## ORDINANCE NO. 44.

An ordinance providing for the issuance of City Hall bonds, of the City of Amarillo, Texas, and providing for their payment, principal and interest,

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Amarillo, Texas, as foilows:

is hereby ordered issued Five Thousand Dollars, in interest-bearing coupon bonds of the City of Amarillo, Texas, the same to be issued in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars each, and to be numbered from one to ten, both inclusive.

issued for the purpose of completing and judicious gift. the City Hall in and for said City of Amarillo and shall be known and styled as Amarillo City Hall bonds

SECTION 3, Said bonds shall be dated the first day of October, A. D. 1900, and shall become due and payable in twenty years from the date of their issuance; provided, however, that the said city of Amarillo shall have the option of paying or redeeming said bonds or any number of the same at any time after five years from the date of their issuance; they shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, interest payable annually on the first day of October of each and every year, both principal and interest payable in lawful money of the United States, upon presenta-tion and surrender of bonds or proper coupons, at the office of the National Park Bank, in the City and State of

SECTION 4. Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and counter-signed by the City Secretary, and shall bear impress of the seal of the City of Amarillo, Texas, on each of them. The coupons attached to have the signature of the Mayor and City

Secretary of said city. SECTION 5. It is further ordained by the said city council that for the purpose of paying the annual interest and creating a sinking fund for said bonds, for the current year, there is hereby levied and appropriated 25 cents, or a sufficient amount of this certain levy of 25 cents upon each one bundred dollars valuation of all taxable property in said city of Amarillo, Texas, for interest and sinking fund, It is further ordained by the said city council of said city, that for each sucseeding year, while said bonds are outstanding, sufficient tax shall be annually levied, assessed and collected and applied to the purpose named

An ordinance providing for the construction of sidewalks on all lots fronting or abutting on either side of Third street to the south side of of paying for the same.

Be it ordained by the City Council

of the City of Amarillo, Texas:
SECTION 1. That all persons owning lots in the City of Amarillo, fronting or abutting on either side of Taylor street, beginning at the south side of Third street, thence south on Taylor street to the south side of Thirteenth street, and all persons owning lots fronting or abutting on either side of Thirteenth street, from the east side of Taylor street, thence to the west side of Polk street, are hereby required to construct sidewalks on their said lots, at their own expense, and of the kind, and in the manner and time as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. The sidewalks as herein provided shall be uniform in width and height, and shall conform to the established grade of the said city, and shall be constructed of wood, [or other material of as durable kind] or timber of a thickness of not less than one inch thick, and to be set on timbers of not less than 2x4 inches in dimension, which shall be used as stringers, and not less than three lengths of the same to be used in the

construction of said sidewalks.

Section 3. It shall be and is hereby made the duty of the street and alley committee to see that all such sidewalks, as are herein provided, when constructed, are constructed in compliance with this ordinance, and if not so constructed shall notify the person having the same built, and to cause this ordinance to be complied with.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of the Mayor to cause this ordinance to be published in the official paper of the city, in at least two issues, and such publication shall be deemed sufficient notice to all persons owning any such lot or lots in said limits as above defined, of the requirements of this ordinance, except non-residents whose residence is known to the City Secretary or Assessor.

Section 5. In case any such lot or lots are owned by any non-resident, whose place of residence is known to the City Assessor or Secretary, then it shall be the duty of the City Secretary to immediately mail to such owner such printed ordinance, which shall be sent in a registered letter, and such notice, when so sent shall be deemed sufficient notice to all such non-residents, and the publication of this ordinance as herein provided shall be deemed sufficient notice to all other persons who may own any

such lot or lots,
SECTION 6. All persons owning
any lot or lots inside the limits, as herein defined, are hereby required to construct such sidewalks on said lot or lots, in accordance herewith, in at least sixty days from such notice and publication as herein provided, provided, however, that this time may be extended for the construction of said sidewalks upon application to the City Council, showing good cause for such extension, provided that said time shall not be extended beyond thirty days, and provided it shall take a majority vote of the aldermen present to extend such time.
