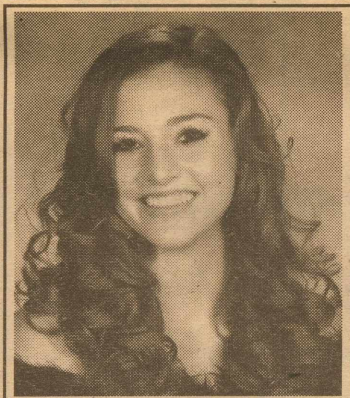

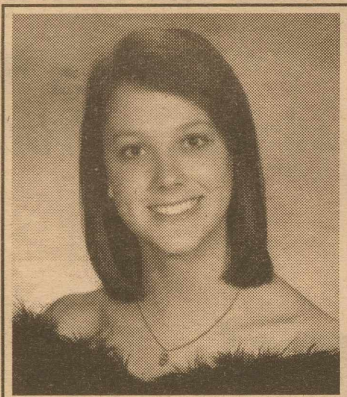
In U.I.L. Academic competition, Richey participated in Poetry, Spelling, and Calculator each year of high school and was a part of the One-Act Play her Senior year.

Tarleton was chosen "Most Likely to Succeed" by the student body.

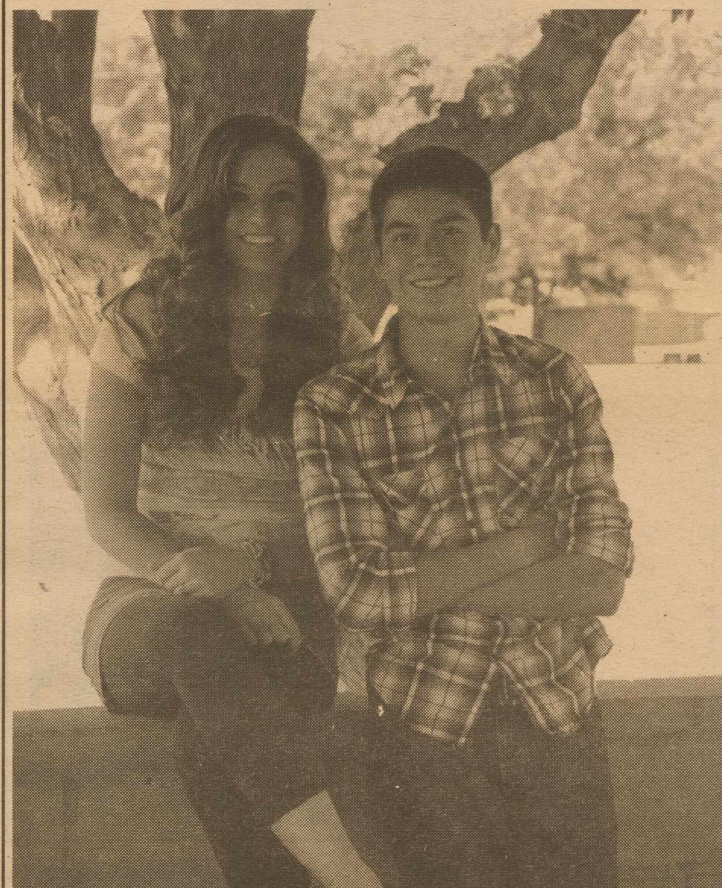
Tarleton plans to attend Angelo State University this fall and will major in Nursing.

Sun Safety in the Texas Heat

It's that time again in Texas when the temperatures get up to three digit numbers, but it isn't just the heat that is getting to you. The sun also emits UV rays which can be harmful to the skin. Did you know that excessive exposure to the ultraviolet radiation of the sun is the most important preventable cause of all skin cancers? Melanoma is the most serious form of skin cancer and according to the National Cancer Institute it is estimated that there will be 62,480 new cases in the United States as well as 8,420 deaths in 2008. Don't let yourself or your family members be a part of these numbers. Learning a few things about skin safety can help you prevent it.

There are different types of UV rays that come from the sun. Some sunscreens only protect from one type. Be sure to get a sunscreen that protects from both UVA and UVB rays. Just because it is cloudy outside doesn't mean that the UV rays are blocked from reaching your skin. Like light UVA rays can go through glass, so before taking off for a car ride don't forget to put some sunscreen on. UV rays can also do damage to your eyes so find a wide (3") brim hat and some sunglasses to protect your face as well.

Some tips on keeping the UV rays from harming you:

1. Apply sunscreen 20 minutes before going out in the sun - it needs to soak in before being effective. Make it a morning routine and then you'll never forget!

2. Apply sunscreen every two hours when in the sun - SPF 30 or higher and one that

protects against both UVA and UVB rays. Remember the hat and sunglasses too!

3. Fill a basket by the front door with sunglasses, hats and sunscreen- so as you rush out the door you remember take a bottle with you to reapply later as needed.

4. Make playing in the shade fun - During the peak hours of the day when the sun's rays are at their highest point find some fun games at <http://gameskidsplay.net>.

5. Use extra caution around water and sand - these surfaces reflect the UV rays which can increase your chances of getting a sun burn.

It Never Gets Old.....

For years as a young teacher, I witnessed the State Literary UIL experience as Netta Jarrett went year after year (and won gold medals year after year) with her business students—shorthand and typing events of that era. I was a young mother and inexperienced UIL sponsor, having been thrown to the wolves to coach events of which I knew next to nothing. Learning on the job was an understatement.

