## MOORE or Less

By Johnnie Moore

From the Liberal, Kansas Times:

"It's a bit hard to understand how a government now losing money can make money by reducing its income. It's like taking a pay cut to help pay your bills, only the Washington folks say it will work. . . . Looks like its 'a-bout time Washington goes old-fashioned and decides to live on its income, not monkey with everybody's affairs in the hope some easy miracle of prosperity without effort might be achieved."

I received the following in the mail this week, and I think it is worthy of your consideration.

### THE 10 PILLARS OF ECONOMIC WISDOM. . . .

I. Nothing in our material world can come from nowhere or go nowhere, nor can it be free; everything in our economic life has a source, a destination, and a cost that must be paid.

II. Government is never a source of goods. Everything produced is produced by the people, and everything that government gives to the people, it must first take from the people.

III. The only valuable money that government has to spend is that money taxed or borrowed out of the people's earnings. When government decides to spend more than it has thus received, that extra unearned money is created out of thin air, and when spent, takes on value only by reducing the value of all other money, savings and insurance.

IV. In our modern exchange economy, all payroll and employment come from customers, and the only worthwhile job security is customer security.

V. Customer security can only be achieved by the worker when the "boss" is allowed to do the things that win and hold customers.

VI. Because wages are the principal cost of everything, widespread wage increases, without corresponding increases in production, simply increase the cost of everybody's living.

VII. The greatest good for the greatest number, in its material sense, means the greatest number of goods for the greatest number, which in turn, means the greatest productivity per worker.

VIII. All productivity is based on three factors: 1) natural resources, whose form, place and condition are changed by the expenditure of 2) human energy, with the aid of 3) tools.

IX. Tools are the only one of these three factors that man can increase, and tools come into being in a free society only when there is a reward for the temporary self-denial that people must practice in order to channel part of their earnings away from purchases that produce immediate pleasure and comfort, and into new tools of production.

X. The productivity of the tools--that is, the efficiency of the human energy applied in their use--is highest in a competitive society in which the economic decisions are made by millions of progress-seeking individuals, rather than in a state-planned society where those decisions are made by a handful of all-powerful people, regardless of how well-meaning, unselfish, sincere, and intelligent those people may be.

## Commissioners Injunction Action Complete

Final dispensation in the suit brought against Yoakum County Commissioners to stop the use of County machinery on private property for private use was made this week. Judge Ledbetter of 121st District Court, who had earlier granted a temporary restraining order in the matter, made his decision on Wednesday morning.

An agreed judgement, in lieu of an injunction was the final fate of the suit.

It has been pointed out, however, that just because a permanent injunction was not issued does not mean that the Commissioners may now proceed with any and all types of private work with County machinery and county employees.

This would, in effect, violate their part of the agreed judgement. The only way that work, other than on roads or other County property, can now be done, is for a land owner or a land tenant to request the court to do work that would

fall into the category of Soil Conservation purposes as is outlined in Article 2372c, Revised Civil Statutes.

The work done of this nature must be compensated for under the following schedule of charges: (hourly rate)

Road grader or maintainer, \$8.50.  
Bulldozer, \$10.  
Dirt Loader, \$7.50.  
Elevating grader, \$12.50.  
Dump truck, \$3.50.  
Back hoe, \$7.50.

Application for work to be done and agreement to pay for such work, it is reported, must be made in writing.

Salary of Ann Sullivan, who is employed in the Tax Collectors office, was raised to \$335.

Decision was also made to advertise for bids, toward the purchase of kitchen equipment for the Denver City Hospital. (See page 2)

