USDA Announces Borden and Garza Counties are Eligible for Emergency Loans

Borden and Garza Counties were declared a contiguous disaster due to drought and heat using the streamlined Secretarial Disaster Designation process. Under this designation, producers with operations in any primary or contiguous county are eligible to apply for low interest emergency loans.

The streamlined disaster designation process issues a drought disaster declaration when a county has experienced a drought intensity value of at least a D2 (severe drought) level for eight consecutive weeks based on the U.S. Drought Monitor during the crop year.

Emergency loans help producers recover from production and physical losses due to drought, flooding and other natural disasters or quarantine.

Producers have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for emergency loan assistance. FSA

will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. Producers can borrow up to 100 percent of actual production or physical losses, to a maximum amount of \$500,000.

A Weekend in Mountain Country

I spent a day in Terlingua, the Temple of Chilidom. Got to visit with John Holroyd, the new owner of La Kiva, the well-known watering hole just above Terlingua Creek. He has made some grand improvements to the place, which once used a black pot for a urinal. John hails from Yorkshire, England originally and migrated to Oklahoma 30 or so years ago. He is retired now and has been a frequent visitor to the desert country. He was a friend of the previous owner of La Kiva, Glen Felts, who died last year. La Kiva stayed closed for 6 months and John didn't want to see it turn to dust, so he bought it. He stayed closed another year to do the refurbishing. The bar is open now and the restaurant will open soon with gourmet pizzas, brisket and other menu items. He has a barbecue cooker that can handle 1,000 pounds of meat. All the kitchen equipment is state of the art.

I also interviewed Lauren Stedman who has Menagerie Press in Terlingua. She makes exquisite invitations, business cards and other printed items using old-fashioned letterpress equipment and high-grade papers. She is a graphic design artist and her creations go all over the country.

I also met a genuine DIVA. Diane Wysocki is a member of Women Outdoors Worldwide, a group of women who shoot guns, slingshots and bows and arrows. They also do fly-fishing. All members are called DIVAs. They promote shooting safety and have worldwide shooting competitions. The organization's headquarters is in Dallas.

The next day I went to Alpine and visited with Dr. Paul Will, chair of the Meat Science department at Sul Ross who teaches a course called Sausage Manufacturing. It's a two-week course beginning January 4. Students of all disciplines flock to the course, where they can earn 4 semester hours credit. "I give them 25 pounds of meat and some seasoning and teach them how to make sausage," he says. "Then they make their own sausage using family recipes or whatever. At the end of the course we have a contest to see who has the best sausage according to a panel of judges."

I visited my friend Jim Glendenning who had just returned from a month long 26,000 mile trip around the world. He knows how to travel. His entire transportation bill was \$1,800. He walked to the train station in Alpine, took an overnight train

to Los Angeles where he boarded a plane for London. On his circle of the globe he made five stops along the way, then took the train back to Alpine and walked home.

The new managers at the Holland Hotel are Marcus and Nicole Van Winden, who met on a Holland-America cruise ship. He was a chef; she was cruise director. He is from Holland. It was only natural that they end up managing the Holland Hotel.

I went to Marfa and visited with Mayor Dan Dunlap. He told me about the new 4-story hotel being built downtown and a new 5 million dollar art installation due next year at Chinati. Lots of stuff going on in the mountain country along the border.

Tough Finish! Coyotes End Year in Semi's

It is tough beating the same quality opponent twice in one season on the high school gridiron.

Throw in five key turnovers and it proved to be a task the Borden County Coyotes could not accomplish.

Coach Trey Richey's Coyotes saw another banner season end in disappointment last Saturday at Abilene against Crowell, the same team that the Gail Gang defeated 58-48 to open the 2015 season.

This time Crowell downed the Coyotes, 68-40, in the Division I state six-man semi-final game.

The loss snapped the Coyotes' 13-game win streak and ended their season just one game short of the state title contest.

"No doubt, it's hard to beat somebody twice in the same season, but what impressed us the most was the way they completely sold out to stop our sweep. You could tell they wanted to force us to put the ball in the air," Coach Richey said.

That strategy apparently worked in Crowell's favor, as four of Coyotes' turnovers were a result of interceptions.

Just a few days earlier the Coyotes rolled up all 400 of their yards on the ground in their quarterfinal playoff win over Happy.

"I'm taking full responsibility for this one. We panicked a little in our play calling, especially after they kept stuffing us on the ground," Richey said.