The State UIL Academic mystique took on another dimension when a young teacher name Darrin Ard came to Borden County in 1998. In the decade he was here, the speech program dominated the 1A scene, winning two speech team state championships along with numerous individual medals. CX and LD debaters owned the first decade of the new century, including winning CX five out of six years—something no Texas school any size has ever done.

In some ways, a new era began in 2011-2012. The self-proclaimed triumvirate of Cindy Herridge, Charla Soto, and I scrambled to piece together a literary team after losing Mr. Ard—the architect of the ten consecutive district championships. Frank Sinatra sang it best because we had to do it “our way.” It wasn’t easy, and it had its ups and downs. And, learning on the job was again a big part of the equation. Thank goodness for our coaching peers across the state who stepped up to teach us and our students about persuasive and informative speaking and prose and poetry. Thank goodness for the sweet spirits of Mrs. Herridge and Mrs. Soto who once never complained about these new assignments in addition to their one-act responsibilities.

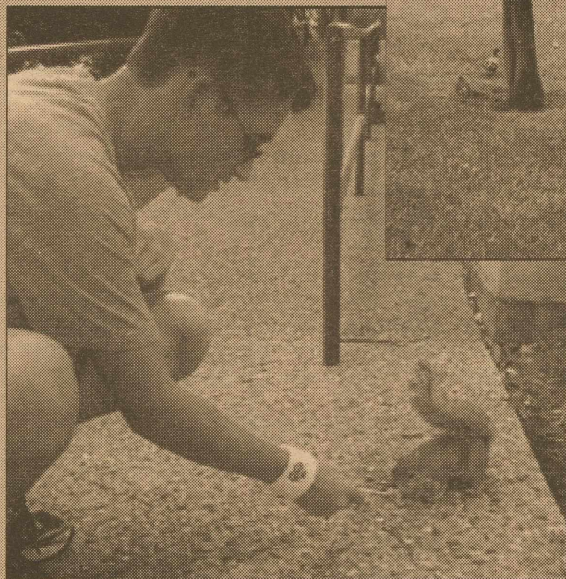
Another “new” teacher joined the faculty this year as well, and right off the bat groomed a state champion. Mrs. Denice Bradbury certainly can take credit for her role in helping Joseph McConnell achieve what he has called “a dream of mine.”

Last week the Borden County contingency returned to Austin with three seniors and two freshmen who reminded us that this 345-mile-trip to the Hill County is the culmination of and the reward for pure and simple hard work. The trip is also a time machine of memories: when John Hensley, Zach McMeans, and T. J. knelt down to feed the squirrels, I could just see Doyce Taylor and Brice Key doing the same thing twenty-five years earlier. When Tarey Tarleton, who had come to support her daughter Krista (Feature writer), I recalled Carol Lewis coming along to see her daughter Amy win a medal in the same event in 1990. The list could go on and on and on—the memories certainly do.

Mrs. Jarrett and Mr. Ard—both of whom we saw while on this trip—will be pleased to know that the legacy of which they are a vital part continues. While sponsors change, the expectations do not. Borden County can be proud that what happened this year is proof that the importance of traditions never grows old.

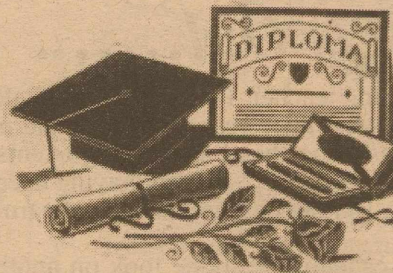

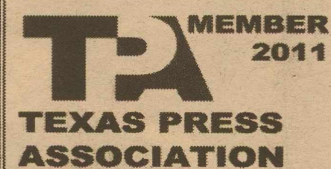

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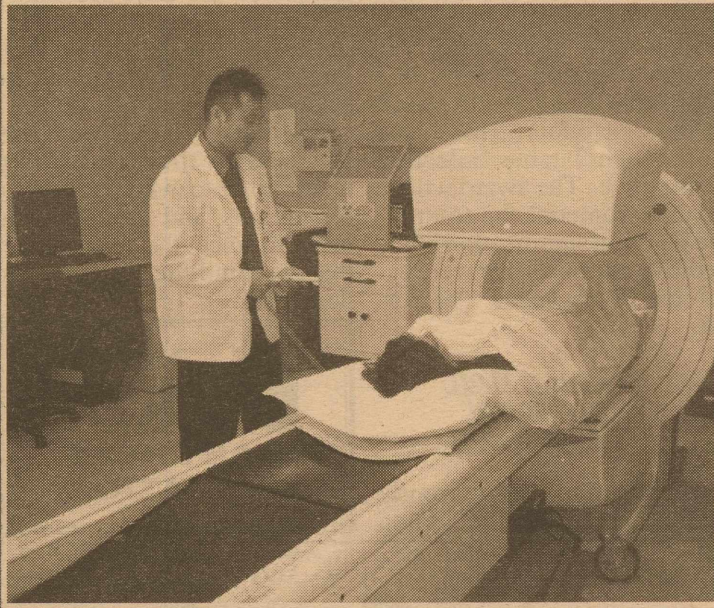
