Report indicates 800 New Homes Built In County In 10 Year Period

To what degree has the building surge of recent years chanred the face of Eastland Coun-ty? How many new homes have been put up? How does the local rates of construction compare with that in other communities?

The extent of the change is indicated in the latest data on the subject, released by the Department of Commerce.

It shows that 800 of the dwellings that are now in use in the county were not in existenee in 1950.

In the period between 1950 and 1960, that is the number of new housing units that were built. It brought the overall total in the county to 8,249 units. Some of the new ones replaced old a n d dilapidated dwellings, which were torn

The rate of construction stacked up favorably with that reported for many areas of the country.

As to occupancy, the suvrey places the average number of persons per dwelling at 2.8. The average elsewhere in the United States is 3.4.

The amount of new building in the county was greater than in any other decade. It was made possible by rising personal income, by wider distribution of income and by liberal home financing, supported by Government funds.

In the process, many county families who had formerly been renters, bcame proprty owners. Nationally, the figures show that one-family housing continues to dominate new residential construction, but not to the extent that it did at one time." How long can you expect to keep your new refrigerator or range?

About 16 years if you follow the pattern of the average owner. This means you may trade it in, sell it, or give it away before it is completely worn out.

Many things affect the service life of an appliance. One is how well it fits the owner's needs and preferences. Research findings show, for example, that a range acquired with the purchase of a home may be kept a shorter time than one the homeowner chooses and buys separately.

Here are estimates of the "service life expectancy, purthased new, under one "owner" of several other types of household equipment:

automatic and semi-automatic, 11 years; dryer, 14 years; wringer and spin-dryer washing machines, 10 years; Freezers, 15 years; Vacum cleaners, upright, 18 years, tank, 15 years; sewing machines, electric, 24 years; Toasters, automatic, 15 years; television sets, 11 years and living room wool rugs, 14 years. These statistics should help the homemaker plan her budget. Some appliances will last longer than the average and some not as long, but if the homemaker is wise she will provide for replacement as items approach their average life expectancy.



Senior Citizens May Be Missing Extra Income

Some 875 persons past age 65 in the Abilene district will soon have received a reminder that they may be overlooking an income possibility from social security, reports R. R. Tuley, Jr., district manager for the Social Security Administration. Such letters have been going out in small batches for the past several months.

The electronic records-keepig equipment more headquarters of SSA has noted that these people are over age 65, seem to have enough credits on their records to be insured for retirement benefits, apparently had little or no earnings in 1961 (the last complete calendar year fully posted), and have not filed claims as yet. Most of those contacted in a pilot study last summer hadn't filed claims because they had mistaken ideas about how long one must be covered by social security to be insured. Due to the 1960 and 1961 amendments, the time required has been cut in half from earlier law. Now one need have social security credits for ¼ of the time after 1950 (or age 21, if later) and be-fore age 62 for women or age 65 for men, to be eligible for retirement payments. The retirement test was also liberalized by those amendments, Tuley a d d e d, and everyone past age 62 should look into the possibility of collecting some social security checks even though still actively employed or self-employ-ed for some or all of the year. The social security represen-tative will be in Cisco at the Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday, April 10, 1963, at 10 a. m.