"We had been working on some things just for this game, which we never got the chance to utilize. You've got to give Crowell a lot of credit. Their guys just seemed to play at a whole different energy level and I think a lot of it goes back to that game we played earlier against them."

The 11-3 Crowell Tigers are now 28-point favorites to capture their third state Division I six-man crown against Abbott this Saturday in Abilene.

Abbott won their state semi-final game, 53-8, over Zephyr.

"You could just tell that Crowell came out tonight feeling like they had something to prove. We were coming off

those two pretty big ball games (Valley and Happy), which might have taken a little life out of us," Richey said. "But, as much as this one hurts, right now we're still very proud of our guys. They gave us the same kind of effort that they'd been giving us all year.

"The good Lord always has a plan for everything. This just wasn't our night."

The Coyotes jumped out to an early 8-0 lead on a nine-yard touchdown pass from Hunter Jones to Trace Richey. Easton Edwards kicked the first of his five PAT's.

Crowell tied this game later in that first quarter after the Tigers' Danny Dela Pena scored from 15 yards out. Leonardo Gentile kicked the two-point PAT.

Crowell took the lead with 3:10 left in the first quarter on a six-yard scoring scamper by Daniel Clark. Gentile kicked the PAT.

Borden County tied the game at 16-all just 27 seconds later on a 70-yard touchdown pass from Hunter Jones to Corbin Sumners. Edwards booted the PAT.

Crowell re-gained the lead with nine seconds left in that plunge by Clark. Gentile's kick gave the Tigers a 24-16 edge.

The Coyotes again tied the game early in the second quarter after Trace Richey scored from 47 yards out. Edwards then kicked his third PAT.

Some 19 seconds later, Borden County went ahead 32-24 after a 57-yard sprint to the end zone by Hunter Jones. Edwards kicked the PAT.

Crowell made it 32-30 with 4:32 left in the second quarter on a 10-yard touchdown pass from Tristan Hayes to Tyler Durham.

The Tigers went back ahead in the final six seconds of the half on a seven-yard touchdown run by Daniel Clark. Gentile kicked the PAT to give Crowell a 38-32 halftime advantage.

A big third quarter helped Crowell pull away.

Hayes opened up the second half scoring with an 11-yard touchdown strike to Durham. Gentile's PAT made it 46-32. Hayes then connected with his

brother, Skyler Hayes, on a 37-yard touchdown strike with 5:50 to go in the third quarter. Some 41 seconds later, Hayes threw another touchdown pass to Durham from nine yards out. Another Gentile PAT extended the Tigers' lead to 62-32.

Borden County scored what turned out to be its final touchdown of the season with 3:34 left in the third quarter on a 37-yard pass from Trace Richey to Ben Justice. Edwards' kick made the score 62-40 at the end of the third quarter.

Crowell capped off the win with 1:12 left in the fourth quarter on a 37-yard touchdown strike from Hayes to Steven Perez.

"We're not about to let this one game define who these kids are. Probably the toughest part about this whole deal is not only knowing what kind of kids these guys are, but also the blood, sweat and tears that they put into this. It goes a lot farther back than in August," Richey said.

"A lot of preparation goes into one of these: all those countless hours out on that track as well as in that weight room. But this year still gave us a lot of great memories, which nobody will ever be able

to take away from us."

Tristan Hayes and Daniel Clark provided a solid one-two punch for Crowell.

Hayes completed 16 of 27 passes for 241 yards and five touchdowns.

Clark ran for 109 yards and three touchdowns on 16 carries.

Borden County's Corbin Sumners, a 2,000-yard running back each of his first three years in high school, ran for 127 yards on 15 carries. Sumners also had a 70-yard touchdown catch.

Hunter Jones ran for 74 yards and one touchdown on four carries, in addition to completing six of eight passes for 123 yards and two other scores. Trace Richey ran for 52 yards and one touchdown on five carries. Richey also threw a touchdown pass and hauled in a touchdown pass.

With all but three of these young men coming back next year, one cannot help but be excited about Borden County's future on the gridiron.

"Hopefully, we can get some things figured out to where, when we get to this point again, we'll be able to get to that next level," Richey said.

