Peanut Growers Assn. To Have Annual Meet Aug. 18

The Annual Meeting of the Southwestern Peanut Growers' Association will be held August 18 in the Student Center on the campus of Tarleton State College in Stephenville, according to an announcement by Ross Wilson, manager of the association.

An attendance of three to four hundred persons, including growers from all peanut producing areas of Texas and Oklahoma, is predicted by officials. Mr. Wilson will begin the day's activities at 9 a. m. by reporting to members on the work of the association during 1964-65.

Remainder of the morning session will be devoted to reports by research personnel of Texas A&M University and Oklahoma State University on

the latest research findings relative to peanut production, harvesting and curing. After lunch, Dr. George W. "Pete" Donaldson, Executive Secretary of the Georgia Agricultural Commodities Authority for Peanuts, will explain the functions and purposes of his organization with special emphasis on their promotional activities.

The program will again include the awarding of door prizes, a feature which has proved popular in recent years. Mr. Wilson announced that a new feature, the awarding of memberships to growers who have qualified for the Southwest Peanut Pacesetter Club, will be added to the program this year. This will be a regular part of the program in future annual meetings.

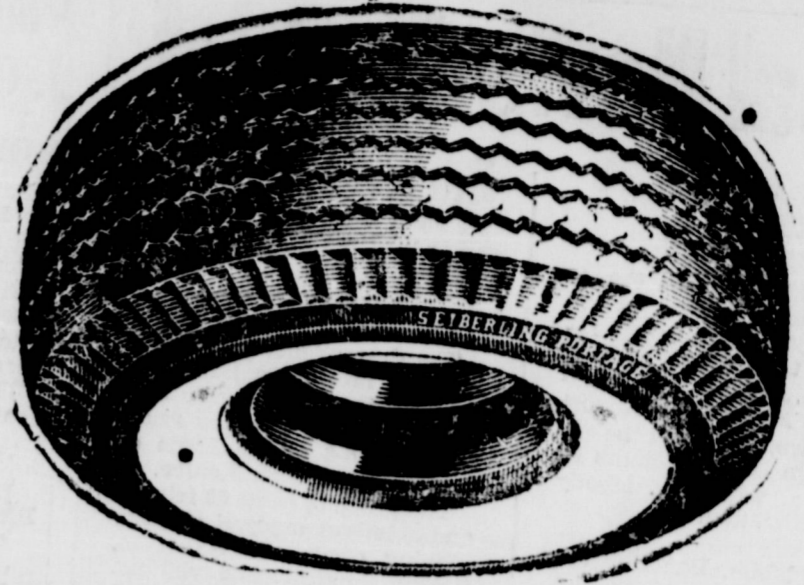

3 Inductions, 15 To Be Examined In August

Called for induction on Aug. 5 were three Eastland County men, according to Mrs. Jewell Reaves, clerk at the local Selective Service Board No. 35. Receiving calls to take their physicals were 15 men.

Texas draft boards will be inducting a considerable number of 19 year-olds by fall if draft calls remain high, it was announced last week by Colonel Morris S. Schwartz, state Selective Service director. Those inducted in August included mostly 21-year-olds; however men examined in September for future induction will consist mostly of 20-year-olds.

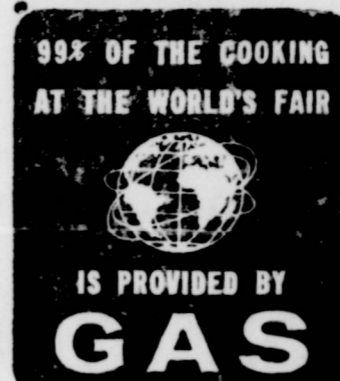
The statement made by Schwartz followed receipt of an amended September quota for Texas of 1,459 men and an estimated October call of 1,780. Recent monthly quotas have been around 700 to 900.

Increased attention upon the classification of college students has resulted from the declining age of involuntary induction during recent months.

Local boards have been instructed to mail current information questionnaires to all married men 19 to 26 years old who have no children, except in cases where current information is in files.

"Men who have children or hardship conditions will be de-

ferred formally, those who have wives alone will continue to be passed over for the draft for the time being; but those not living with their wives, or wives and children in a bona fide family relationship will be subject to the draft at once," Schwartz said.

