| Texas for the drouth striken districts <br> on the usual terms." <br> This is the text of a telegram received today by Ralph. Soape, secreSenator Morris Sheppard and which was read in the senate today. <br> The senate today has under consideration the house statutory prohibition bill. The bill will be passed finally during the afternoon session. Several amendments "were adopted, one providing that any beverage containing as much as one-half of one per cent alcohol shall be considered intoxicating liquor and is prohibited. Another amendemnt adds a fine of $\$ 1,000$ to $\$ 5,000$ for the violation of the act, in addition to making it a felony as provided in the house bill. <br> Senator Suiter wanted to have adepted an amendment which empowered the sheriff to confiscate railroads, nutomobiles and other carriages that carried intoxicating liquor into Texas. <br> Austin, March 14.-Attorney Genaral Looney today held thrit the senmile military zone bill as passed by the legislature applies to all aviator landing fields that are located at different places over the state, whether or not the sale and traffic in intoxicating liquors is prohibited within ten milies'surroundimg the lawling fiedds. <br> It was also held by tke attorney general today that the provision of the ten-mile zone bill would probibit the traffic in liquors by social clebs, several hundred of which are scattered throughout the state and some within the zone territory. <br> Austin, Texas, March 13.-Unëer suspension of the constitutional rufe, the House today passed by a vote of 84 to 34 the House bill by Metcaffe providing for women suffrage. <br> The bill as passed in the House allows women to vote in all primary elections and in nomirating conventions. <br> The Senate today by a vote of 18 to 9 passed finally the House statutory prohibition bill, the vote being practically the same as on the third reading in the Senate last afteracon. The bill now goes to the House for concurrence in the Senate amendments. <br> Austin, Texas, March 16.-In the house this afternoon was passed finally by vote of 99 to 2 the MeNealusAlderdice senate bill providing for the creation of reclamation and drainage districts. Any person who shail, within the State, publicly or privately mutilate, deface, defile, defy, tramp upon, or cause contempt upon, either by words or acts, any flag, standard, color, or ensign of the United States or that of any of its officers or on an yimitation of eithe rof them, shall be deemed guilty of a felony, and shall be punished by confinement in the State penitentiary for any period of time mot less than two years, nor more than twenty-five years. <br> The House passed finally the bill providing that telephone companies shall make only 8 per cent profit on the canital invested, It also passed the Thomason bill prohibiting any person to assist another in prepara tion of his ballot. <br> PRIMARY BILL PASSES IN HOUSE LATE MONDAY <br> Austin, March 18.-The DeBogory majority primary election bill today out the pasced by the house with providing for - majorit momination in primaries for state and district of name of James E. For the smaller counties $\$ 4$ per day is fixed as the salary. <br> WOMAN VOTING BILL PASS. <br> ES TO THIRD READING <br> Austin, March 20.-The house bill giving women the right to vote in the primaries and nominating coaventions was today passed to third reading by the senate ofter having been ameaded so as to provide that women shah jay poli tax after 1918. <br> The senate also finally passed the house primary bili by a vote of 21 to 3 after heated debate over an amedment providing that alien enemies and perse.ss who may be otherwise legally disqualified shall be prevented 1 rom having their names placed on the primary ballot. This injected the name of James E. Ferguson into the discusslon. The amendment, however, was finally adopted, 20 to 7. <br> The house pased finally today the senate state depository bill which provides for depositing of state funds in ad banks in the state bidding for such funds. <br> there was passed to third reading in the house the senate bill increasing the salaries of county school supcrintendents. <br> 'The woman suffrage bill was debated during the entire morning session of the senate and when recess was taken the measure was still under consideration. An amendment to provide separate booths for womea was voted down as wals also an amednment providing that any qualified elector may institute suit $t$ otest the law and that such suit would be given preference over others. An amendment was adopted providing taht election judges shall stamp the word "woman" on all ballots given to women to vote. In this it was explained a cheek would be kept on the number of women votes. <br> A DRASTIC LAW <br> House bill No. 13 is to prohibit the gift, sale or delivery to any person in the military or naval forces of the United States, or of any of the allies of the United States in the war with Germany or any spiritous, vinous or malt liquors or medicated bitters capable of producing intoxication. It has been paszed finally by both house and senate wilh the emergency clause attached and becomes effective at once. This is the text of the law: <br> Section 1. This is one of the laws which was recommended by the governor. <br> JUDGE HIGGINS OF SNYDER <br> WAS SHOT IN BACK <br> Judge C. C. Higgins, whose home is at Snyder, was shot in the back while in the lobby of a hotel at Clairemont Sunday night, where he was transacting legal business, and is not expected to live-according to word received here last night. <br> Judge Higgins was carried to Spur and was operated on. Some of the bullets from a shotgun entered his stomach, it was said. <br> Judge Higgins is aid to have been sitting betwee.. Dis ict Judge John b. Thomas of Anson and another man at the time. The shot came from outside the room, tirough a window from an unknown assailant. Judge Higgins is prominent over the West and well known in Colorado. <br> March 19.-It was reported Tuesdpy afternoon that an arrest had been made about noon at or near Post City in the Higgins case. <br> Silas 3estick is said to have been placed under arrest by Sheriff Goodall of Kent county and is being held by the officers. <br> Jayton, March 19.-Judge Cullon C. Higgins, who was shot by an unknown assailant at Clairemont Sunday night, died at 12:20 this afternoon at the sanitarium at Spur, where he was taken following the shooting. <br> Judge Higgins was operated on at Spur at 2 p. m. Monday and several of the bullets extracted. He rallied from the operation and spent a fair night Monday and was still conscious Tuesday morning. He gradually grew weaker, however, and passed away shortly after ncon. <br> Judge Higgins was widely known in this section of the state. <br> The body was shipped to Snyder ard burried with Masonic honors there Wednesday evening.