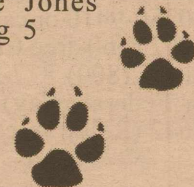
Ladies Take Win Against Crosbyton After Rocky Start

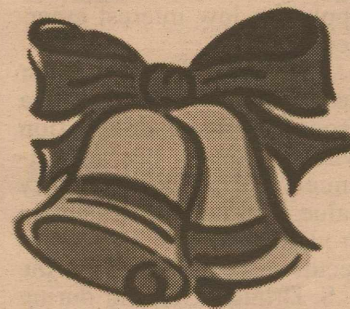

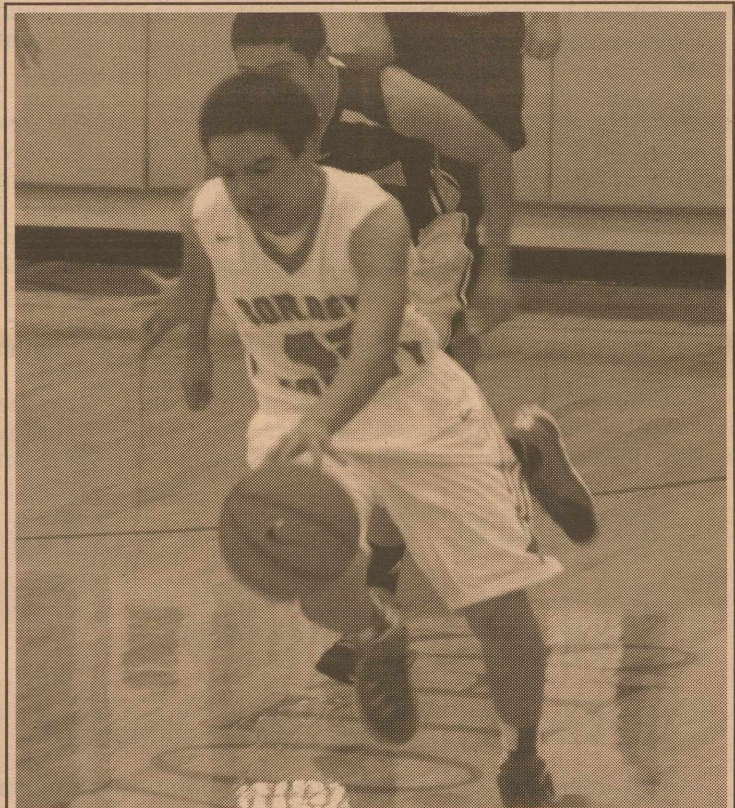
The Borden Junior Varsity team opened their season last Tuesday night against the Crosbyton Chiefs. The Chiefs would prevail with a 27-17 victory.