Three Meetings Slated In Brucellosis Testing

A series of three livestock meetings will be held in the county next week to explain the Brucellosis retesting program, now underway, according to word today from the County agent's office.

The first meeting will be held at Eastland at the high school auditorium Tuesday night, August 10, it was said. The second one will be on Wednesday night, August 11 and will be held in the con-

ference room of the First National Bank in Cisco. The Thursday night, August 12th meeting will be held in the agricultural building across the street from the high school in Rising Star. All meetings will start at 8 p.m.

It was anticipated that others will be held in September.

July Rain-Fall:



Rain gauges may be dry-rotting in Eastland County, but it's pretty good cinch they aren't rusting from use — judging from the official rain tabulation for the month of July.

Total for the month is exactly zero: null, void, nothing, according to Official Weather Observer James Smith of Eastland.

Temperatures were 100 degrees or better on 14 days during July.

Traces were reported at several points throughout the county, including up to some three-quarters of an inch near

are now being retested by officials of the Texas Animal Health Commission. Buddy Henderson, Stephenville, is in charge of the testing.

As soon as the testing of these herds is completed, a percent of all other herds are to be retested in order for the county to be recertified.

There is no charge for the testing. One objective of the testing program is the elimination of the Brucellosis germ, that causes undulant fever in humans. This is one of the few diseases transmitted from cattle to man.

Gorman late in the month, but the official records will show "0" for the county for the month.

It's been quite a while since there wasn't any at all to measure — way back to November of 1949, in fact. Average-wise July isn't considered a wet month, but there has for the past 50 years, been at least some to record during the month. Average is .69 of an inch.

Total rainfall for the first seven months is the same as for the first six — 15.60 inches, which is ahead of the average of 14.54 inches through July, thanks to heavy rains in January, February, and May.

During a seven-day period, from the 8th through the 14th, temperatures were 100 or above, with 102 being high for the month.

If you found Saturday night last, cooler, you were right, it was lowest temperature for the month at 57 degrees.

Prospects for August? Well it isn't considered a wet month either, although the average is 5.83 inches. August, 1961, was low at .05 of an inch.

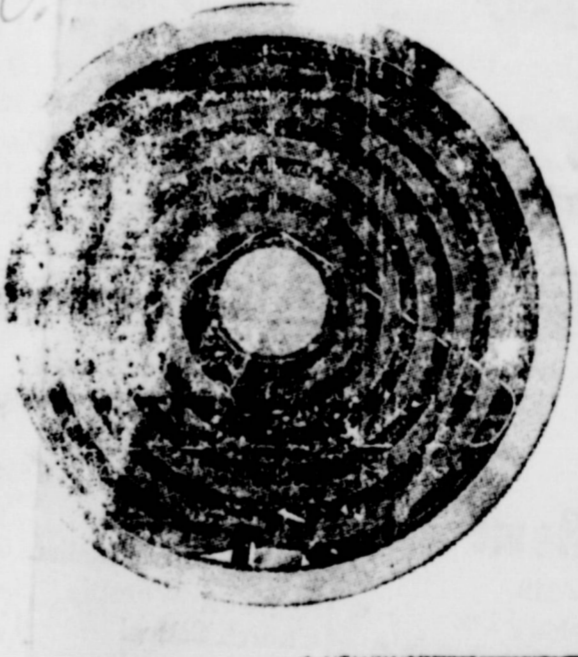

Sheep And Goat Raisers To Hold District Meet

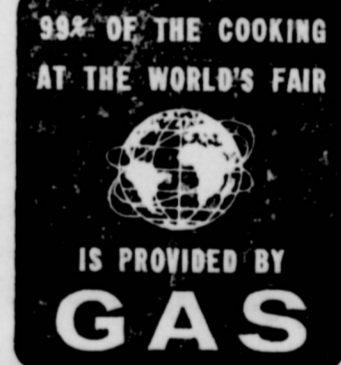

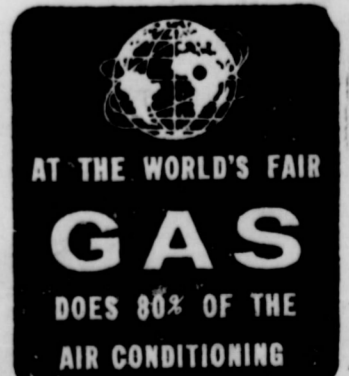
