Passenger plates begin with DJS-475, running through DKD-649; Commercial, 1Y-460 through 1Y-6949; Farm Trucks, 8K-500 through 8K-1924; and small type trailers, 8-73125 through 8-73284.

There were 9,083 passenger plates received; 2,350, truck; 1,425, farm tags; 700, small trailer tags; 90, truck tractor plates; 130, special trailer; 50, house trailer; and 60 motorcycle.

Again, you are urged to keep in mind that April 1 is the day that all new tags must be on "all" vehicles.

CJC Gets Loan Of \$146,000 For Art Bldg.

Cisco Junior College has received a \$146,000 loan from the U.S. Office of Education to help finance construction of a new fine arts building, according to a telegram from Congressman Omar Burleson. The remainder of the \$396,

946 needed for construction will be provided by a Federal grant of \$156,946 already given to the college and issuance of \$100,000 in revenue bonds. Grady C. Hogue, president of CJC, said the college expects to call for bids on the building sometime this spring. The structure, which will house administrative offices, class rooms, an auditorium and other space, will be located south of the Science Building.

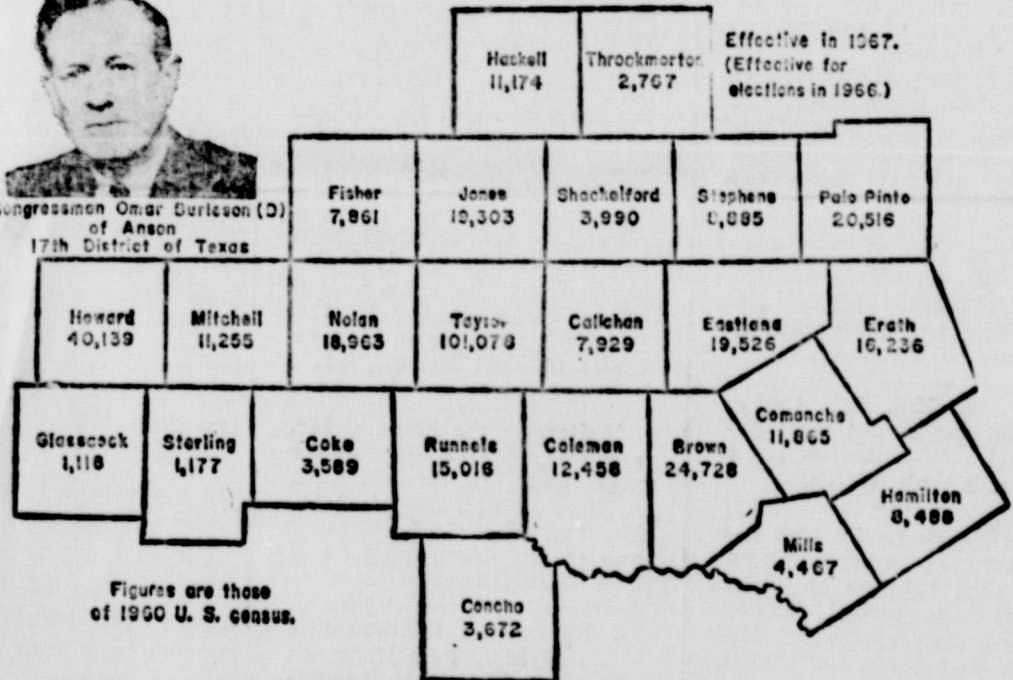

SHEEP FLOCK INSPECTION BEGINS THURSDAY IN COUNTY

Bill McCutchen, Assistant County Agent, has announced that the Texas Animal Health Commission assisted by the Animal Health Division of the United States Department of Agriculture will launch an extensive inspection of all sheep flocks in Eastland County, Thursday, Feb. 10, 1966. All inspections are under the supervision of Dr. James B. Henderson, area veterinarian, and will be conducted in Eastland County by Don Boaz, and Douglas Fry.

As a result of two outbreaks of sheep scabies within the last year other states have imposed dipping requirements that hamper the marketing of Texas sheep. Relinquishing of these requirements will be considered upon an inspection of all flocks without evidence of scabies being found. Industry cooperation is needed so that the necessary inspections may be conducted in an organized manner with a mini-

mum of inconvenience to the sheep producer.

The County Chairman of the Southwest Animal Health Research Foundation and the Agricultural Extensive Service through the local County Agent are assisting in the cooperative effort.

Sold at Eastland auction last Tuesday were 480 head of cattle, 149 hogs and 18 sheep and goats. There were 148 consignors and 68 buyers.

Prices were reported as follows: butcher bulls, 19 to 22.50; stocker bulls, 22 to 26.90; butcher cows, 17 to 20.40; stocker cows, 14 to 21.50; canners and cutters, 13 to 19; butcher calves, 22 to 26.40; stocker calves (light choice), 25 to 31.60; stocker calves (heavy choice), 23 to 28.50; pairs of cows and calves, 140 to 230; butcher hogs, 27.50 to 29.30; sows, 24 to 27; packer goats, three head sold for 3; and stocker goats, 4 to 7 per head.
