ALL STORES AND BUSINESS HOUSES TO CLOSE FOR THE CELEBRATION

All of West Texas Will Meet at Sweetwater to Spread Joy and Greet Neff and Other High Officials.

Friday will be a red letter day for Colorado, when the largest delegation ever leaving this city boards the special train for Sweetwater. The number who will compose the booster excursion is variously estimated at from five hundred to one thousand. Merchants, bankers, professional men, farmers, cattlemen, oil men, women, children and others are all enthused over the jubilee excursion and will make the trip. Colorado is on the map and it is up to Colorado to keep it there.

The Colorado Chamber of Commerce has chartered a special train to carry the Mitchell County delegation from Colorado to the West Texas Jubilee at Sweetwater Friday. The special, to be made up of several day coaches, is scheduled to leave Colorado at 12:15 Friday afternoon, arriving at Sweetwater one hour later. The return schedule is to leave Sweetwater at 5:45, placing the Colorado boosters home early in the evening, shortly before 7 o'clock.

The special is chartered by a committee appointed at the Chamber of Commerce mass meeting Friday night consisting of A. B. Blanks, chairman; Rev. D. R. Hardison and E. F. King. The committee guaranteed the sale of tickets amounting to \$300 in order to obtain the special. That the sale of tickets would greatly exceed that amount was predicted by the Chairman Tuesday morning. Tickets totaling more than \$200 had been placed at that time.

Colorado is to have an important part in the program for the day. The Colorado Booster Band has been engaged to assist the Sweetwater band by furnishing music for the day. The several hundred school children expected to attend the jubilee from Mitchell County are to form a section in a parade of ten thousand children at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

Immediately after arrival of the special in Sweetwater, the Colorado delegation, headed by the band, will form a parade leading through the principal business district. Mitchell County school children will march in this parade, which will end at the Hotel Wright, on North Oak street. The school parade will form in front of the Hotel Wright at 2 o'clock.

J. H. Greene, chairman of the committee arranging for the parade, stated Monday that every delegate from this county would be expected to wear a badge. These badges will be furnished by the Chamber of Commerce. In addition to the badges, banners and pennants will be carried in the parade, advertising the fact that Colorado is one of the live towns of West Texas and is in the campaign to locate the Texas Tech. It is very important that every delegate form in line for the parade immediately after detrainning.

Every business house and office in Colorado will close at 12 noon Friday and these are co-operating with the Chamber of Commerce in urging that this city send a strong delegation. Chamber of Commerce officials

RAIN MONDAY NIGHT WILL SWELL TRAIN DELEGATION

The rain Monday night and Tuesday will swell the number of Colorado citizens to make the trip to Sweetwater on the special train. A. B. Blanks, chairman of the transportation committee, states. Because of the almost impassable condition of the Roscoe Flats, many formerly planning to go in cars are now making reservations on the train.

Those who have made reservations are requested to call at the ticket office any time after Wednesday noon and obtain ticket. The fact that you have paid for your ticket will not entitle you to make the trip unless you obtain it yourself. Your names are registered at the ticket office and the ticket will be issued you upon application.

WEETWATER MAKES CHANGE IN JUBILEE DAY PROGRAM

In order that school children from Colorado might have a part in the school children's parade, previously arranged for 10 o'clock in the morning, the committee having in charge the jubilee program at Sweetwater changed the time to 2 o'clock in the afternoon, thirty minutes after the Colorado special train is scheduled to arrive. The change was made at the request of representatives of the Colorado Chamber of Commerce who were in Sweetwater Monday afternoon.

HIGHWAY THROUGH NOLAN COUNTY IS REPORTED ROUGH

The highway through Nolan County was very rough Monday afternoon, according to information from representatives of the Chamber of Commerce and Lions Club who were in Sweetwater Monday afternoon to complete arrangements for the part the Colorado delegation is to have in the jubilee program there Friday.

J. H. Greene, member of the committee going to Sweetwater to confer with those arranging the program stated that it required two hours and twenty-five minutes to make the drive from Colorado to Sweetwater. The Roscoe Flats were found very rough, with numerous mud holes along the route.

The committee on transportation is of the belief that the condition of the highway through Nolan County will cause a number of citizens who had planned making the trip in cars to abandon that plan and go on the special train. Even a light rain would make the Roscoe Flats in an almost impassable condition, it is claimed.

