Selective Service Warns Draftables

Draft-age men who destroy their "draft cards" can get their inductions into the armed forces speeded up, under the provisions of a new official bulletin to Texas draft boards, according to Col. Morris S. Schwartz, state Selective Service director.

Issued as a result of Public Law 89-152, the bulletin refers to legislation signed by President Johnson in August which makes it a criminal offense to "knowingly mutilate or destroy a registration certificate or any other certificate" issued in official connection with the draft law or regulations.

Violators of the new law are subject to punishment by imprisonment up to five years or fine up to \$10,000, or both, upon prosecution and conviction.

PECAN ORCHARDS JUDGED EXCELLENT ON FIELD DAY

Approximately 100 pecan growers and other interested persons from Eastland and all surrounding counties made

the annual tour of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association last Friday, reported to be one of the best tours ever conducted.

Prospects for the pecan harvest appeared to be excellent, with clusters averaging six to seven pecans, and some as many as 13. Orchards visited prior to lunch were the Lynn Daniels, Doss Alexander M. H. Montford, and Weldon Fenter. The Carl Taylor and C. E. Smith orchards were toured following lunch and a business session.

A huge tree in the Smith orchard attracted considerable attention, and a pot was made up with tourists guessing the number of pecans that will be yielded.

Results of demonstrations from using the new insecticide — Di-Syston — in the soil beneath the trees were reported to be excellent, according to an agriculture specialist from College Station who was present on the tour. Di-Syston prevents yellow aphids and the resulting honey dew.

Applications Begin Taken for Winter Cover

Applications are now being accepted for federal cost-share on practice D-1 winter legumes and practice F-1-A rye cover, it has been announced by Jesse Meredith, county ASCS office manager.

The purpose of the cover-crop practice is to establish a winter cover in the fall to protect the land from wind and water erosion during winter months, Meredith said. Grazing consistent with good management is permitted but harvesting in any manner is not permitted.

In order to be eligible for cost-share, you must file a written request before starting the practice. You should also file your request before purchase of seed or fertilizer so that you may be sure to purchase the correct requirements.

Peanut marketing cards for 1965 have been prepared and

are ready for issuance, stated Meredith. Cards may be obtained at the ASCS office or will be mailed to those requesting them. The card must be returned to the office after marketing is completed in order to avoid reduction in future allotments.

Farms with excess peanuts may receive a quota card after proper disposition of excess or after filing form MQ-92, agreeing to leave excess in the ground or hog off the excess acreage.

Farms with excess acreage should pay particular attention to the regulations governing disposition of excess acreage and contact the ASCS office if questions arise.

Notified by the local Selective Service Board to report Oct. 19 for physical examinations were 20 Eastland County men, according to Mrs. Jewell Reaves, secretary. Inductions for Oct. 19 are six.

In the future, draft boards will not be as liberal in granting deferments for college and university study as in the past few years, it has been announced by Colonel Morris Schwartz, state Selective Service director.

State draft headquarters normally will not recommend the deferment of any student carrying less than a load of nine semester hours, said Schwartz.

"If the student deferred on the basis of a nine-hour load doesn't go to school in the summer, we will recommend termination of his deferment. He must make normal progress toward his four-year degree in four successive calendar years, or his five-year degree in five, if he expects to continue to earn a recommendation for deferment from us," stated Schwartz.

Eastland County this week became the 163rd in the state to organize a committee for the study of aging in cooperation with the governor's present program on aging.

Meeting Tuesday evening, the specially-named committee heard Mrs. John H. Davis Jr. of Abilene, a member of the Governor's Committee on

the Aging, and Allen Skidmore, a state health specialist, discuss the problems of programs of help.

Those serving on the aging committee will be a part of the County's Program Building Committee, chaired by John Love of the Chaney Community. Direction and assistance will be provided by the

county extension service as a part of the state-wide cooperation between the governor's committee and the state extension service.

County Agent J. M. Cooper and County Demonstration Agent Beverly Nicholson arranged the Tuesday night meeting.

The group will study the problems of aging in this county and attempt to initiate programs of help.

There are presently some 1,362 persons in the county receiving old - age assistance from the state, Skidmore said. The average rate is \$59.89 per month and this doesn't amount to much money he said, as he explained that areas to be considered by the study are financing, housing and physical and mental health needs.

Mrs. Davis, a woman of some 65 years, came to Eastland by bus, to speak to the group, and explain the needs of the aged.

Aging Group Has First Meeting

The Study Committee on Aging met Tuesday at 7:30 p. m. in the Commissioners Court Room and elected the following officers: H. V. O'Brien, chairman; Rev. McDonald of Rising Star, vice chairman; and Mrs. Lee White, also of Rising Star, secretary.

The Committee's aim is to gather information from ministers, federal agencies, and so forth to learn about problems concerning the aging, persons 65 years old and older. This information will be compiled and presented to the County Program Builder's Committee, which will determine as to whether a committee should be organized concerning the matter.

The housing, financial and recreational status is what is being studied by the committee for aging.
