Completion of another oil producer in the regular field five miles northeast of Cisco was announced last week by Otto Bendorf of Breckenridge as his No. 1 J. H. Reynolds, The well flowed from the Lake Sand at 3,377-86 feet.

Location was given as 1,183 feet from the north and 330 feet from the west lines of Section 50, Block 4, H&TC Survey. Hendorf has a 100acre lease on the Reynolds, and has completed several other wells in the same area



Absentee voting runs

through Nov. 5.

The Legislature this year approved placing before the voters six proposed changes to the Texas Constitution that has, to date, been amended 178 times.

Fourteen other amentments will be voted on Nov. 5, 1968. The changes being voted on this year range from a provision that would lump the country's money into one fund rather than four to an amendment that would permit the sale of \$75 million in bonds for development of new state

In each case on the short ballot, voters are asked to vote either "for" or "again-

He will serve a 3-year term beginning Oct. 1. Charles is actively engaged in agriculture and devotes all of his time toward production of crops and livestock.

Other County Committee members are R. G. Lyerla and Paul Norris.

Our thanks to Garland Garrett whose term expired and could not serve due to the fact he has accepted full time employment. Garland has served on the County Committee since 1962.

The County Committee positions as set up at the Convention will be R. G. Lyerla, Chairman; Charles Little, vice Chairman; and Paul Norris, regular member. Committee meetings are held regularly at 9 a. m. each Tuesday. Anyone may at tend the meetings.

We have been busy the last few days accepting requests for cost-shares on rye, vetch, and winter peas. These practices are widely used in the county due to the tremendous wind control problem in the sandy area.

Cost-shares are \$1.40 for rye, vetch, and peas following peanuts and \$2.75 per acre for vetch and peas on other cropland. The cost-share represents approximately 50 per cent of the average cost of carrying out the practice.