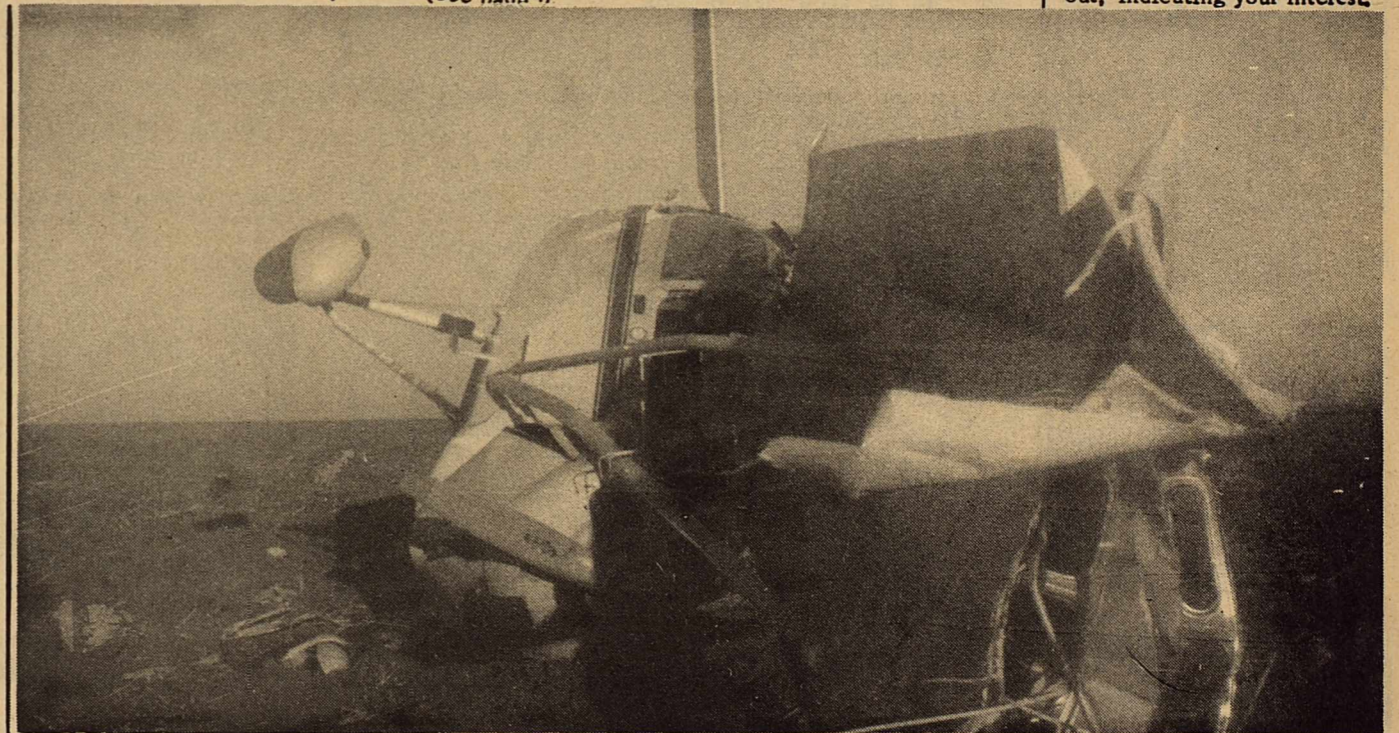
## Are You Interested

## YOU be the LEGISLATOR

A COLUMN TO PROMOTE LEGISLATIVE UNDERSTANDING AMONG TEXANS

A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to Section 5 of Article III of the Constitution... to provide for annual sessions of the legislature.

PROPOSERS of this legislation say that the state's \$2 1/2 Billion budget is too big a problem to be handled every two years, and that no business in the world would be allowed by its stockholders to be operated so haphazardly as this.

State departments are forced to anticipate their needs three years in advance because they must prepare their budget a year before the legislature convenes and make requests for two years following adjournment.

The prison system, hospitals and colleges are forced to operate on a guess and an estimate, which equals a "guesstimate."

As a practical matter, Texas has long had annual sessions through its many called special sessions. These special sessions are wasteful to the organizational struggles necessary before business can be transacted.

Annual sessions would eliminate the need for special sessions except for emergency matters, and state departments could budget on an annual basis.

This measure would provide for a 120-day session in odd-numbered years and a 90-day session in even-numbered years. Tax measures could then be passed more easily since \$10 million can be raised in a one-year package simpler than \$20 million in a two year program.

Thus appropriations and taxes could be handled on a one year basis. Therefore this resolution should be voted for.

OPPOSERS of this legislation say that the people of Texas have provided for bi-annual review of legislative policy and a session of the legislature in the midst of election year would seriously impair a fair examination of legislative functions.

Legislators with opponents in their districts would be hard pressed to give the full attention necessary to appropriation and tax measures while campaigning in their home areas, and by the same token opponents might find it hard to campaign against a legislator who is building an enviable image of being on the job during an election campaign.

Too, most state departments plan their budgets not just two or three years in advance, but often five to twenty years in advance, with minor changes made from year to year. Thus three year budget requests do not seriously hamper the agencies from operating efficiently.

