Besides his parents, survivors include his wife, Joan, and two children, Donna, 4 and Linda, 5, of Abilene; one brother, Wayne of Snyder.

The body is expected to arrive in Abilene sometime next week where services will be held at St. Mark Episcopal Church and graveside rites and burial will be here in Murray Memorial Cemetery.

Good Month To File Social Security Claim

Eastland County residents 65 or over who have not yet applied for social security benefits were advised today to file a claim now even if they are not planning to retire right away.

In issuing the above advice, R. R. Tuley, Jr., Abilene social security district manager pointed out that several local people who applied last year found that they had lost some benefits by not applying earlier. "We have found," said Tuley, "that the best way for a person to protect his social security benefit rights is to apply at 65 whether or not he intends to go on working. Even if no benefits are payable right away, there's an advantage in having your claim already approved when you actually retire. With entitlement already established, the benefits can be started immediately when we are notified of the

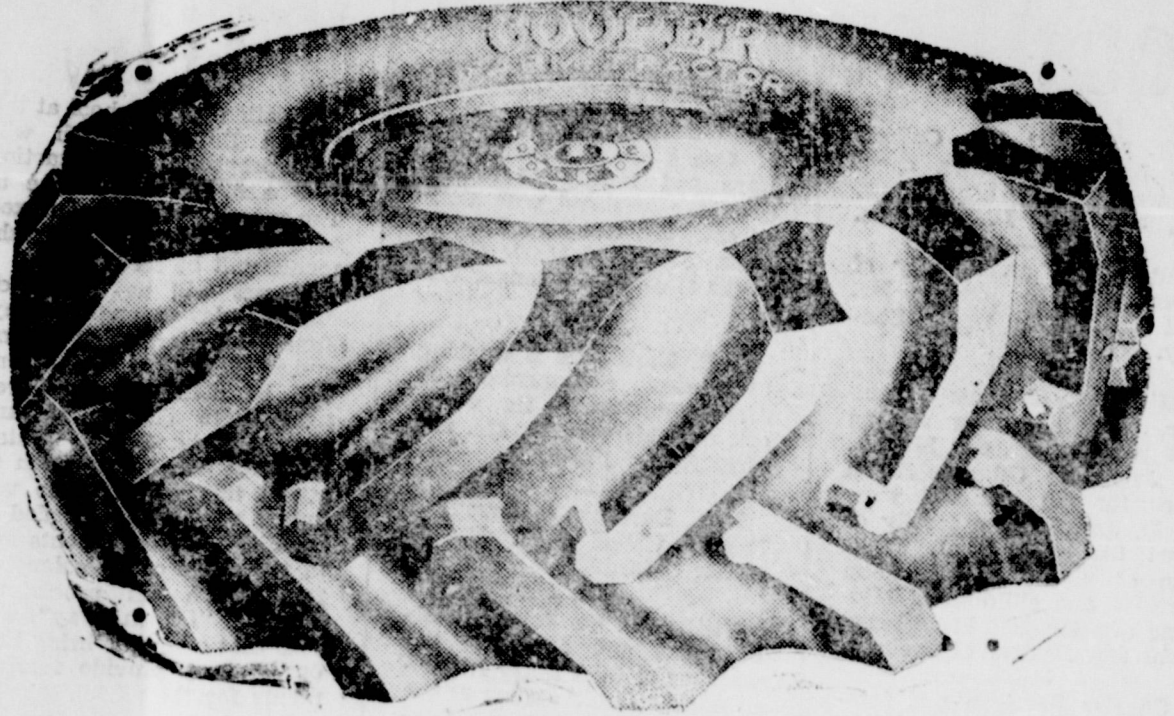
AUCTION

Game Wardens To Be Employed In State Exams

AUSTIN — Applications are now being accepted for the position of Texas game warden, according to J. Weldon Watson, executive director of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Applicants must be in good physical condition; a high school graduate; citizen of the United States and a resident of Texas for at least one year prior to the date of appointment.

Applicants must be between 21 and 40 years of age inclusive (as of March 1, 1966), at least 5 feet 8 inches tall, with out shoes, and must weigh at least two pounds and not more than three pounds for each inch of height.

Applications should be sent to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, John H. Reagan Building, Austin, Texas 78701, before 5 p.m. on June 18, 1965. All applicants qualifying will be advised when and where to report for a written, competitive examination, said Watson.

Those applicants passing the written, competitive examination will be notified to appear for oral examination. Extensive background investigation of each successful candidate will be made by supervisory personnel of the Department.

Twenty men, selected from those ranking highest in the competitive examination procedure, will be appointed to fill vacancies. These men will receive extensive training, including a four-month formal school at Texas A&M University.

Upon successful completion of all phases of the training program, the new men will be commissioned as Game Warden I's and assigned to a district for duty.

Watson said that instructions for applying may be obtained from the Parks and Wildlife Department Office, John H. Reagan Building, Austin.