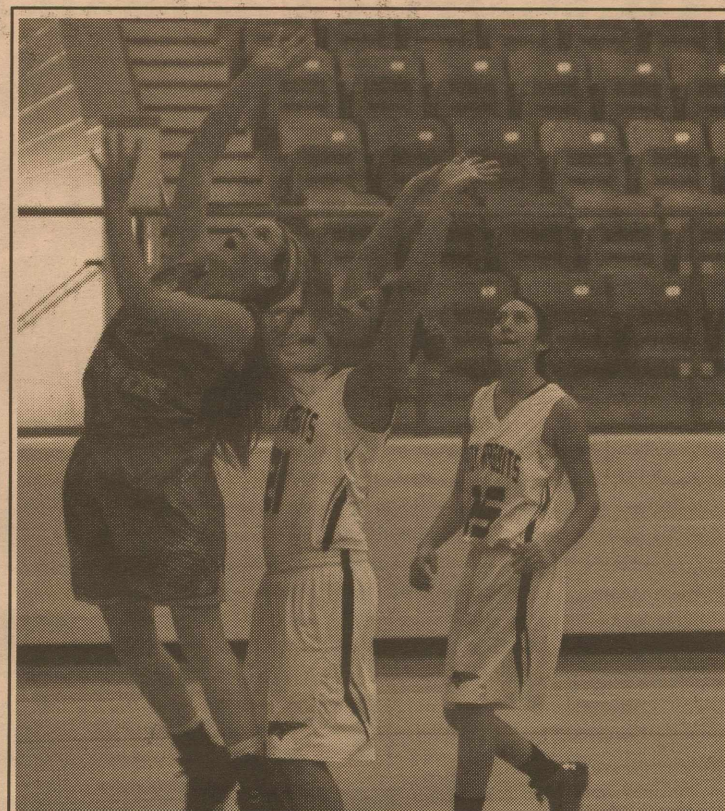

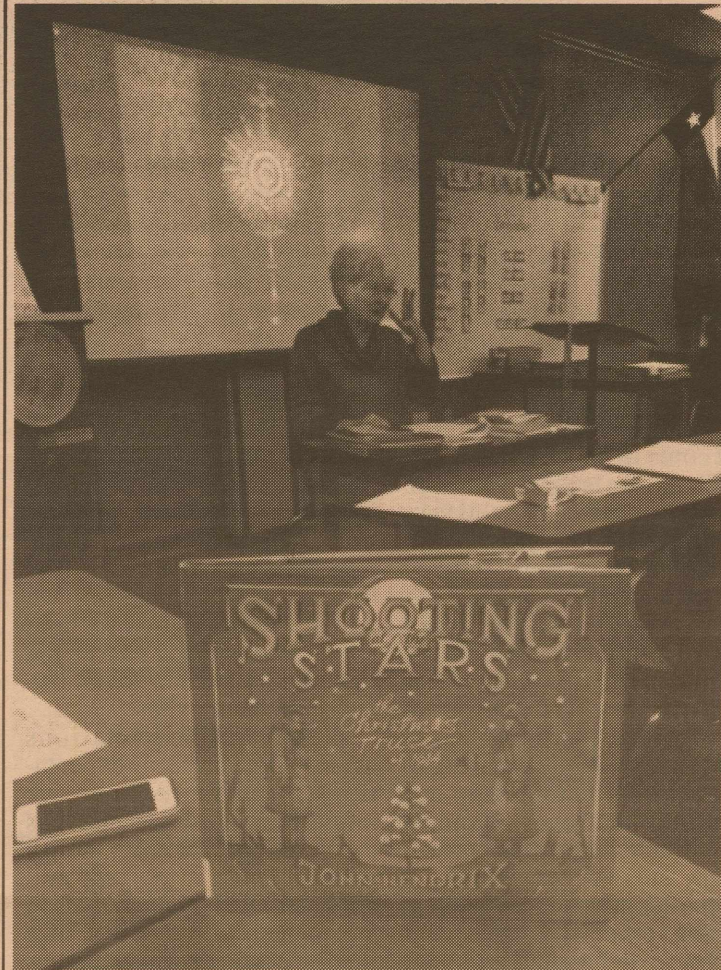

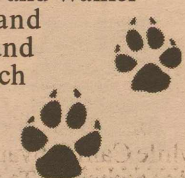
The Missy Coyotes travelled to Roby, Texas to play the Knox City Greyhounds last Monday.

The Gift of Simplicity

This last article for 2015 is going to be a little different than my usual fact based column.

One word that really does not come to mind when I think of Christmas is SIMPLE. Even though, in reality...it is all very simple, we wind up making it more complicated than it should be. This Christmas, I encourage you to give yourself and your family the gift of simplicity. Make this an everlasting gift that will resonate throughout the new year. I write this with myself in mind. I know I am not the only one out there that over commits, over thinks, over reacts, over plans, and over...everything! It is challenging to not keep it simple, especially when your career is demanding and your personality is not one to sit idly by. However, life is going by entirely too fast and lately I have only had two speeds - zoom and stop. When I am not busy zooming, all my body and mind can do is stop and do absolutely nothing. There needs to be a balance and a strolling speed for in between. I have researched the topic of simplifying and living more simply throughout the past couple of years, and here are a few take aways that I would like to share. Note that these are more challenging for the work world, but they can be applied there as well.

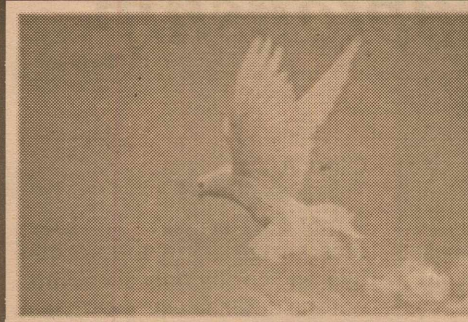

Dare to Live Without Limits

Understand Before Being Understood

Everyone wants to be understood. We experience frustration when we are not. In most interactions we would like to convey our thoughts, feelings, opinions, and beliefs. However, communication problems often arise because all parties involved are simultaneously striving to be understood, with no one seeking to understand.

This scenario happens even during courteous, polite discussions. So while one person is talking, the other is contemplating what to say next, rather than focusing on listening. The result is little or no meaningful interaction.

To understand before being understood requires you to first pay attention to what is being said. The goal is to hear the words as well as seeking to understand what the other person means. A full understanding requires an awareness of more than just the words being spoken. One has to observe body language, tone of voice, volume, and facial expressions.

