$11 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ cooked macaroni (drained) 2 c grated cheddar cheese
1 can boned chicken
1 can cream of chicken soup
1 can sliced mushrooms (drained)
$1 / 4 \mathrm{c}$ chopped pimento
LEMON BARS
2 c flour
$1 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ sifted powdered sugar
1 c margarine
4 eggs, beaten
2 c sugar
$1 / 3$ c lemon juice
$1 / 4$ c flour
$1 / 2$ tsp. baking powder
Sift together 2 c flour and powdered sugar. Cut in margarine until mixture clings. Press into a $13 \times 9 \times 12$ baking pan. Bake in $350^{\circ}$ oven for 20 to 25 minutes or until lightly browned. Beat together eggs, sugar and lemon juice. Sift together flour and baking powder; stir in egg mixture. Pour over baked crust and bake at $350^{\circ}$ for 25 minutes longer. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. Cool. Cut into bars.

2 c sour cream
