AUCTION REPORT

A total of 709 cattle, 203 hogs, and 174 sheep and goats were sold to 95 buyers at the Eastland Auction Company sale Tuesday. There were 229 sellers.

Prices were butcher bulls 16 to 18.60; stocker bulls 17 to 23; butcher cows 12 to 14.60; stocker cows 11 to 16; canners and cutters 8 to 13; butcher calves 18 to 22.60; stocker calves (lt choice) 19 to 25.40; stocker calves (hvy. choice) 16 to 22; pairs of cows and calves 110 to 185; butcher hogs 13 to 14.20; and sows 11 to 12.60.

Perry Brown with 3550 votes defeated Earl Conner, Jr. with 2093 votes for District and County Attorney. O. L. Stamey won the race for County School Superintendent with 3437 to his opponent, Mrs. B. E. Wagley's 2141. Omer Burleson won the Congressional race over Max Carriker and Ralph Yarbrough won the Senatorial race over McLendon.

A total of 5,905 votes were cast in Eastland County.

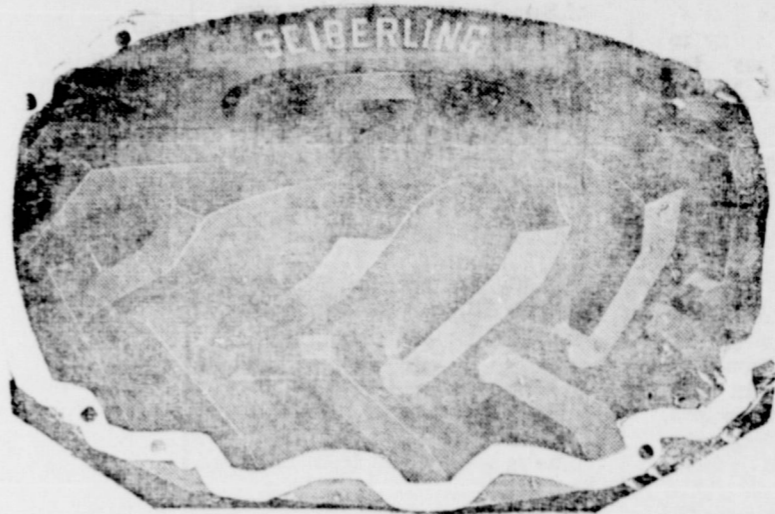

Annual Meet**

Representatives of the Stephenville Production Credit Association attended the eighth annual meeting of stockholders and patrons of the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Houston, at the Rice Hotel in Houston.

The Credit Bank is discount and supervisory agency of the 36 home-owned and operated Production Credit Associations and 14 other financing institutions in Texas which provide more than \$500,000,000 annually in farm and ranch loans to 30,000 Texas farmers, ranchers and dairymen.

Highlights of the meeting included a dinner at historic San Jacinto Inn, an awards luncheon and addresses by nationally-recognized leaders in agricultural financing.

Representing the Stephenville Production Credit Asso-

ciation were general manager W. M. Irwin and assistant manager Robert Norwood of Stephenville, president and Ms. R. Cal McCudy of Decatur were general manager, vice president James Crouch of Arlington, director and Ms. C. M. McCain of Eastland.

The 36 Production Credit Associations of Texas, now observing their 30th anniversary as free enterprise agricultural financing institutions, have loaned the state's farmers and ranchers more than \$3 billion since their organization in 1933 and 1934.

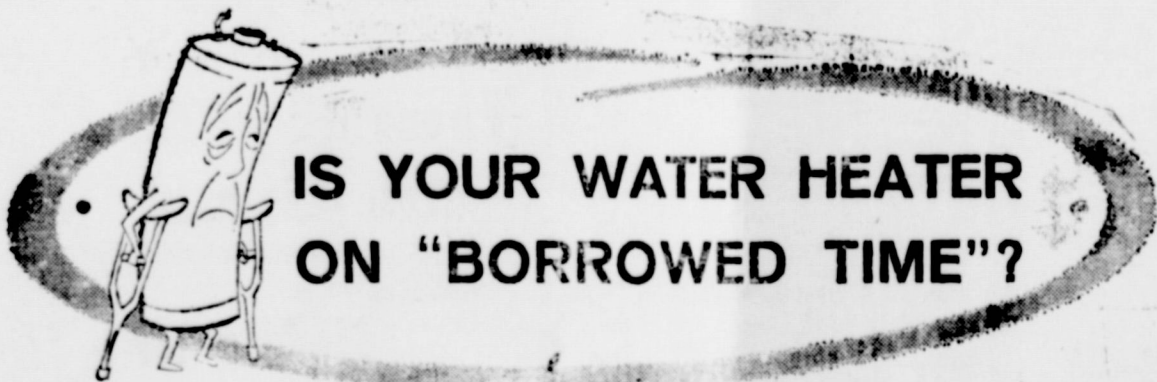

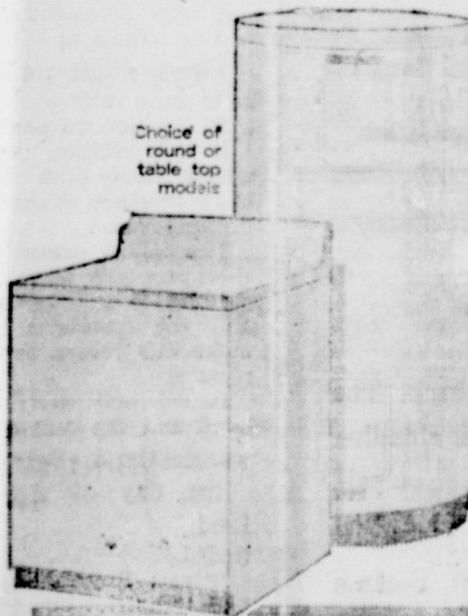
