'Late Registrants Are Big Problem in Eastland County'

"Late registrants for the draft in Eastland County are a problem," according to Mrs. Jewell Reaves, board clerk at the Petroleum Building, Eastland. To keep books straight and to comply with the law, men are required to register on time, which is within five days after reaching the age of 18 years.

A new policy regarding registrants for draft determines that all young men registering a week (or more) late will be asked to appear before the board in person to explain their tardiness. Official consideration will be given by the board, declaring these men delinquent under law and processing them for armed forces induction ahead of other men in this age group. Browsing With Bev

When you go to the grocery store, do you buy the biggest eggs you can find so you get the most for your money? If you do, you may be making a mistake.

There's more to an egg than its size. Quality, too, must be considered. Egg graders in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Marketing Service have special ratings for each of these factors.

The quality of a carton of eggs is graded U.S. Grade AA or Fresh Fancy Quality, U.S. Grade A, or U.S. Grade B. These quality grades depend upon shell characteristics, spread of the egg when broken, thickness of the white, and firmness and size of the yolk.

Sizes are based on weight alone. They include Jumbo, Extra Large, Large, Medium, Small, and Peewee. Most common are Extra Large

eggs which must weigh 27 ounces per dozen; Large eggs, which weigh 24 ounces; Medium, 21 ounces; and Small eggs, 18 ounces.

The next time you reach for a carton of eggs, remember that big eggs are not necessarily top quality nor small eggs of lower quality.

Buy packaged cereals and other packaged foods by weight rather than by the size of the package.

Use a narrow strip of cellophane tape to secure the remaining threads of a loose button on a jacket or coat, if you cannot re-sew it immediately. The tape should hold the threads in place until you can re-sew it.

If your wooden salad bowls are dry and rough from continued washing, here's a simple remedy. Rub a little salad oil into the grain of the wood, repeating until bowls regain some of their glossy finish.

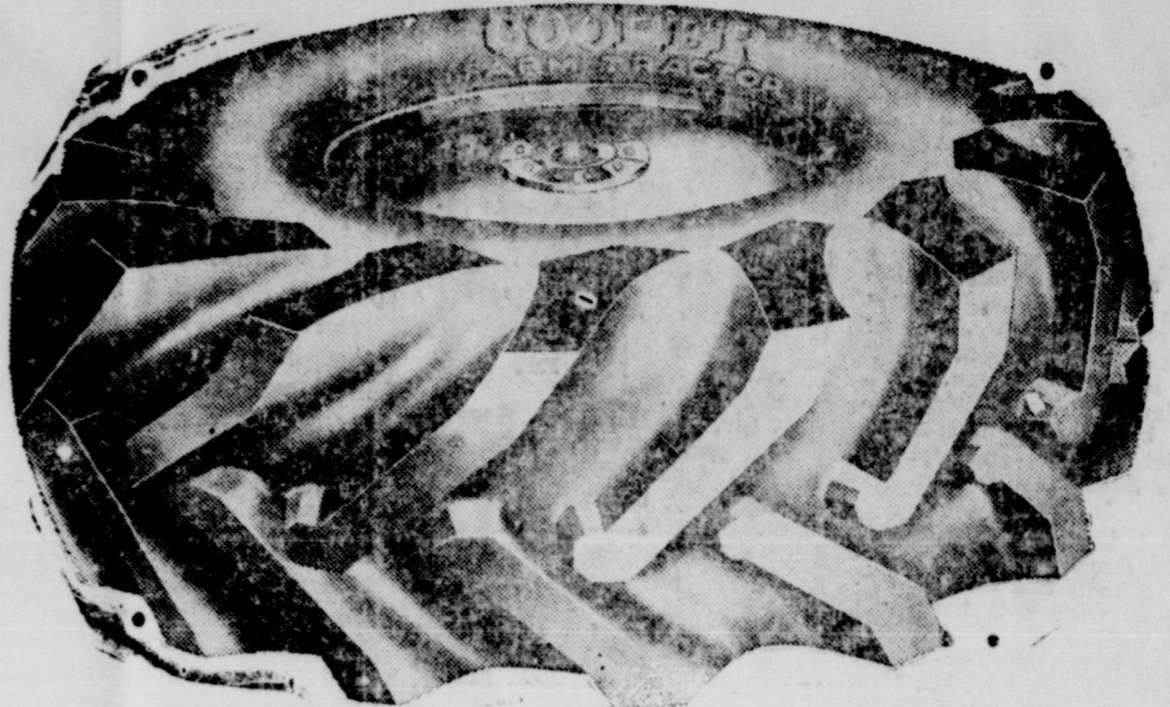

Long Distance Telephone Rates Lowered April 1

Lower long distance rates became effective April 1 on station-to-station calls within Texas after 8 p. m. daily and all day Sunday, Steve Simmons, Manager Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, announced today.

The night rate formerly was in effect after 9 p. m. Now it is effective at 8 p. m. daily, and applies all day Sunday.

The "Evening" rate, which applies from 6 to 8 p. m. Monday thru Friday, is effective all day Saturday.

"Since Sunday is the day families usually get together, this change in rates will make it possible for family calls to be made all day Sunday at the lowest rate of the week," said Mr. Simmons.

The changes in rates will apply only to station-to-station calls. The "Night" and Sunday rate will not apply to intrastate collect or third-party.