300 COLORADO SCHOOL CHILDREN TO PARADE

There will be three hundred Colorado school children to accompany the Colorado delegation to Sweetwater Friday afternoon, according to E. F. King, superintendent of schools, King stated Monday that the schools would be closed for the day Friday.

These children are to have a part in the big parade to be staged at Sweetwater Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock. It is estimated that ten thousand school children will be in the parade singing "The Eyes of Texas Are Upon You." The children will march in front of the reviewing stand on the court house lawn, to be occupied by Governor Neff, Dr. Coleman and other prominent citizens. Immediately after the parade, the Governor will address the children. Parents of Colorado are urged to assist in sending a strong delegation of school children to Sweetwater. They can go on the special and will be under the personal direction of their teachers.

DR. COLEMAN ON PROGRAM FOR ADDRESS AT JUBILEE

Tentative program of the jubilee celebration at Sweetwater, received here Monday morning includes the name of Dr. P. C. Coleman of Colorado as one of the principal speakers for the day. Dr. Coleman and Governor Neff are the only two names mentioned in the program for addresses in the afternoon.

It was stated here Monday that the pen, used by the governor in signing the Texas Technological school bill and to be presented to Dr. Coleman, would be given him Friday, following a fitting presentation address by the governor.

"Delegation 500 Strong Coming from Colorado for Jubilee," says headline in the Sweetwater Reporter Friday. The delegation will be there, bright, and we will maintain the distinction of being one of the foremost cities in West Texas. The Colorado delegation will be one of the largest to visit Sweetwater during the jubilee and of course the Colorado Booster Band will be the best band there by odds.

The Colorado special to Sweetwater will leave at 12:15 Friday afternoon. There is going to be a big jam at the ticket window just before the train pulls out for the jubilee. Better get your ticket now and be safe.

**COLORADO ORGANIZES
TO GET NEW COLLEGE**

Colorado citizens faced a driving rainstorm through mud and water, to attend the Chamber of Commerce mass meeting at the First Christian church Friday evening, called by Dr. P. C. Coleman to perfect organization of the committee who are to direct the campaign to locate the School of Technology here. In the absence of Dr. Coleman, who was called to Pecos on business Thursday, Col. C. M. Adams presided.

In spite of the rainstorm outside and the further fact that several citizens did not brave the threatening weather to be present, the mass meeting developed into one of the most enthusiastic ever held here. Speakers were profuse in their praise of Mitchell County and of the advantages to be offered for locating the school near this city. That every advantage to be offered by any West Texas County could be found in this county was the key note sounded in a number of addresses.

"If I did not know that Mitchell County was just as good from any angle as any other county in West Texas, and did not have equal advantages to offer for location of the school, I would be looking for that better county," Joe H. Smoot, cashier of the Colorado National Bank, stated in opening his address. J. H. Greene, Col. Adams and others referred to the opportunity Colorado has of obtaining this wonderful institution as the greatest opportunity ever presenting itself.

Adams named two committees to work out the details to be met in placing application of this city before the locating board. One of these committees is assigned to the duty of securing a site for the proposed institution and the other, designated as the statistical committee, to compile in brief a resume of the county, including the several resources and industries, together with the soil, climate and health conditions.

The locating committee is composed of Dr. P. C. Coleman, chairman; E. H. Winn, F. M. Burns, H. L. Hutchinson, R. H. Looney, J. M. Thomas, J. Riordan, T. W. Stonerod, Jr., Thos. J. Coffee, Thos. R. Smith and J. H. Greene. The statistical committee is composed of W. S. Cooper, chairman; E. M. Baldwin, O. Lambeth, E. F. King, Dr. T. J. Ratliff, J. C. Hall, C. H. Earnest, R. P. Price, L. B. Elliott, Chas. R. Farris and W. A. Dulin.

Following the announcement of H. L. Hutchinson, president of the school board, that the schools would be closed Friday afternoon in order to allow the school children to attend the Sweetwater jubilee, it was determined to arrange for a special train from here. A committee composed of Rev. D. R. Hardison, A. B. Blanks and E. F. King, was appointed to arrange for the special.

"We will send 200 to 300 school children to Sweetwater Friday if the means of transportation is available" E. F. King stated, and there is no one who is more capable of letting those people know that Colorado is on the map."
