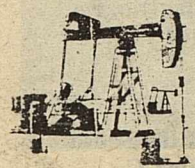

McClellan Rites Conducted Friday

Services were conducted Friday in First Baptist Church for Walter Ralph McClellan, 71, of Redwater, former resident.

Officiating were the Rev. Ken Horn, pastor, and the Rev. Glenn Smith of Sundown. Burial was in Plains Cemetery under direction of Singleton Funeral Home.

Mr. McClellan died Dec. 9 in Redwater after a lengthy illness.

Born Dec. 4, 1915, he had lived in Plains 60 years before moving to Gunbarrel City. He had lived in Redwater less than a year. A member of First Christian Church, he served as deputy sheriff of Yoakum County in the late 1940's.

Survivors include a son, Daniel Lee of Redwater; a daughter, Dixie McGinty of Wolforth; a sister, Jewel Anderson of Brownfield; a brother, Earl of Gunbarrel City; five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Step-Parent Role Creates Difficult Role For Many

One in every four marriages involves someone who has been married before. In sixty percent of these remarriages, couples bring children with them into their new marriage.

In their new marriage, partners face what may be one of their most difficult roles -- being a step-parent. According to Mary D. Williams, County Extension Agent, if you are a step-parent you are not alone if you find yourself confused about this new role. You may feel caught between loyalties to your child and desire to please your new partner.

As a step-parent, your role may change through time. This requires flexibility and patience. Before taking responsibility for discipline, for example, you must first develop a relationship with your stepchild.

Researchers have shown that it takes families about three to four years before both parents are seen as

authority figures by stepchildren. In the meantime, you must be sensitive to your own needs as well as those of the child.

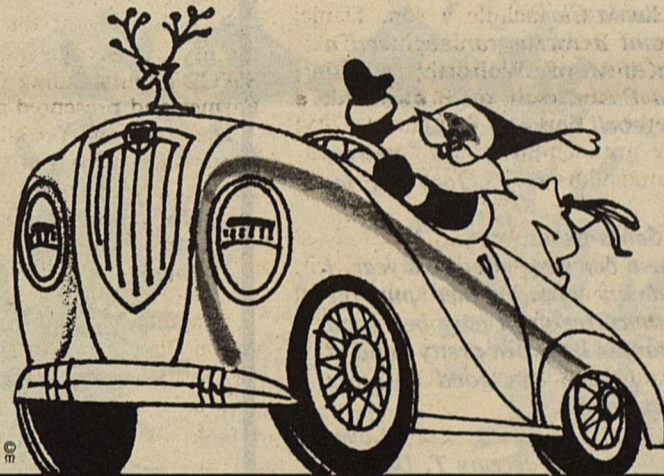

Plains Cowboys Selected For All-District Honors

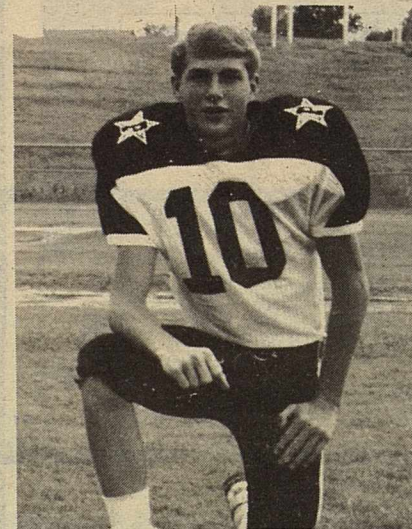
Plains Cowboys captured three spots on the All-District Offense Team and three spots on the All-District Defense team while landing five players each on the honorable mention lists.

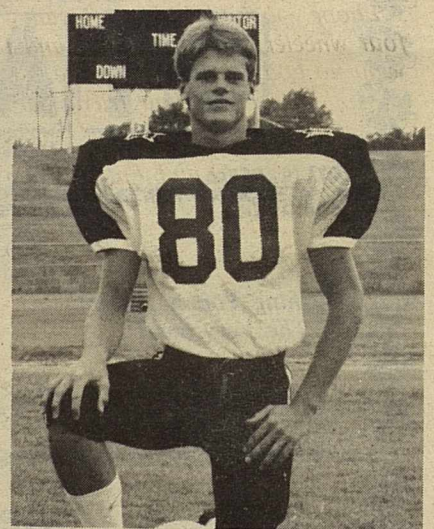

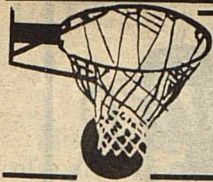

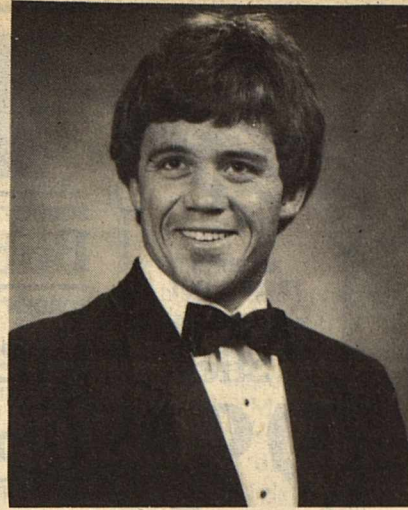
Morton and Denver City denied the Plains 8th Grade Girls a win in the DC tournament last week.