This entails total focus on the other person. You want to observe all the details. Communication is much more than the words used. It's also how it's being said. If you are busy thinking about your own response, it's impossible to accurately perceive the other person.

Learning to concentrate on the other person, in order to understand what they are saying, takes practice. Start by monitoring your thoughts while you're listening. Chances are you'll be surprised by your lack of focus. The ultimate goal is to have all of your attention on the other person so you are really hearing rather than thinking. You can get there, but it will be a transition process from your current habits.

After listening, and before responding, ask questions to verify your understanding. By

so doing, you will demonstrate your concern. Additionally, you will immediately correct any misinterpretation. When someone feels you are interested in what they are saying, the chances for an effective interchange are substantially increased.

When you fully understand the other person, you are then in a position to respond appropriately. Only by recognizing what is being said, will you be able to reasonably decide what to say, and how to say it, in order to have yourself understood. If your response is based on a misunderstanding, any subsequent remarks you make will be ineffective.

Once you understand, what is the best approach to be understood? First of all, know what your objective is. What are you trying to accomplish? Your goal is to convey your thoughts in a manner that will enable you to accomplish your objective. Remain calm, speak clearly, and address your issues. When you are feeling angry or upset, your ability to think logically and act in your best interest will be diminished. Postpone any conversation until your emotions subside.

What you say should be in terms that the other person can relate to. Attack the problem not the person. Asking questions such as, "what would you do in my situation?" are very effective in getting the other person to understand you. Making insulting or derogatory statements will prevent you from achieving anything positive. Furthermore, they can make a situation worse, creating additional problems.

Communication is not a battle or contest. If no one is listening, there is no point in talking. At least one person must be trying to understand. Ideally it should be all involved. Arguing is not communicating. Arguing results in

an exacerbation of problems. Shouting is also pointless since it usually causes the other person to either shout back or walk away. Insulting or degrading comments are just as destructive.

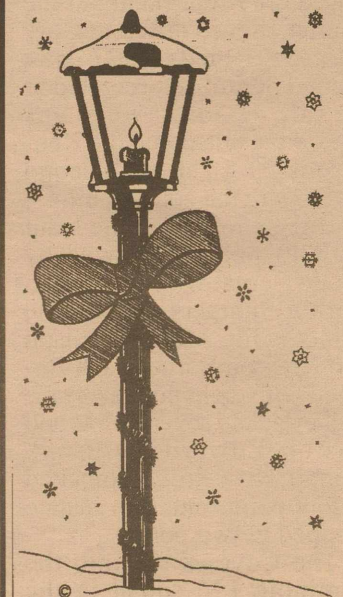
Once you understand, you are in a position to be better understood. Remember this principle and your interaction with others will be much more productive.

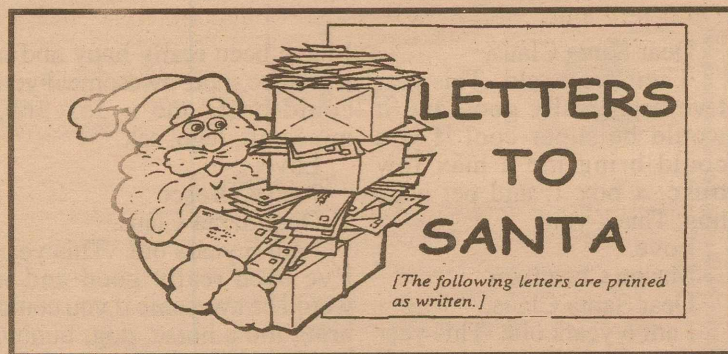

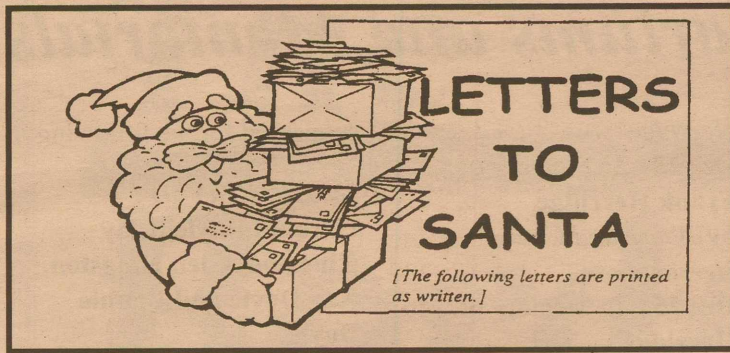
