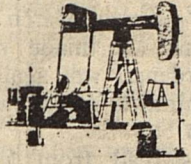

Two School Board Trustees To Be Elected April 5

An election has been called for April 5 for the purpose of electing one trustee each for Places IV and V on the Plains Independent School District board of trustees.

Deadline for filing as a candidate is March 5.

Tuesday, Feb. 25 two persons had filed for places on the ballot. Jack Spears, incumbent for place IV, is seeking re-election as is Eddie Earnest, incumbent trustee for place V.

Spears has served on the school board six years and has lived in the school district 20 years. He has three children attending Plains schools. He is owner/operator of Spears Drilling Company and also farms in Yoakum County.

Earnest has served on the board of trustees since August 1984. A farmer in Yoakum County, he has resided in the district 16 years. He has three children, all attending Plains schools.

Billie Z. O'Neal, a Yoakum County resident for 36 years, is seeking election to the office of Yoakum County Judge. She is a candidate representing the Democratic Party in the May 3 Primary.

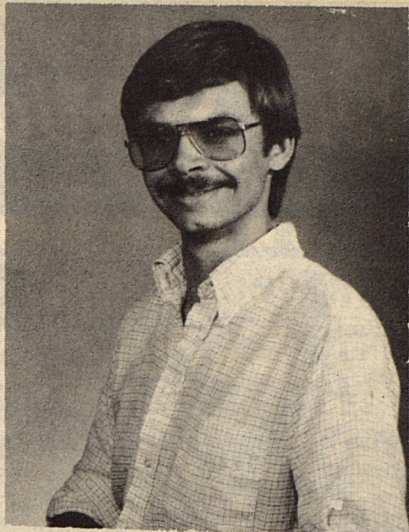