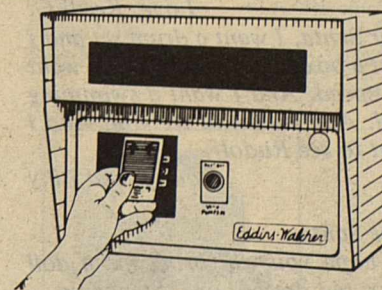

Mrs. Billy Winn was elected to the office of Caprock District President at the March 1986 Caprock District Convention held at the Holiday Inn Civic Center in Lubbock. She joined her local Federated Club, Tsa Mo Ga Study Club in Plains in 1967. As a loyal member, Mrs. Winn served as President in 1974-76. Prior to this she served as secretary and vice-president. As President she accomplished many goals. The club raised enough money to purchase new chairs, matching carpet, ceiling fans, drapes and newly stained doors and woodwork. Mrs. Winn moved to Terry County in 1942 where she lived in the Johnson and Tokio communities. The Winn family moved to Plains in December of 1966. Mrs. Winn, mother of four and grandmother of eight is an avid sports fan and school supporter. She served her community on the City Council for four years, during which time she filled in as Mayor Pro-Tem.

Through dependability and dedication she moved up the official posts of first vice-president and president elect before reaching the Districts highest position. Over the years of clubwork she served as several department chairmen. She also worked on the TFWC, Texas Federation of Womens Clubs State Nomination Committee and as a member of the State Scholarship Committee. She helped select deserving recipients.

Caprock District consist of 43 Women's Clubs in this area. There are 14 Districts in the state. The Texas Federated Women's Clubs were organized in Waco in 1897, Federated in 1899 and Incorporated in 1914 for the purpose of uniting Women's Clubs and like organizations throughout Texas for the promotion of activities in the areas of Conservation, Home Life, Public Affairs, International Affairs, the Arts and Texas Heritage.

There are 500 clubs in Texas with 13,000 members. The Texas Federated Clubs are responsible for 85% of all Public Libraries in this state. This includes the Yoakum County Libraries in Plains and Denver City.

The State Federation is a member of the General Federation of Women's Clubs. This organization is celebrating its Centennial in 1990. GFWC is the largest and oldest non-denominational international service organization of volunteer women in the world. It has 10 million members worldwide in 46 countries. During the years 1984-86, GFWC members donated more than 54.5 million hours and \$108 million to volunteer projects. The international office of the GFWC is in Washington, D.C.

The District Theme under Mrs. Winn is "Unity - Caring and Sharing". The special project is Girlstown and the Girlstown Education Fund at Whiteface. Other major projects are M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute in Houston, Stop Elder Abuse, Operation Con Game, TFWC Scholarships, TFWC Historical Foundation, Texas Womens Library and Child Abuse Prevention.

All of the district officers are elected except Secretary and Treasurer, both of which are appointed by the President. Mrs. Winn selected two local women to hold these positions. Mrs. Hazel Akin of Denver City is the new treasurer and Mrs. Peggy Squyres is the new secretary for Caprock District.

Mrs. Hazel Akin moved to Denver City from Albuquerque, N.M. in April, 1949, when she and her late husband Jack M. Akin, bought the Palace Drug Store. Their daughter Jackie was two and one half years old. They became members of First United Methodist Church, and she served as Sunday School secretary for nearly 30 years.

Yoakum County Soils Deemed 'Highly Erodible' By USDA

A list of highly erodible and potentially highly erodible soils was released this week by the USDA Soil Conservation Service as mandated by the Food Security Act of 1985.

The list revealed that all land in Yoakum County is highly erodible.

The conservation compliance provisions of the Act denies most USDA farm program benefits to farmers who farm highly erodible land unless the land is being farmed in accordance with a conservation plan approved by the local conservation district.

The Act allows a grace period for those who are not using a conservation plan. They have until Jan. 1, 1990 to develop and begin actively applying a plan. They have until Jan. 1, 1995 to have the plan fully in effect.

The provisions will have no effect on farmers who are using up-to-date conservation plans. If you are farming highly erodible land with a conservation plan, check with your local Soil Conservation Service office to find out if it meets conservation compliance provisions.

"We are ready to help anyone prepare a conservation plan that doesn't have one," Edwin Livengood, district conservationist for the SCS said. "We will do our best to try to help people figure out how to apply enough conservation practices to keep them in compliance with the 1985 farm bill."

Such plans may include wind strips, windbreaks, crop rotations, crop residue management, terraces, contour farming and other measures.

Farmers with highly erodible land may also want to consider placing it in the conservation reserve, Livengood said.

All SCS programs and services are offered on a nondiscriminatory

basis, without regard to race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, marital status, or handicap.

Commissioners' Court

Yoakum County Commissioners Court convened in special session Monday morning.

One bid was received and accepted for a used lowboy trailer for Precinct One. Unanimously accepted, the bid for \$7,500 with trade was from West Texas Equipment of Lubbock.

Attorney Stephen C. McIntyre of Texas Rural Legal Aid Inc., Farm Worker Division, filed a Petition for Redress of Grievances wherein International Union of Agricultural and Industrial Workers was petitioner. McIntyre met with the court to discuss the petition and in a statement of facts claimed that the County has no written guidelines, standards, notices, etc. provided to applicants of their rights under Article 2351 (11) re: support assistance from the welfare budget. Judge Paul Cobb promised to have Yoakum County's guidelines and standards put in writing.

Approval was granted on a request by AMOCO Production Company for a road crossing permit in Precinct 4.

Budget amendments and line item transfers were approved. Bills and extra hire were read and approved for payment.

Commissioners voted to purchase a second Dodge pickup from Mustang Country Chevrolet in action tabled from the last meeting.

A motion to advertise for bids to purchase a 30 ton rubber tired roller with the offer to trade in a used 30 ton rubber tired Ferguson roller was approved.