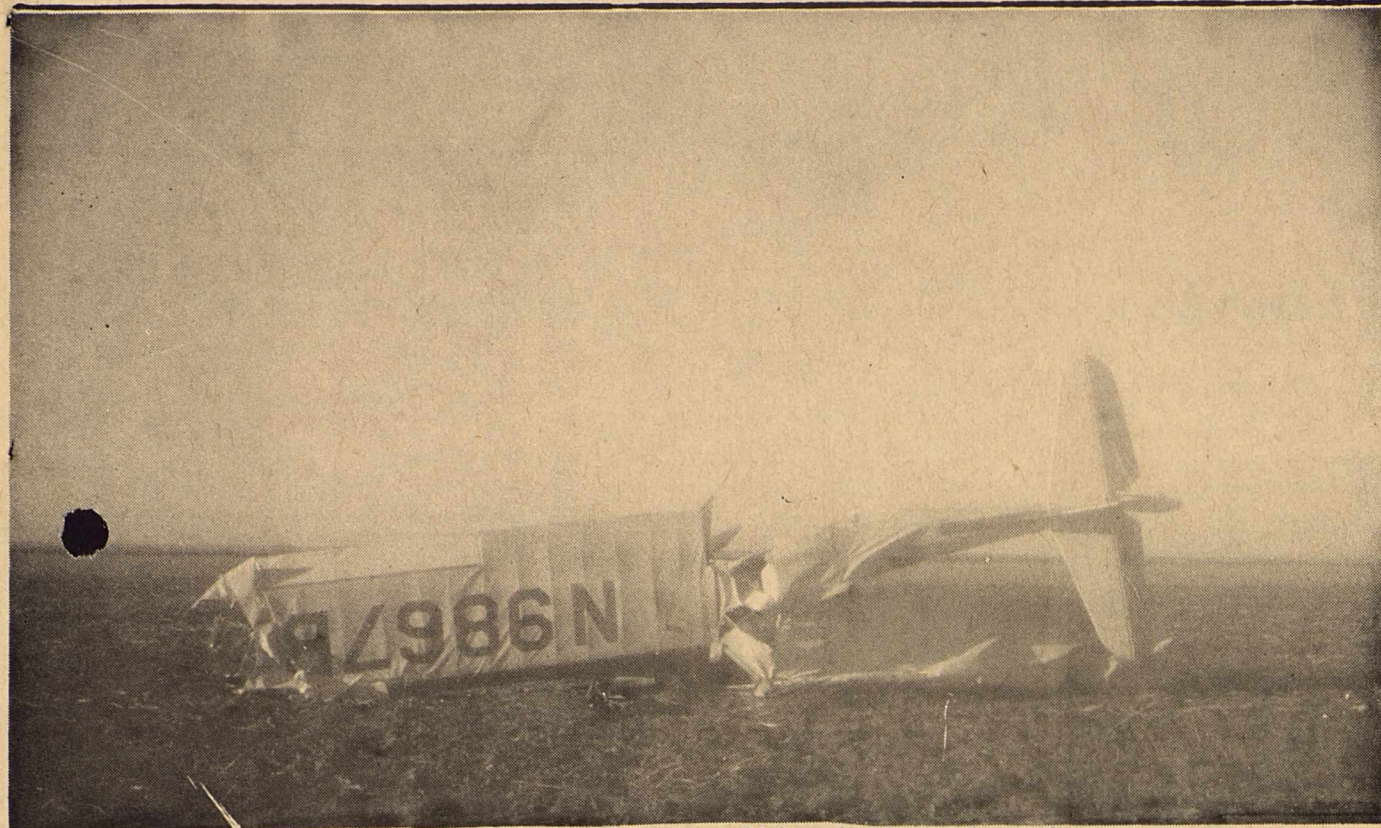



Mary Johnson Is Betty Crocker Winner

Mary Lou Johnson is winner from Plains High School of Plains, Texas in the 1963 Betty Crocker Search for the American Homemaker of Tomorrow. She thus becomes eligible for one of 102 scholarships with a total value of \$110,000.

Having scored first in her school in the knowledge and attitude test on homemaking given senior girls Dec. 4, the winner's paper has been entered in competition with those of other state high school winners for state-wide honors.

The State Homemaker of Tomorrow will be named in the spring. She will receive a \$1,500 scholarship from General Mills, sponsor of the program. A \$500 award will be made to the second highest ranking Homemaker of Tomorrow in the state. The school of each state winner will receive a set of Encyclopaedia Britannica.

Later, State Homemakers of Tomorrow with their advisors will enjoy an expense-paid educational tour of New York City, Washington, D. C. and Colonial Williamsburg, Va., which will culminate with the naming of the 1963 All-American Homemaker of Tomorrow.

The national winner's scholarship will be raised to \$5,000 with second, third and fourth

place winners being granted \$4,000, \$3,000, and \$2,000 scholarships, respectively.

Prepared and scored by Science Research Associated, Chicago, the knowledge and attitude test is the basis for naming of local and state Homemakers of Tomorrow. Personal observation and interviews are factors in the national judging.

The 1963 Betty Crocker Search reached another all-time high in enrollment, with 410,466 girls in 12,964 schools participating. Since the program started nine years ago, approximately three million girls have enrolled, and, including this year, scholarship awards will approach the million dollar mark.
