County Judge Scott Bailey has officially proclaimed July 24-30, 1966, as FARM SAFE-TY WEEK in Eastland County, according to Jack Cozart, president of the county Farm Bureau. The local farm organization is coordinating activities for the special farm safety campaign.

President Johnson and Governor Connally have previously designated that week on mational and state levels as a period to call attention to worthwhile safety practices that can reduce disabling injuries and death.

The county farm leader said that the accidental death rate for farm residents has increased since 1961. "Your efforts are vital if this trend is to be reversed, and needles suffering and losses substantally reduced," Mr. Cozart continuied. He emphasized that farming remains one of the most hazardous occupations in America today.

In his official proclamation, County Judge Bailey said: "All the citizens of Eastland County are deeply concerned about the safety and wellbeing of farm familes from whom we receive our abundance of food and other essential agricultural commodities. "Farm and ranch accidents reap a grim harvest of approximately 150 fatalities and thousands more suffer painful disabling injuries each year in Texas, plus the great economic loss, causes profound physical and psychological damage suffered by members of farm families that are involved."

During this special week, a statewide farm accident prevention education program will be undertaken by the Texas Farm Bureau, the Texas Farm and Ranch Safety Council, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, 4-H Clubs, the Texas Safety Association, Future Farmers and Future Homemakers of America, Young Farmers of Texas and the Eastland County Farm bureau, with the theme "Safety is Victory Over Accidents".

County Farm Bureau President Jack Cozart said that a different phase of safety would be emphized each day during the week: Sunday—reverance for life; Monday—safety begins at home, Tuesday—Agricultural chemicals; Wednesday—prevent falls; Thursday—rural highway safety; Friday—farm machinery; Saturday—recreation safe.




