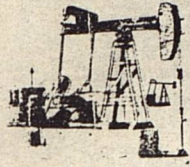

## Plains Residents To Choose Three New Council Members

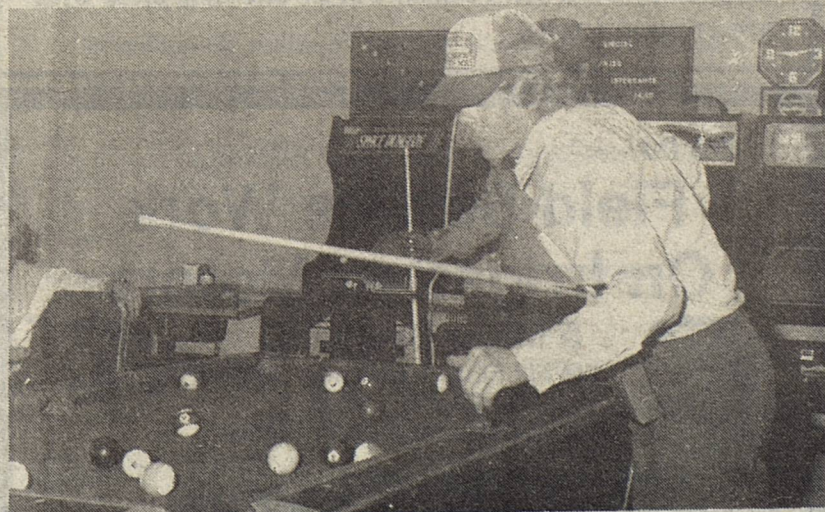
Residents of Plains will go to the polls Saturday, April 4 to elect three council members at large.

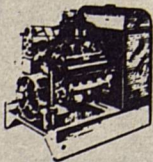

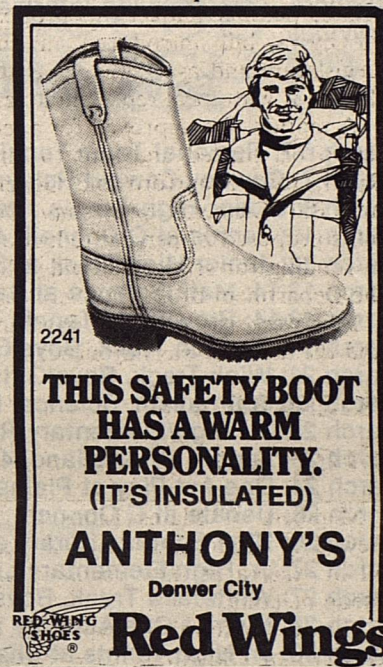
## Communication Program Topic

Several weeks ago I talked about seat belts in buses and the fact that a study was being conducted by Texas A & M to determine if the belts would be that advantageous in school buses. A report to the legislature concludes that of the thirteen fatal school bus accidents occurring from 1975 to 1984, the use of the seat belts would have saved seven children, and probably would have lessened the injuries of nine others who died. Adding seat belts to a bus would add about \$1,000 to the cost of approximately \$26,600.

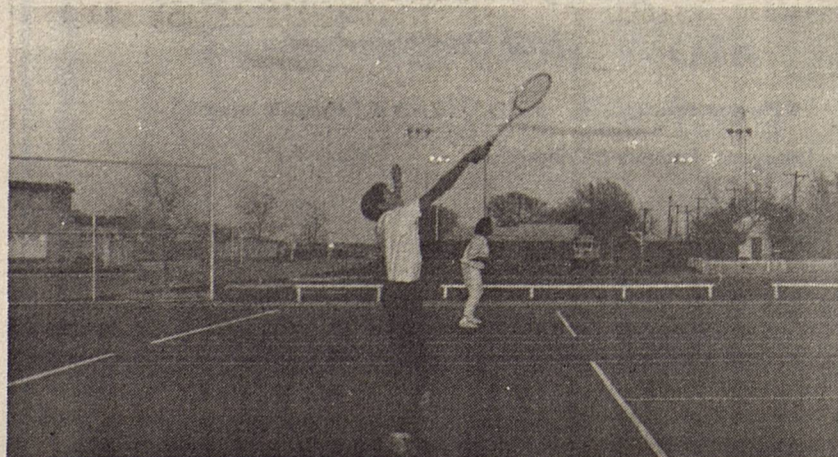
