Census Bureau Gives Report On This County's 1283 Farms

counted in Eastland County during the 1964 Census of Agriculture, the U.S. De-partment of Commerce's Bureau of the Census reports.

In the previous Census of Agriculture (1959), the total counted in the county was 1,347 farms.

The 1964 total is published in a preliminary report on the county just issued. The report also shows that average farm size in the county was 369.1 acres and that the value of the county's farms (land and buildings) in 1964

Other important county statistics in the report are: 1. Value of all farm products sold by farms in the county in 1964, \$5,163,679; in 1959, \$5,643,698,

2. Value of all crops sold by county farms in 1964 was \$1,550,976; in 1959, \$1,692,431. 3. Value of all lives tock and livestock products sold

by county farms in 1964 was \$3,597,537; in 1959, \$3,951,212. Information obtained for the first time in an agricultural census included the amount of income received by the county's farm q's \$15,166 from recreational services as well as data on the use of pest control chem-

A Census of Agriculture is taken every 5 years in years ending in "4" and "9" to gather informational data on the nation's agricultura l resour ces and production. The data are needed to make decisions affecting many segments of the U.S. economy. The 1964 farm census was the 18th in a series that began in 1840.

The preliminary report for the county contains more than 500 facts about agriculture in the county. Among additional facts it contains are the number of farms by size, type, and economic class; the number of school years completed; land in farms by use and by land-use practices; data on equipm ent and facilities; farm expenditures, number of hired workers; and number of farms reporting poultry and livestock product ion and those reporting crop production by acres and quantities as well as sales.

Screwworm Cases On Increase In State Agent Says

De Gordon, Eastland County Agent, has recently had word from the Screwworm Eradication officials that there has been a very noticeable increase in the number of confirmed screwworm cases in Texas. Gordon says that for the week of Scptember 18 there were 48 confirmed cases reported in Texas from 22 different counties. This is more confirmed cases for a one - week period than has cases and collect specime n

been reported since the last week in November, 1963. All livestock producers are urged to be especially watchful of possible screwworm cases and collect specime n worm samples and mail to the Screwworm Eradicat i on Laboratory in Mission, Tex-

Gordon says vials for submitting specimens to the Mission Laboratory can be obtained at the County Agent's office in the Eastland County Courthouse.

Weather conditions over much of the State have been a contributing factor in the recent screwworm buildup.

"Schoolhouse of raw h i de lumber was built in 1882. Had seats of split logs. Pupils numbered 55. School grounds drew crowds of 8,000 for political rallies and camp meetings.


