237 Civil, 54 Criminal Cases Filed In 91st Court Last Year

There were 237 civil suits and 54 criminal cases filed in 91st District Court in Eastland last year.

This is about average for the court, District Clerk Roy Lane, said. Lane released the court record figures this week.

Of the civil suits filed last year there were 23 tax suits, 101 divorce suits, two annulment suits and 111 others. There were two pauper's oath trials, and the average cost for each was \$25.

Judge T. M. Collie's Court began 1961 with 247 civil suits and 97 criminal suits pending from the previous year. During the year 213 civil suits were disposed of, as were 42 criminal cases, with 271 civil suits and 109 criminal cases pending on Dec. 31st.

Contract Let For County Job Work

A contract for 2.7 miles of construction on F. M. 8 in Eastland County has been awarded to a Fort Worth firm, it was announced in Austin this week by the State Highway Commission.

Harry Campbell submitted the low bid of \$51,088 on the project—reconstruct grading, structures, base and surfacing from intersection S. H. 6 in Gorman—is expected to take 75 working days, according to E. M. Pritchard district highway engineer at Brownwood.

R. P. Haun, resident engineer at Eastland, will be in active charge of the project while it is under construction.

Substantial Oil Producer Flowing At Woods Place

Eastland County had another substantial oil producer this week as W. M. Jarrell and Tex-Star Petroleum Co. completed their No. 1 Gordon Woods, a semi-wildcat seven miles northeast of Cisco. Production was from the Mississippian reef.

The completion test produced 135 barrels of oil in 24 hours from perforations at 4,017-28 and through a 10-64 inch choke. Casing pressure was 850 pounds

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — As a Spanish-American War veteran with 87 days of active duty I draw the service pension based on 70-days service. I think the new law adding travel time home to the service time will qualify me for the 90-day service pension. How do I apply for this?

A — The VA is now reviewing all cases where Spanish-American War veterans on the rolls for the 70-day service pension may now qualify for the 90-day pension. After a reasonable time, if you do not hear from the VA, write the Veterans Benefits Office, Munitions Building, Washington 25, D. C. Be sure to give your claim number. Your branch of the service will certify where you were separated and how much travel time it should have taken you to reach your home by the most direct route.

Health News

Dysentery, while not a major killer among Texans, still claims many lives each year. Sadly most deaths occur among infants under one year of age.

Last year there was a 10 per cent increase of shigellosis — the technical name for bacillary dysentery — according to the Texas Morbidity published each week by the Communicable Disease Division of the Texas State Department of Health.

At the end of the year, the 96 total stood at 3,915 cases compared to 3,420 cases at the end of 1960.

The total deaths from dysentery have not been compiled for 1961; however, in 1960 there were 79 deaths from the disease with 53 percent among infants.

Dysentery is transmitted "by contaminated foods, or drinking contaminated water or milk, and by hand-to-mouth transfer of contaminated material; by flies; by objects soiled with feces of preparation — especially after visiting the bathroom.

Also foods which are moist or eaten raw require special attention in washing and preparation.

Fly control and control of fly breeding are important steps in fighting this disease. Control of existing flies can be done by screening, fly traps and by contact poisons and space sprays.

Fly breeding can be controlled with adequate garbage collection and disposal, elimination of garbage dumps and substitution of land-fill operations, and provision for proper sewage disposal.

Infant mortality from shigellosis can be curtailed with adherence to good hygiene principles, scrupulous cleanliness in preparation, handling and refrigeration of food, safe milk and water for infant feeding, and continuous supervision no fither diet.

It is generally acknowledged that many cases of unreported diarrhea probably result from shigellosis. Suspect victims should seek the aid of their physician.
