From The Superintendent's Desk

There will be few major changes in education as the 69th Texas Legislature adjourned May 27th with several measures awaiting action.

The last few days of the regular session saw a great deal of behind-thescenes discussion on bills that would fine-tune the reforms made in the House Bill 72, but the clock ran out before agreements could be reached.

The session-long stalemate between the Senate and House of Representatives over the manner in which the fine tuning would take place effectively killed most of the proposed changes and the 140 day session came to a close.

The Senate's omnibus education bill, SB 525 (by Parker), contained changes in a variety of areas that were addressed in House Bill 72.

The leadership of the House expressed concern over the broad nature of the omnibus bill, prefering a "single-shot" bill approach to making the necessary revisions.

The changes that affect our school are:

Duty-Free Lunch/HB 505 (by Messer): Teachers will be entitled to a 30 minute duty-free lunch. Teachers may be required to give up duty-free lunch one day per week if certain conditions exist (personnel shortage, extreme economic conditions, or unavoidable or unforeseen circumstances). The State Board of Education will adopt rules defining these conditions.

Retirees Health Insurance/SB 387 (by Howard): A health insurance program for retired school employees will be established and become effective Sept. 1, 1986. The program will be funded jointly from a portion of active employees' contributions to the Teacher Retirement System and from state funds to TRS. The basic program will be available to retirees at no cost. with options to buy-down the deductible. The program will be administered by the TRS.




