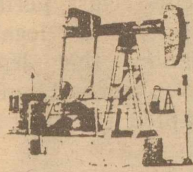

Mary Nell Mathis and Gerald McCathern seek the District 19 U.S. Representative's post. Unopposed on the Democratic ballots are Jim Mattox, Attorney General; Bob Bullock, Comptroller of Public Accounts; Ann Richards, Treasurer; and Gary Mauro, Commissioner of the General Land Office.

Noel S. Cowling and Jim Hightower seek the Commissioner of Agriculture post; W.A. (Bill) MacNaughton, P.A. "Sam" Ervin, John C. Poulard and John Sharp are running for Railroad Commissioner.

For Justice, Supreme Court, Place I, it's Oscar H. Mauzy, Sears McGee, Hugo Touchy and Shirley Butts. Jim Brady, Colin Kelley Kaufman, Robert M. Campbell and Ted Akin are seeking election as Justice, Supreme Court, Place 2.

Jim Wallace is unopposed as Justice, Supreme Court, Place 3. Justice, Supreme Court, Place 4, unexpired term candidates are John E. Humphreys, Jay Gibson, Raul A. Gonzalez and David M. Ivy.

For Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 1, it's Paul R. Reagan, Rusty Duncan, Preston Dial and George "Jorge" Martinez.

Unopposed are Mike McCormick, Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 2; Marvin O. Teague, Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 3; Jim D. Rudd, State Representative, District 77; and Carlton B. Dodson, Justice, Court of Appeals, 7th District.

Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2 candidates are Floyd Lane, Esther Holland and Shirley Tredaway. Candidates for Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1 are Billie Blundell, Hershel R. Smith, Tom Barnes and A.G. Brantley.

R.W. "Bob" Thurston is unopposed for County Commissioner, Precinct 2. Rita Fannin, Larry Murphree and Johnnie L. Fitzgerald seek election as County Commissioner, Precinct 4.

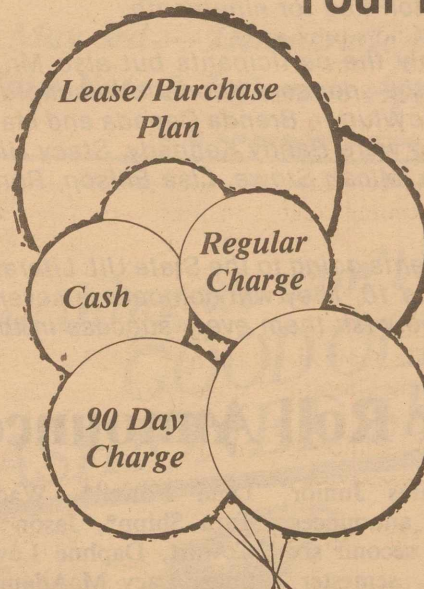
His presentation of these "Hot Spots" was very interesting and informative, according to those attending.

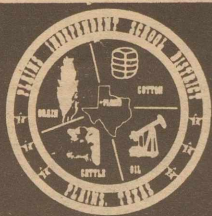

## Kitchen Korner

Mary Lou Sherrin has been a life-long resident of this area, having lived all her life at the Texas-New Mexico Stateline. She works and resides at Plains Motel.

Mother of two children, her sons Derrell and Creig live in Graham and Breckenridge, respectively. She has a grandson, Jake Sherrin, living in Brownfield.

Mary Lou's hobbies are collecting recipes and antiques, such as old farm equipment. She also enjoys working in her yard and reading.

A sample of her collected recipes are shared with our readers this week, one (Oma McCargo's Chess Pie) was published in the Plains newspaper in 1953.

### PINTO BEAN CASSEROLE

2 c cooked pinto beans  
1 c grated cheese  
1 t chili powder  
2 T red chili sauce  
½ c dry bread crumbs  
2 t butter  
½ c chopped pimento

Combine beans, pimentos, chili powder, chili sauce and cheese. Pour in greased casserole, cover with crumbs, dot with butter and bake 350° about 30 minutes.

### OMA McCARGO CHESS PIE

2 c sugar  
4 whole eggs  
1 T flour  
½ c butter  
½ c cream  
1 t vanilla

Put sugar in mixing bowl. Add eggs and flour, beating slowly so eggs will not foam. Add cream, butter and vanilla.

Pour in unbaked pie crust and

bake in slow oven 350-400° until filling is set.

### TUNA IN THE SHELL

1 can tuna  
1 T butter  
1 T flour  
1 c milk  
Salt & pepper  
Paprika  
1 small bay leaf  
½ c bread crumbs  
2 hard-cooked eggs, minced  
3 T lemon juice  
1 t worcestershire sauce  
4 T grated cheese

Melt butter, blend in flour and add milk and seasoning. Cook until thick, stirring constantly. Remove bay leaf and add flaked tuna, crumbs, eggs, lemon juice and worcestershire sauce. (This will fill eleven tart shells) Fill shells and sprinkle with additional crumbs and cheese.

Bake 350° about 30 minutes or until golden brown.

Dale Boulter of Yoakum County Abstract furnished micro film machine and supplies.

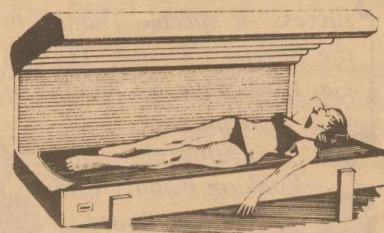
