Okayed Highway Work Includes Kokomo Road

The Texas Highway Commission this week has approved work on 50 miles of Farm-to-Market Roads in District 23, including the Kokomo road in Eastland County. From Loop 389 in Carbon, east to FM 2689 near Kokomo, 7.8 miles of base and surface on FM 2526, estimated to cost \$86,000, according to District Engineer E. M. Pritchard.

This work is included in the 1965 Texas Farm-to-Market Road Program. Approximately \$470,000 was allotted to the Brownwood district out of a statewide total of some \$23,000,000 that is made available

annually under existing statutes for new farm-to-market road construction, Pritchard stated.

Some of the roads in this program have been previously designated under past farm-to-market road programs where only the grading and drainage structures were provided for and the base material and asphalt surfacing is being financed under this program. In these cases planning is well advanced and these roads may be placed under contract this year providing right of way will be acquired.

Oldenite Carl Butler Jr. Is Businessman of Year

Texas Small Businessman of the Year and will compete with outstanding businessmen in a five-state area for regional honors.

A graduate of Olden High School, 1940, and Texas A&M University, and a World War II veteran, Carl is president of the BW Construction Co. of Bryan. His wife is the former Patsy Sparks, daughter of Judge and Mrs. Frank Sparks.

Cited for developing a company in 1949 with a present status of \$5 million in business contracts, Butler founded B. W. Construction that same year, '49. He presently has contract projects for Texas A&M, the Fort Worth District of the U. S. Corps of Engineers and other public and private buildings.

His professional memberships include the Associated General Contractors of America. He is a member of the Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce, is a member of the official board of the First Methodist Church of Bryan and has served as a member of the city planning commission.
