

WELL NEAR COLORADO FLOW ING BIG AMOUNT SALT WATER

Colorado, Texas, Sept. 26 .- Badgiett No. 1 of the Mitchell County Oil Corporation, fourteen miles northwest of Colorado, which blew in a salt gusher Sunday afternoon, continues to produce 10,000 barrels of strong salt solution every twentyfour hours. The polution is very thick and is being thrown thirty-five to forty-five feet above the crown block. The roar of the well is heard more than a mile and is plainly seen six miles away. Fifteen acres of land surrounding the well and all the vicinity is covered with salt, resembling a huge snowstorm.

Oil men here claim the well is a mystery. It is the first of its kind known to local operators. The salt gusher was drilled in at 1,100 feet. It was producing strong gas at 1,-050 feet last week.


