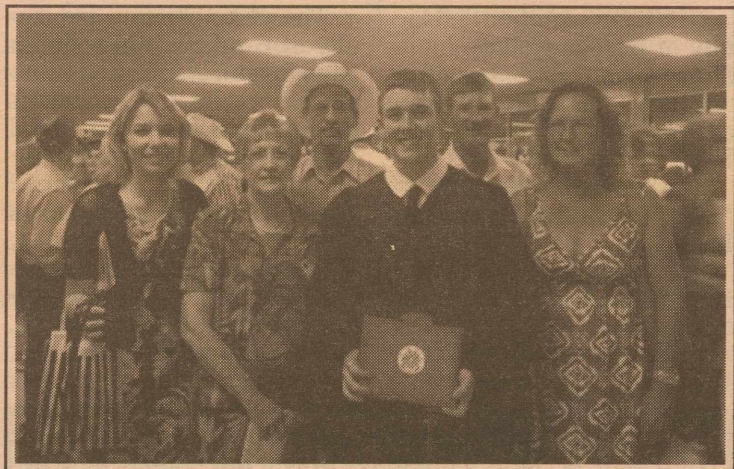

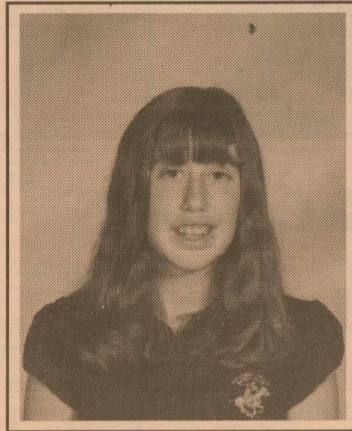

Following the district meets in all spring activities, Borden County High School recently claimed the overall Spring Meet Sweepstakes Championship for District 4-A.

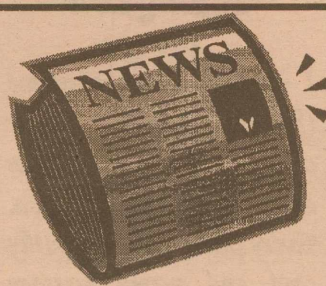
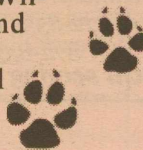
