## County Farm Bureau Officials Participating In State Drive

### Frank Sparks Appointed New District Judge

Gov. John Connally appointed veteran Eastland Attorney Frank Sparks to the bench of the 91st District Court Friday.

Judge Sparks will complete the unexpired term of the late T. M. Collie, who died in December.

A native of Bell County, Judge Sparks has practiced law in Eastland County since 1919 when he was admitted to the bar, except for a term as a state legislator in 1925 and 1926.

He becomes the third judge to preside in the Eastland County court. Incidentally, he was responsible for the court's being named a permanent court, having authored and steered a bill to that effect when he was a member of the 39th Legislature. He was also responsible for the assignment of the 11th Court of Civil Appeals in Eastland.

Judge George L. Davenport, now retired and living in Fort Worth, was the first man to preside on the 91st court bench. Judge Collie was elected following Judge Davenport's decision not to seek re-election.

A 1912 graduate of Belton High School, Judge Sparks attended the University of Texas from 1913 to 1917 and received his degree in 1925, following service in the First World War as an officer in the field artillery.

He and his first wife, his high school sweetheart in Belton, had four children, and Mrs. Sparks died in Eastland in 1949. He married Mrs. J. A. Brann of Sweetwater in 1952.

The children are Joe, a Lubbock public accountant; Mrs. Carl Butler Jr. of Bryan; Ben, a Colorado City contractor; and Dick, an employee of the Sun Oil Co. of McComb, Miss. The new judge has 12 grandchildren.

After returning from the legislature, Judge Sparks served for one term as district attorney in this county when another district court was here as well as the 91st.

And it was a noteworthy term, with Aggressive Sparks prosecuting, among many other spectacular cases, the Santa Claus bank robbers. During that time, he tried 213 contested felony cases, and the record reveals that there were five death sentences handed down, and the courts recorded some \$3,500 in excess fees.

Several local county leaders will participate in the formal launching of the Texas Farm Bureau's 1965 membership drive. Three area rallies are being held — one Feb. 2 in San Antonio, and two Feb. 4 in Lubbock and one in Dallas.

Local representatives will go to the Dallas rally, according to Jack Cozart of Cisco, president.

Those planning to attend include: Mr. and Mrs. John Love, Mr. and Mrs. Cyrus Justice, Mr. and Mrs. Jack Cozart, R. L. Ricks, Mitchell Campbell, Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Jordan, Mr. and Mrs. Elbert Hendricks, and Pat Moseley and B. T. Graham.

Following the rally, an all-out drive for new members

in this county is set for the period of Feb. 18. This is part of a state-wide effort, by the 201 organized county Farm Bureaus, to reach a total of 100,000 members in Texas this year. The local county goal is 632.

Gov. John B. Connally has proclaimed the week of Feb. 8-13 as "Farm Bureau Membership Week" in Texas. County Judge Scott Bailey has officially proclaimed the same period as "Farm Bureau Week" in the county.

Membership in the state's largest general farm organization has increased each of the past 12 years to a total of 92,552 in 1964. The local County Farm Bureau's 1964 membership was 622.

## Deadline Nears for Stock Show Entries

Plans are rapidly being developed for the annual Eastland County Livestock Show, March 11-13. Sam Kimmell, Cisco, president of the County Livestock Raisers Association, sponsoring organization announced today.

All animals must be listed and entry fees paid by February 11 according to Robert Kincaid, Morton Valley rancher and general superintendent of the show that each spring brings hundreds of exhibitors and animals together for the annual event at the show ground a mile from downtown Eastland near the city lake.

A new feature of the show this year will be a judging contest for FFA and 4-H Club teams on Friday night, March 12th. Glyn Gilliam, Ranger banker and vice president of the livestock group has announced that his bank will sponsor the top trophy of the winning judging team.

As in the past there will be two large divisions of the show. The Junior division

is open to any FFA or 4-H Club boy enrolled in a public school in the county. Adults and juniors from adjoining counties will show in the open division. Cash premiums are to be awarded only to the county members.

Sale of the fat steers, lambs and pigs will be held at the Eastland Auction Sales Barn, Hwy. 80 East on the last night of the show. Judging of all divisions will be on March 12 and 13th prior to the auction.

Committees from all over the county have been named and some have been working on plans for the events for the past several weeks, Kimmell said.

## Poll Tax Sales Hit 2,940 In Eastland County

Sale of poll tax in Eastland County this year was "way down" compared to sales in 1963, according to Tax Collector Edgar Altom. There was a total of 2,940 sales this year, 4,738 in 1963.

Of course 1964 was a general election year which would account for the high sales then.

This year, 1,266 poll taxes were paid at the court house and sub-stations held the following numbers: Cisco, 744; Ranger, 524; Gorman, 242; and Rising Star, 164, Mr. Altom said.

