## Work Progress Report Is Made For Highway 80

Construction work on some six and a half miles of Interstate 20 (Highway 80) from the Callahan County line to the west edge of Cisco is 96 per cent complete, according to a report by highway engineers.

The work is being done by the Cecil Ruby Company on a contract for \$1,893,346. It includes divided highways with access roads, and the work has been underway for the past year.

Work has started on a project 1.5 miles east of Ranger to a point three miles west of the Erath County line on the same highway. Cooper and Woodruff, Inc. has the contract, which calls for the sum of \$1,086,119.

## Browsing With Bev Browsing

Add new flavor and interest to cooked green vegetables by trying some of these seasonings: Cook a tablespoon or two of minced onion, green pepper, or parsley with snap beans or summer squash; cook a few mint leaves with peas; put a small pinch of herb or spice in the water when cooking lima beans; and a little vinegar and sugar heated together to make a good dressing for snap beans or cabbage, with or without a few tablespoons of cream; point up the flavor of green vegetables with meat drippings, butter or margarine, or salad oil with lemon juice, horseradish, or garlic; add bits of crisply fried bacon to spinach or other greens.

A splash of color can cheer up the cook as well as brighten the meal. And one of the best brightener-uppers around

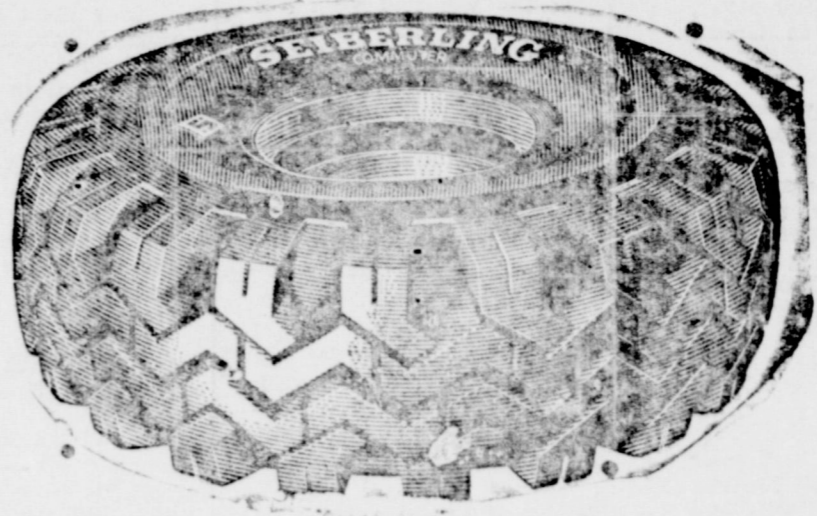
is the lively red of fresh tomatoes. Use them lavishly this time of year and use them with beef. The U.S. Department of Agriculture reports both foods in abundant supply.

The two foods are old friends. Their flavors complement each other in many a favorite recipe. For a starter try these: Pour 2½ cups of tomatoes over a pot roast the last hour of cooking. It makes first-class gravy, especially if a clove of garlic and a little thyme are cooked with the meat. Add 1 cup of tomatoes and your favorite seasonings to 1½ pounds of ground beef for meat loaf. Use about a cup of soft bread crumbs as a binder. Put extra flavor and moistness in ground beef patties by adding ¼ cup of tomatoes to 1 pound of ground beef. Use ½ cup of uncooked, quick-cooking oats as a binder and season to taste. This combination offers a deliciously "different" flavor and helps you stretch a pound of meat to serve 6.

## Collegians Are 'Asset' For Dad On Tax Returns

When Junior says he is a  
double income tax exemption  
it comes as a surprise to  
thousands of Dads each year.  
Dads have had 10 years since  
the law was changed in 1954  
to learn about the student  
exemption -- but they haven't.  
The student must claim his  
own exemption on his own re-  
turn. If he is under 18 or a  
full time student and is re-  
ceiving principal support from  
Dad, he can be claimed on  
Dad's return too.  
However, the mixup contin-  
ues. A lot of Dads send word  
to the teacher teaching the  
little IRS tax course at school  
that they are teaching the  
course all wrong. Dad tells  
the teacher that you can't

"double dip." Well, Dad, in  
this case Junior gets an ex-  
emption and you also get an  
exemption.

## Vet's Questions And Answers

Q -- How do you get a vet-  
eran who requires medical  
treatment into a VA hospi-  
tal?

A-- The veteran or his  
physician applies for admis-  
sion which is forthcoming if  
he is eligible, needs hospital  
care and a bed is available.  
(In service-connected cas.s,  
a bed is always available.)  
In the case of a sudden emer-  
gency, the veteran may be  
taken directly to the hospital  
but someone acting for the  
veteran should communicate  
with the VA Hospital by tele-  
phone or telegraph beforehand  
to facilitate admission.

### Crew Leaders Are Named For Census Of Farms

Floyd Myron Johnson of Albany and Susan Eloise Parker of Comanche have been named as crew leaders for the 1964 Census of Agriculture. Percy R. Millard, director of the regional office of the U.S. Bureau of the Census at Dallas, announced today. The new crew leaders are two of about 1,825 persons throughout the U.S. to receive this appointment.

The new crew leaders will supervise a team of census enumerators who will visit all farms and ranches in Eastland and adjoining counties to collect official census questionnaires from farm operators. Enumeration of all farms in the county will take place in November and early December. The census will be taken in the following way: Shortly after November 5, the Bureau of the Census, an agency of the U.S. Department of Commerce, will mail census questionnaires to all rural boxholders. Those required to fill out the forms should do so and hold the questionnaires until a census enumerator comes to collect them. At that time, the enumerator will help answer any questions that may have proved troublesome.

The crew leaders are key persons in conducting a Census of Agriculture. They recruit and train the enumerators, schedule their work, review the accuracy of completed forms, and conduct difficult interviews.

The Census of Agriculture is taken every five years in years ending in "4" and "9" to gather information on the nation's agricultural resources and improvements and information is vital in making decisions affecting many segments of the U.S. economy. Data gathered include the number and size of farms, acreage and harvest of crops, livestock inventories, and information on farm equipment and improvements and income and some production expenditures.

The information will be published starting in 1965 for counties, States, and the nation.

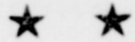

### Report Is Given On Bond Sales In Past Month

Guy Parker, chairman of the Eastland County Savings Bond Committee, has announced that the county's August savings bond sales totaled \$11,598. Sales for the first eight months of this year were 5236,187, which represents 53.6 per cent of the 1964 sales goal.

Total sales in Texas for the first eight months of the year were \$100,643,333. Savings bond sales have increased approximately \$900,000 compared to the same period in 1963.

"In a recent brochure the Treasury Department stressed the tax advantages of buying E bonds. While the interest is subject to federal income tax, the reporting of E bond interest may be deferred until

the bonds are cashed or reach final maturity. This means that the owner of the bonds can choose to cash his bonds in years of lower income. This fact makes the E bond

particularly attractive to the large investor and for those persons either planning retirement or supplementing an existing retirement program," Chairman Parker stated.
