
Recent Retiree Given Tribute

The Plains Cowgirls are one of four Class A volleyball teams in contention for a State Championship this weekend at the University Interscholastic League State Volleyball Tournament at Burger Center in Austin.

The Cowgirls, now 22-9, were paired against the Latexo Tigers in a 9 a.m. semi-final match yesterday (Friday). A victory over the Tigers would place the Cowgirls in the championship match with the winner of the Bronte vs Flatonia contest. The Class A Championship Match is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. today (Saturday).

The Cowgirls earned a state playoff spot by eliminating Briscoe and Tornillo to win the Region 1-A Championship at Howard College in Big Spring last Saturday.

In their 15-1, 15-3 first round win over Briscoe, the Cowgirl offense recorded fourteen team kills and ten aces. Individual statistics include: Karen Cobb, one kill, one block, two aces; Lynda Jimenez, two kills, two aces; Marsha Farnham, two kills; Heather McGill, three kills, one ace; Melissa Welch, two kills, two aces; and Lydia Jimenez, four kills, three aces. Melissa Welch led all servers with ten service points.

The Cowgirls have fallen behind before, but never 0-10 until their first game with Tornillo. They rallied to put six points on the scoreboard and Bertha Gonzales' four consecutive aces pulled them within one point of Tornillo at 10-11. Refusing to give up, the Cowgirls took the lead 13-11 but on the next side out Tornillo came back with three consecutive points for game point at 14-13. The Cowgirls tied it up at 14-14 with a Tornillo net violation and went on to win the game 16-14 after Marsha Farnham's block forced the last side out.

Maintaining their momentum, the Cowgirls jumped to a 10-1 lead in the second game and held Tornillo to six points to win the second game and the match. Water can be separated into hydrogen and oxygen. The hydrogen can be used as a fuel; to generate heat for electricity. Years of research and testing lie ahead to make this potential alternative commercially attractive.