In 1962, 3,982 poll taxes were paid.

Overage exemptions are not included in this report.

## Browsing With Bev

If any stain remains, bleach with lemon juice, salt and sunshine, sodium perborate bleach, or a diluted solution of chlorine bleach. Do not use the chlorine bleaches on wool, silk or some fabrics treated with special finishes.

For upholstered articles, mattresses and rugs, remove loose mold from the articles by brushing with a broom or stiff brush. If possible, do this out-of-doors. Run a vacuum cleaner attachment over the surface of the article to draw out all the mold possible. Then clean out the vacuum cleaner immediately. If the vacuum bag is disposable, destroy it at once.

Sun and air the article to stop the mold growth—and if the mildew still remains, sponge with soap suds and wipe clean with a damp cloth or sponge. Dry again thoroughly.

Rugs and carpets may be sponged with thick suds or a

shampoo. It's best to apply the shampoo and remove it with rug shampoo equipment. If this equipment isn't available, remove the suds with a cloth dampened in clear water. Dry in the sun if possible.

Freeze honey if you intend to keep it a long time. That is the latest word from researchers at the Wisconsin Agricultural Experiment Station.

As most homemakers know, honey kept on the kitchen shelf gets sugary and turns dark after a while. Putting honey in the refrigerator doesn't help. In fact, it crystallizes even sooner.

None of this happens to honey kept in a freezer. So, store it there. Remove only a small amount at a time—enough to last a week or two.

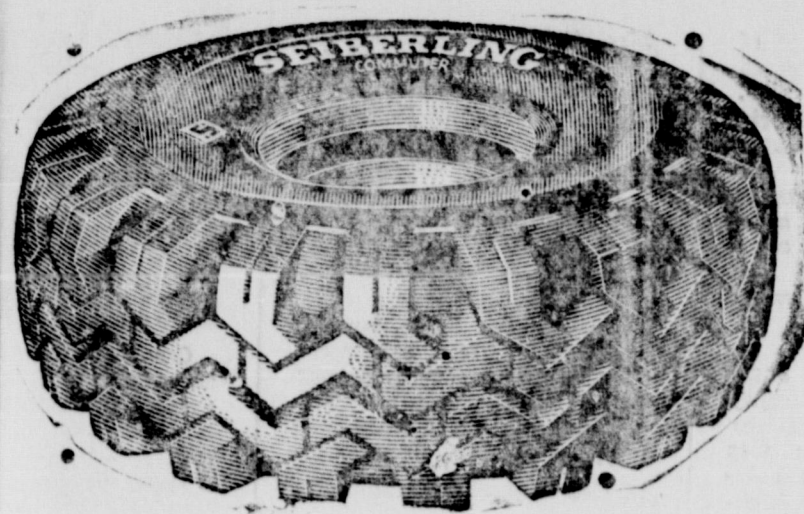

## Rainfall In County Is 2.10 Inches

Rainfall in Eastland County started the year "ahead of the game" with 2.10 inches measured during January, nearly three-quarters of an inch above average, and just less than during the same month last year.

Average for January is 1.37 inches and 2.48 inches were measured in that month of 1964, according to official county weather observer James Smith of Eastland.

Rain fell on five days this January, and accounted for good "seasoning" in spite of high, heavy and drying winds throughout the month. On the second day of the month, .65 inch fell; .3 inch on the third; .30 inch on the ninth; .37 inch on the 21st; and .65 of an inch on the 22nd.

Temperatures have ranged from a low of 21 degrees on the 11th to a 70 on the 26th. Sunday night's low was 22 with 30 degrees registered at 7 a.m.

## Auto Plates On Sale At Courthouse

License plates went on sale Monday in Eastland County and throughout the state and will end April 1. Mr. J. C. Whatley of Eastland, with his purchase of both commercial and passenger plates, was the first person to purchase li-

ense plates in Eastland, according to Tax Assessor-Collector Edgar Altom.

Three things are required to obtain plates for your car—the money, current registration receipt and certificate of title. Lost receipts or ownership papers may be replaced easily by sending 25 cents for each duplicate desired to the Department's Motor Vehicle Division in Austin, 40th and Jackson Streets.

Receipts may also be obtained from the county in which the vehicle was regis-

tered. To issue a duplicate, the department must first have your license number, make and vehicle identification number.

Approximately a quarter-million more vehicles have been registered yearly in the state since World War II, a trend which is expected to continue.

Although you may not be among the first to get your plates this year, you won't want to wait until the last few days to make the purchase.

Substations will be open on March 1 at the Cisco Chamber of Commerce office; in Ranger at L&J Supply Co., at 122 Main St.; in Gorman at Todd's Variety Store; and in Rising Star at Jenkin's Insurance Agency.