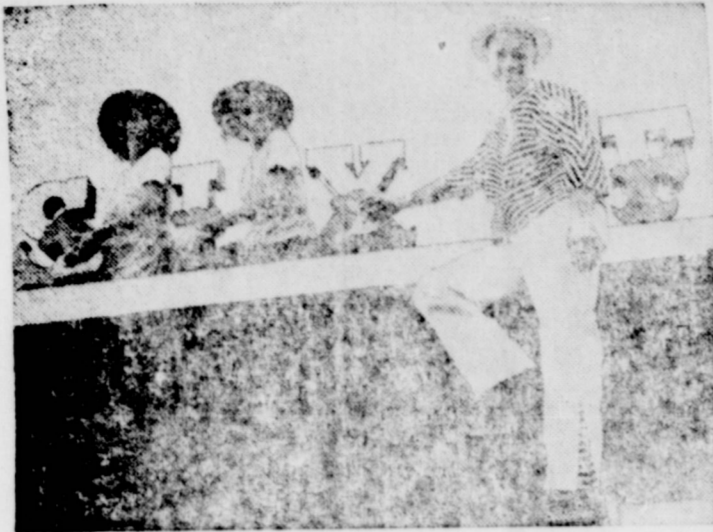

More than 1.5 million people from all over the United States are expected to visit the popular tourist attraction, located midway between Dallas and Fort Worth, this season.

SIX FLAGS SETS SEASON OPENER FOR APRIL 16

Six Flags Over Texas will commence its 1965 season at 10 a.m., Friday, April 16, according to Angus G. Wynne, Jr., president of Great Southwest Corporation, owner/operators of the popular tourist attraction.

For the opening weekend, April 16, 17 and 18, the gates will be open from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

A crew of about 150 specialists ranging from landscape gardeners to builders and lighting engineers, have been busily engaged over the winter and early spring months in completing a \$600,000 expansion program before April 16.

The Six Flags personnel department which has the awesome job of interviewing thousands of applicants of college age each season for positions as hosts and hostesses, has settled on approximately 1,200 to begin the season. Another 400-500 personnel will be added when Six Flags commences daily operations May 29.

The bulk of the expenditures for this year is centered on expanding the Park's historical value and landscaping.

Other attractions have been added including a new ride named "El Sombrero" for the Mexican Section. An Aviary located in the Animal Kingdom, will be the new home of nearly 100 exotic birds recently imported from all over the world.

A true replica of one of America's most revered shrines, the Liberty Bell, has been obtained by Six Flags. Whitechapel

Bell Foundries, Ltd. in England who made the original bell in 1752, cast an exact replica from the same moulding pit in 1960. The bell, made of pure copper and tin, is 47 inches in diameter and weighs 2016 pounds.

A rare and interesting collection of branding irons from many legendary ranches in Texas and the Southwest, will be displayed in the Texas Section.

For young cowpokes and budding deputy sheriffs an indoor firing range containing J. Bean's "Shootin' Irons" has been built just across the porch from the venerable Judge's Jersey Lilly Courthouse.

Hanging baskets containing flowers or various planting are fairly commonplace. But when each basket weighs 100 pounds and is suspended from decorative 10-foot poles, then that's another story. Six Flags will have 60 of these enormous hanging baskets planted in ivy leaf geraniums around the Mall area inside the main gate. In all, \$200,000 has been expended on landscaping with flowers and shrubs planted so as to be color coordinated and in harmony with the diverse building schemes.

The fascinating lighting display at Six Flags after dark which has always been a conversation piece, should have added visual dramatic effects, thanks to the efforts of the Park's lighting engineers.

Beginning April 23 and until May 28, Six Flags will be open only on Fridays from 5-11 p.m. and Saturdays and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Frank Sayre Named to State Study

Attorney General Waggoner Carr has announced the appointment of F. N. Sayre of Eastland to serve as official representative for Eastland County, for the 1965 Attorney General's Youth Conference On Crime.

This Third Annual Conference will attract over 1,600 outstanding youth leaders from throughout Texas to study projects for implementing in Texas communities for the prevention of delinquency. Many outstanding programs have already begun in Texas as a result of the first two Conferences including youth juries, programs for tutoring students to prevent drop-outs, and various other community service projects.

Civic clubs, churches and other organizations or interested individuals will sponsor delegates, and individuals interested in participating should contact Texas Electric Service Co.

The conference will be held in Austin August 20 through 22nd, 1965.

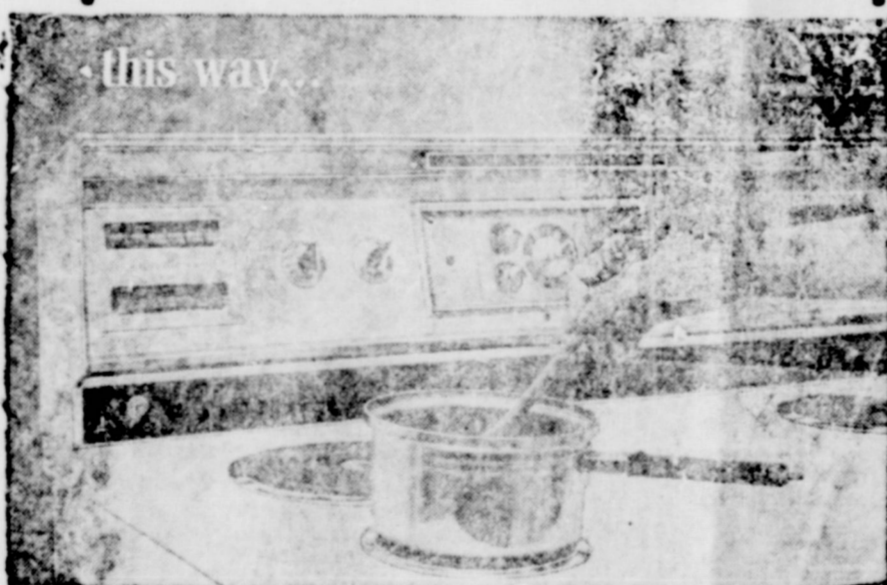
