County Judge Scott Bailey has officially proclaimed July 24-30, 1966, as FARM SAFETY WEEK in Eastland County, according to Jack Cozart, president of the county Farm Bureau. The local farm organization is coordinating activities for the special farm safety campaign.

President Johnson and Governor Connally have previously designated that week on national and state levels as a period to call attention to worthwhile safety practices that can reduce disabling injuries and death.

The county farm leader said that the accidental death rate for farm residents has increased since 1961. "Your efforts are vital if this trend is to be reversed, and needless suffering and losses substantially reduced," Mr. Cozart continued. He emphasized that farming remains one of the most hazardous occupations in America today.

In his official proclamation, County Judge Bailey said: "All the citizens of Eastland County are deeply concerned about the safety and well-being of farm families from whom we receive our abundance of food and other essential agricultural commodities."

## Eastland County 4-H Dress Revue Set In Eastland Friday Night

Would you like to see a rainbow of 4-H fashions? If so, you are invited to attend the Eastland County 4-H Dress Revue Friday, July 22, beginning at 8 p. m. in the basement of the First Baptist Church, Eastland.

This revue is an achievement event for students who are entering clothing projects, according to Miss Wanda Watson, assistant county home demonstration agent.

The girls will model clothing made by themselves. Judges will arrive at a decision by judging the girl, her posture, poise, grooming and attitude, the garment on the girl, general appearance, neatness, suitability of fabric, style, color and fit of the garment, accessories, chosen construction of the garment and the Dress Revue Record Book, Miss Watson said.

There will be three divisions in the event, the Sub-Junior Division (ages nine to 12), the Junior Division (ages 12 to 14) and the Senior Division (ages 14 to 19).

Winners of the junior and senior divisions will compete

Held on Sept. 3, 1967 at the Lake Cisco Park.

County Farm Bureau President Jack Cozart said that a different phase of safety would be emphasized each day during the week: Sunday—reverence for life; Monday—safety begins at home; Tuesday—Agricultural chemicals; Wednesday—prevent falls; Thursday—rural highway safety; Friday—farm machinery; Saturday—recreation safe.

### Two Area Cows Achieve Record Milk Production

Among the cattle herds in the surrounding area, two cows owned by Billy S. Bradley of F... have been credited with recently completed lactations under official production testing rules of Holstein-Friesian Association of America. These registered Holsteins and their actual performance records are: Daisy Iva-Nan Burk 4793537, a five-year-old who produced 18,810 pounds of

milk and 663 pounds of butter fat in 305 days and Top O Tex O Tina Mystery 5158531, a four-year-old who produced 16,410 pounds of milk and 612 pounds of butter fat in 298 days.

These new production figures may be compared to the estimated annual output of 7,000 pounds of milk and 235 pounds of butter fat by the average United States dairy cow, notes the national Holstein Association.

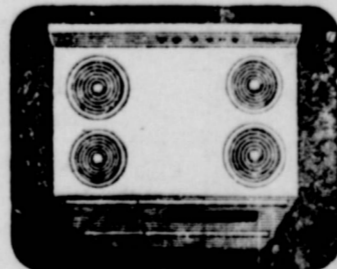
