Ford Engine Is Given CJC For Student Study

Through the Ford Motor Company's automotive equipment donation program, Graham Motor Co. of Cisco has obtained a 1966 Ford engine for Cisco Junior College for instructional uses in the auto mechanics course, according to L. E. Jenkins, director of the college's technical-vocational division.

Charles Graham of Graham Motor Co. said that formal presentation of the engine to CJC will be made by two Ford Co. representatives at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Oct. 12.

The motor, an eight cylinder with both automatic and standard transmissions, is the fourth the college has for instructional use. The other three are a Chrysler Industrial 56, a General Motors 4-71 and an International.

This fall's auto mechanics class has an enrollment of 28,

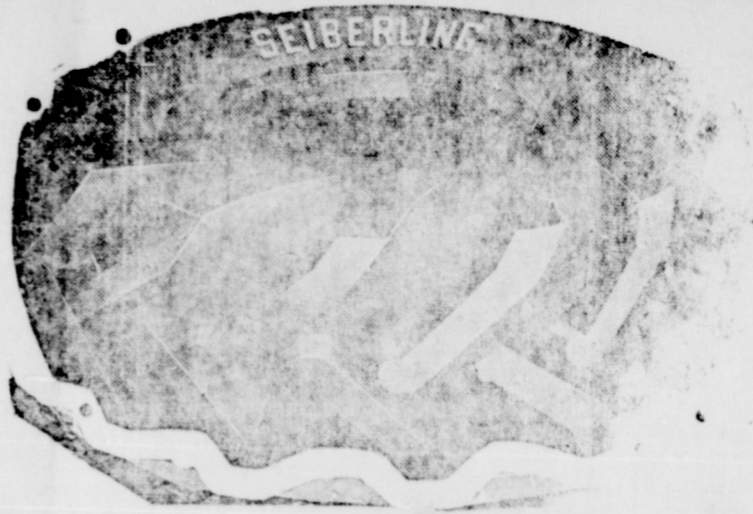
