"Gravey" Field, founder of Bronco and the 07 Ranch in New Mexico. A 112 foot high flag was dedicated to Field's youngest son, Robert, who carried the family ranching tradition.
Reese Air Force Base Color Guard presented the $30 \times 60$ foot flag. Dedication was made by Rev. Harold Bennett, pastor of First United Methodist Church in Tatum. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the Sandyland Swing Band from South Plains College sang "Home On The Range".
Rev. Louis Crenshaw, local pastor of United Methodist Church, dedicated the H. "Gravey", Field Memorial Monument, which honors the Bronco founder on two large bronze plaques mounted on a $6 \times 4 \times 21$ foot rock monument.

BUFFALO CHIP COOKIES
Mix in large bowl and set aside:
2 c Post Toasties
2 c oatmeal
1 c coconut
1 c chopped pecans
16 oz chocolate chips
In mixer, mix and cream together:
1 c oleo
1 c Crisco
2 c brown sugar
2 c white sugar
Add:
4 eggs
2 t vanilla
4 c flour
2 t soda
$2 t$ baking powder
Mix Well:
Pour into LARGE Tupperware bowl (Salad or Cake Cover) and mix all together. Use $1 / 4 \mathrm{c}$ to measure cookies. Bake only 6 cookies to a cookie sheet at $350^{\circ}$ for 15 mins . DO NOT OVERCOOK. Makes 48 LARGE cookies.

HOMEMADE GRANOLA 6-7 c old fashioned rolled oats 2 c shredded coconut
1 c coarsely chopped almonds
1 c sesame seeds
1 c sunflower seeds
1 c unsweetened wheat germ $11 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ honey
$1 / 2$ c Mazola oil
Combine in large roaster. Mix honey and oil and pour over. Stir and bake in $300^{\circ}$ oven for 45 mins. til golden. Stir every 15 mins. Remove from oven and stir in:
1 c chopped dried apricots
1 c raisins
1 c chopped dates
Remove to another container to cool. Stir occasionally to prevent lumping. Store in plastic bags or tightly covered containers. Can be frozen.

DELICIOUS CHOW-CHOW
8 c ground green tomatoes
6 c chopped sweet pepper
3 c chopped onions
3 c chopped cabbage
Use food processor - fine grind. Pour 3 heaping T salt over tomatoes and peppers. Let set for 1 hr and then pour off juice.
Mix with other ingredients and add:
2 c vinegar
3 c water
2 c sugar
1 heaping T tumeric
1 t ground allspice
1 t celery seed
1 t oregano
1 t ground bay leaves
Bring to boil and simmer 2 hrs . Pack in hot jars and water bath 20 mins. Makes $7-8$ pints.

## Grain Sorghum Producers Could Win Foreign Trip <br> The National Grain Sorghum

Producers Association (GSPA) will sponsor the first nationwide sorghum yield contest this year, with top winners receiving a trip abroad. "The contest will focus on yield and management," said Elbert Harp, executive director of the Na tional GSPA, "and will help us gather information on the most efficient and cost-effective ways to grow sorghum.
Contest awards will be made on three levels - county, state and national. The top winners in each class on the national level will receive a trophy and a trip to a foreign market country. On the state level, plaques will be awarded to the top three winners in each class. The first place winner in each class on the county level will receive a certificate.
The contest entry deadline is 30 days prior to harvest of the contest plot and harvest reports are due by December 1. Applications and rule books are available through the Na tional GSPA, members of the state Grain Sorghum Producers Associations, and supporting seed and agricultural chemical companies.
"Some of the manufacturers supporting the contest, such as Stauffer Seeds, are offering cash awards," said Harp. "These awards vary with each company and are designed to stimulate interest in this very first National Grain Sorghum Yield and Management Contest.".
