Late Sgt. Tyrone Cited For Valor

Placed in the Congressional record in Washington recently was the story of S. Sgt. Willie D. Tyrone's heroism just before he was killed in Viet Nam, May 30. The story was placed on record by Sen. Robert F. Kennedy.

After being wounded and his battalion becoming low on ammunition in the Viet Nam war-torn country, Sgt. Tyrone sent a message for help, however when helicopters arrived with ammunition for the battalion and to rescue Tyrone, he waved them off because the Viet Cong were too close.

Every ranger in the battalion was killed within a few hours, when the Viet Cong attacked.

"Tyrone died because he refused to endanger the lives of others who tried to rescue him after a battle against the Viet Cong," according to a story appearing in the New York Journal American.

Sgt. Tyrone was the son of Mr. and Mrs. H. A. Tyrone of Route 1, Carbon, and his widow and 2 daughters live in Abilene.

The Little League team continues to win over Gorman, losing only 1 game this season.

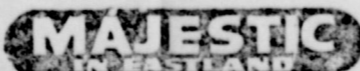
The Teenage team defeated the Greenbacks of Eastland here last Thursday night and play the Ranger Hawks there tonight, (Thurs.)

13,271 Vehicles Pass Here Daily, Contractor Says

An average of 13,271 vehicles pass through Ranger every day on U.S. Highway 80, according to M. O. McDowell, superintendent of the highway construction firm of Cooper and Woodruff, who emphasized the importance of the highway to the city's economy.

"And there's an average yearly increase of some seven percent," McDowell, a veteran highway builder, said.

Complimenting the Texas Highway Department and particularly the area engineering office, Mr. McDowell explained how highway building procedures have changed in the past few years. "It used to be an under-the-table operation," he said, "but no more. Texas has the most efficient highway department in the nation. There are no irregularities."

He carefully explained the

procedure whereby companies such as his are awarded contracts, pointing out the various requirements, including experience records, financial ability, presentation of a check for five per cent of the job's cost, performance bonds and having the low bid.

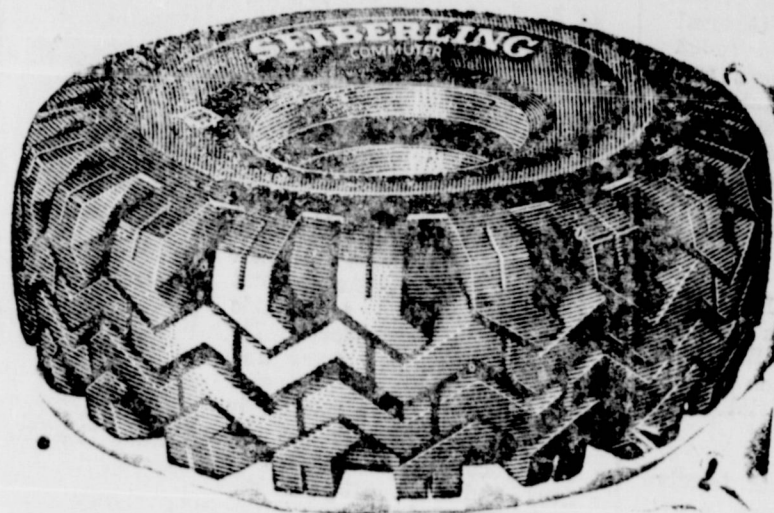

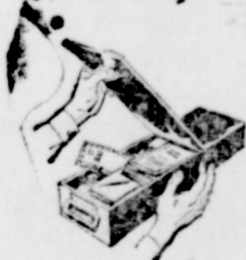

Browsing With Bev

The term "delayed cure" may sound like a health fad, but it actually refers to a new textile process which represents happy news for the family wardrobe.

Wash-wears finished by this technique have an exceptional ability to retain their shape during wear and after laundering.

Durable creases and pleats can be set in to last the life of the garment, even after repeated washing.

Slacks, trousers and work pants were the first cotton garments to be made by this new process. Sport shirts, blouses, and dresses are expected on the market this spring, and all-cotton suits are now being developed for

men. At present, most of the fabrics used are a blend of cotton with either nylon or polyester fiber.

The finish requires two steps. First, the fabric is treated with thermosetting resin and goes to the manufacturer to be made into garments—including sharp creases or pleats, if desired.

Then the finished garments are placed in a high-temperature oven to "cure" the finish by heat. This permanently "sets" the shape of the entire garment. It also reduces the problem of subsequent seam pucker and eliminates the need for touch-up ironing.

Certain wools are also being treated by a chemical process with a delayed setting similar to that used for cottons and cotton blends. Creases or pleats are made in finished woolen garments, and the setting takes place in a subsequent step — again assuring the durable sharpness so important to a pleated fashion.

1 Killed, 5 Hurt In May Traffic

During the month of May, the Texas Department of Public Safety reported one fatal accident in Eastland County, five personal injury accidents, and five accidents resulting in property damage, making a total of 11 accidents. There was one death, ten persons injured and a property damage total of \$16,770.

The following was reported by the Dept. in comparing traffic accidents in the Eastland area for the first five months of 1965 with the same period in 1964.

In 1965 there were two fatal accidents, in 1964, three; personal injury accidents in 1965, 20—in '64, 25; and property damage accidents, 47 in 1965 and 54 in '64, which brought the total to 69 in 1965 and 32 in '64. There were three deaths in 1965 and three in '64; injured persons, 33 in 1965 and 36 in '64; and property damage, in 1965—\$48,550 and in '64—\$41,444.

Largest Cattle Deal Reported

Raymond DeBusk, Cross Plains livestock buyer, and Jim Nail Albany rancher, have closed one of the largest cattle deals reported here in recent years.

DeBusk entered into a contract last week to purchase more than 1,500 head of calves and yearlings from the Nail ranch. Delivery will be at intervals between now and Sept. 10. When completed the deal will run between \$150,000 and \$175,000.

DeBusk has bought the Nail calves for the last five years purchasing them for the account of Weil Land & Cattle Company of Lexington Ky.

"I've been buying cattle 37 years," DeBusk said, "but the deal with Jim Nail is the largest in which I've ever been involved with a single seller."

Election Draws Large Turnout

The voters of Precinct Four, Eastland County, opposed the formation of a Cisco Hospital District with a supporting tax by more than a 3-to-1 margin in an election Saturday. The vote was 269 for the district and 868 against the proposition.

A total of 1,137 votes were cast in the two boxes — 1,104 at the city hall in Cisco and 33 at the community center in Scranton. Results were as follows:
