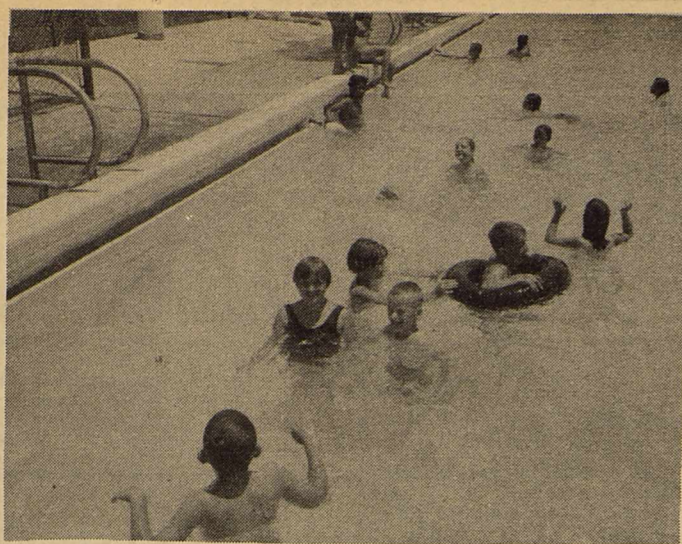

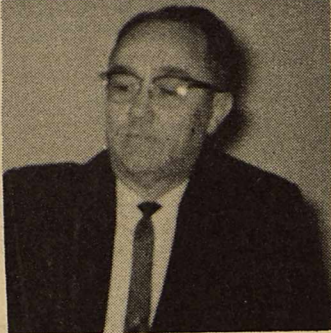
BLUE SAGE 4-H CLUB

The Plains First Christian Church announces the appointment of Omer R. Bantz as their new pastor.

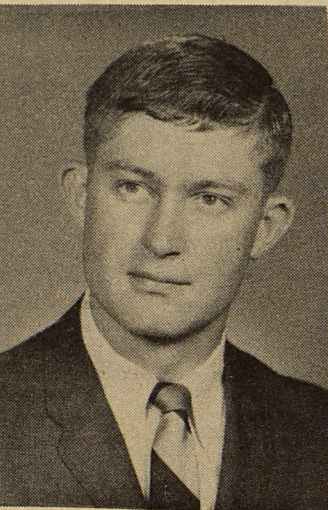
Rev. Bantz will serve the Plains congregation as well as the Seminole First Christian.

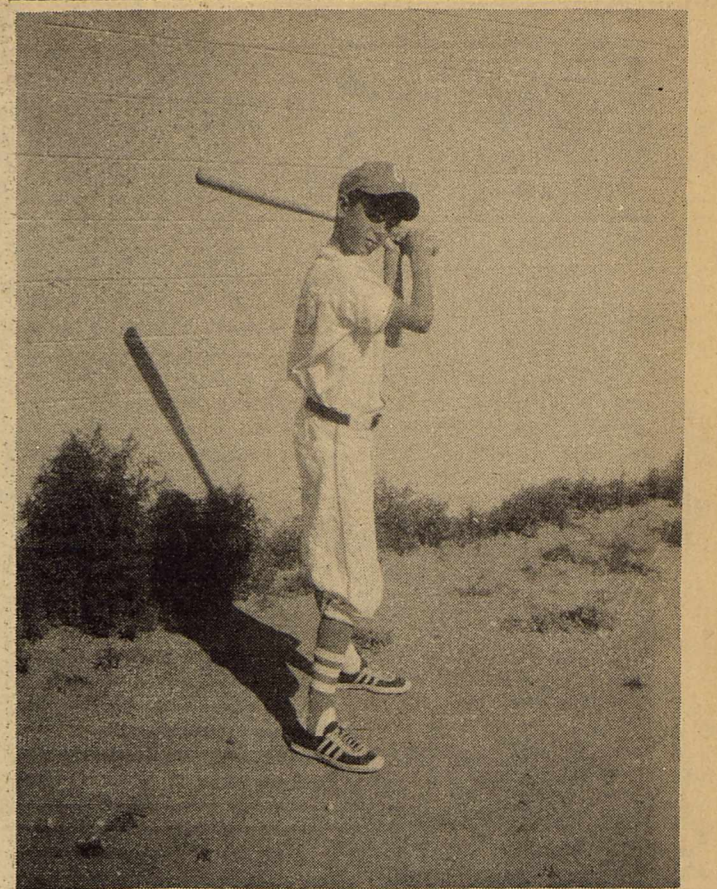
